## NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provides $\$ 4.569 .00$ per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides $\$ 5,063.00$ per student in state and local revenues.

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of $\$ . .7802$ for county education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.
