"-Whatever is right-" not whatever is unfair and unjust. "-Whatever is pure-" not whatever is unattractive and of-

fensive. "-Whatever is of good repute—" not whatever is slanderous and malicious.

After he lists these six specifics of life the Apostle Paul then says: "-Let your mind dwell on these things." Yet there are many disciples of Jesus who do not let their minds "-dwell on these things" and as a result they have a negative attitude about life. And these disciples of Jesus are usually people who are cynical, bitter, critical, and pessimistic. They

laugh less and complain more. These disciples of Jesus need to takechargeof their minds. A finely tuned engine will not run properly if it is regularly filled with dirt. And disciples of Jesus cannot experience the abundant life if they constantly let their minds dwell on the negative aspects of life.



Oh wait, this little fat wife of mine loves to ride horses and would probably have one but I tell her it's undignified for a great grandmother to do such vulgar things as to ride a horse. Hope nobody tells her how much fun she would have if she could get out in the woods and ride for miles and across the hills enjoying the beauty

Some years back I worked at a Horse Track in New Mexico and over the years was around thousands of horses and the pony boys, Jockeys and all the ranchers that owned these beautiful steeds and all the money that was won on the horses. One race that was quite something was the All American that was on Labor Day and it was a very quick race. One time it was won in less than 20 seconds. How about

I used to remember names like Tonto Bar Hanks, Jet Deck and Fly Licka Bird but any more I can hardly remember my neighbors handle.

One of these days I hope to write a book about a couple that raises horses and plan on being in the Winners Circle of one of the big races soon. They have had many spills and re-coveries in racing and just this morning Speck called and told me of one of our close friends that won a good race in Kentucky and got the silver tray and a bit of dough for his endeavor. This friend has been training and

working horses for years and the colt that won for him yesterday was named for one of the great jockeys of our times. The jockey was a triple crown winner and I know somewhere in Heaven he is grinnin about the colt named for him is going to be a dandy. The name of the colt, oh heck I durn near forgot, it's "One For Smokey". It was named for Smokey Saunders who we have known for many years. The friend that owns the colt we have known for many years here and in New Mexico. Recon me and Mama have been blessed with friends from all over and when one of them do well in their business we are as thrilled as if we had done it. I always say "Via
