



"Buckle Up America! Week" May 18-25, 1992

In recognition of "Buckle Up America! Week", the Wheeler County Extension Service strongly encourages all motorists to use safety belts and child safety seats on every trip in a motor vehicle. "Buckle Up America! Week" is a national campaign highlighting the lifesaving potential of safety belts, child safety seats and air bags. "Many people just don't realize how your chances of serious injury or death are reduced significantly if you wear safety belts an estimated 24,886 lives were saved by safety belts from 1983 to 1990." "In 1982, before any state has a belt use law, America buckled up at an 11 percent rate. Use of safety belts has more than quadrupled since souri 64102 or call 816-474-9555. then in response to increased law enforcement efforts and public information campaigns. As encouraging as these results are, it's not enough! People are still being killed on our highways because they didn't take the three seconds needed to buckle up. That's inexcusable! It is also important to use safety belts even if you car is equipped with an air bag. "Many people don't realize that air bags are only effective in a front-end collision. You still must wear a safety belt in case of a rear-end, side impact or rollover crash. For the best possible protection, use the "winning combination" of safety belts and air bags.' In addition, the Extension Service reminds parents of young children to protect them in a child safety seat that is installed and used correctly. "Child safety seats are very reliable in preventing deaths and injuries to child passengers, provided they are used correctly. Child restraints are credited with saving an estimated 222 lives in 1990. That's a good record, but it can be improved with everyone's participation. This week's safety belt awareness activities will coincide with the Memorial Day weekend, which historically signals the beginning of the summer travel season. This summer, a special campaign will again be implemented across the nation to increase safety belt usage. This campaign, known as the <u>Avoid the Summertime Blues</u> cam-paign will include increased efforts on the part of enforcement agencies to increase compliance with state child passenger safety and/or safety belt laws. 

From The Minister's Desk:

On the back of a popular lemon uice can, there is a label that says: 'This product is one hundred percent, full-strength lemon juice, absolutely no preservatives or chemicals added." I am sure that the users of this lemon juice appreciate that "-no preservatives or chemicals-" have been added to this product. Such an assurance is appreciated because it is recognized that most products are not benefited by substitutes.

While we can recognize that certain products cannot be benefited. by substitutes, do we recognize that certain relationships of life are not benefited by substitutes? For example, consider the relationship of marriage. According to the Bible, marriage is the supreme human relationship. It is a relationship that is more binding than the relationship between parent and child. But for this relationship to be what God intends, cheap substitutes must not replace the qualities that husbands and wives should demonstrate in a marriage.

In the third chapter of his first letter, the Apostle Peter emphasizes a quality that wives should possess and a quality that husbands should possess. To wives he wrote: "-Let not your adornment be merely external-braiding the hair, and wearing gold jewelry, and putting on dresses; but let it be the hidden person of the heart, with the imperishable quality of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is precious in the sight of God." (verses 3-4) And to husbands he wrote: "-Live with your wives in an understanding way, as with a weaker vessel, since she is a woman; and grant her honor as a (verse 7)

To pinpoint the substitute that

use this substitute as "narcissistic" . He says that these wives have an inordinate self-love. They are unduly preoccupied with appearance which they perceive as an extension of the themselves. According to Mr. Osborne, Narcissistic wives constantly seek to be the center of attention. They seek flattery and are engaged in a constant battle for popularity. They are "psychic scalp collectors', flirting with men in order to prove to themselves that they have not lost their attractiveness. They use men, including their husbands.

For marriage to be what God intended, wives must not substitute external beauty and appearance for"-the hidden person of the heart-.'

<u>Husbands</u>

The Apostle Peter emphasized the quality that husbands should have when he said: "-Live with your wives in an understanding way, as with a weaker vessel, since she is a woman; and grant her honor as The Greek word for "-live-" could be translated "to be at home with" which suggests that husbands should share their lives with their wives.

Yet husbands are often tempted to substitute sharing their lives with providing a living. Perhaps the common rationalization of hard-working husbands is: "I have provided you with a nice home and a good car. You have sufficient food and exquisite clothes. What more could you want or need?" Many wives respond: "Give me your attention. Listen to me. Appreciate me. Tell me about your problems. Let me tell you about mine. Spend some time with me."

It is commendable that husbands provide for the physical needs of wives and husbands can use for the their wives. The New Testament teaches that they should. (I Timothy 5:8) It also teaches that wives married them and not their money or the physical things that money can buy. The Apostle Paul said: "Husbands ought to love their own wives as their bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself: for no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it-." (Ephesians 5:28-29) Husbands must not substitute providing a living for sharing a life. There is no relationship more important than marriage. It is a relationship that is like the popular lemon juice. It is not benefited by substitutes.
