OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

MAGNUM SLINGSHOTS AND RED-EYED TURTLES

I've always had and still do, a tendency to go a little bit overboard with things I like, really well. When I was about nine or ten, Dad showed me how to make a sling-shot. All it consisted of, was two equal lengths of string with an old shoe tongue tied between the two strings. He made mine with strings about two and one half or three feet long. Now, all I had to do was put a rock into the shoe tongue, do the whirl, release the rock, and with a little practice I might become a real good, "sling shot kid." As I found out, maybe not!

Dad, had tied an eye in the ends of both strings. One would fit tight over one finger, while you held the other string between your fingers, so you could turn it loose whenever the time was exactly right. The tricky part was getting the

rock to stay in, while you got started swinging it, round and round. I had figured out that if you cut a hole in the center of the shoe tongue, the rock would stay in better. After it got going around with a little speed, the rock would stay in the tongue real well. When you got it up to top speed, you'd just turned one string loose, and the rock would fly a really long way and fast!

Accuracy, was always my main problem. I might sling the rock east one time and north the next time. It didn't look like I was going to set any accuracy records, so maybe I'd try for distance instead. My homespun logic, told meO, if the strings were longer, I could get more velocity on the rocks. This seemed to be trueO, only if you could accomplish two things; get it off the ground and whirling around! Not as easy, as I had imagined it would be.

The longest slingshot I was ever able to make and get going, was about six feet long. When I turned that thing loose, it went plumb out of sight! I eventually got bored with that project and started spending some of my time aggravating the red-eyed turtles that hung out in a little shallow pond behind our barn.

The red-eyed, turtles were kind of ill-tempered and would snap at you. I didn't want to get bit by a turtle, because I'd always been told by grandma, that they wouldn't turn loose until it thundered. And I knew that sometimes, it was a long time between thunders.

Since they liked to bite, I thought up something for them to bite on— firecrackers. I bought a package of the small ones. If I tapped them on the nose with one, they would snap down on it. Then, I'd light it and it would "pop". After a couple of times, they wouldn't bite one, anymore. I know this sounds bad, and it was, but it didn't seem to hurt them at all, it just smutted up their face a little bit.

Dad, eventually saw me doing this and wouldn't let me do it anymore!

The U.S. Department of Agriculture launched a 'Know Your Farmer, Know Your Food' initiative late last year, which promotes local and regional food systems by stimulating community economic development and providing access to affordable fresh food locally.

USDA Rural Development has \$40 million available under the Community Facility Program in Texas in the form of guaranteed loans, low interest loans and grants for community projects, including those included in this initiative.

"It is vital that people begin to understand fully where their food comes from and how it gets to their dinner tables," commented Paco Valentin, USDA Rural Development Texas State Director. "The 'Know Your Farmer, Know Your Food' initiative creates new economic opportunities by better connecting consumers with local producers and we are excited to have the opportunity to assist in this process."

The USDA Rural Development Community Facilities Program offers direct and guaranteed loans, as well as grants, to finance the development of essential community facilities serving rural areas under 20,000 in population, including those that support and promote local foods. Food banks, food storage, distribution centers, school kitchens and cafeterias, Farm-to-School programs, community gardens, farmers markets, community kitchens and facilities that provide nutrition education and training programs are all examples of facilities that would be included in the initiative. Funding is available to local government and public bodies, community-based non-profit organizations and Indian Tribes and may be used to fund the purchase of real estate, buildings and building expansions, equipment and vehicles. Grants range from 15% to 75% and require matching funds.
