

#### **Declaration of Disaster**

WHEREAS, the County of Wheeler on the 7th day of December 2009, has suffered widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property (or there is imminent threat of same) resulting from:

Imminent threat of wildfires due to extreme drought conditions

AND, WHEREAS, the County Judge of Wheeler County has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE COUNTY JUDGE OF WHEELER COUNTY:

- 1. That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for Wheeler County pursuant to 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code,
- 2. Pursuant to 418.018(b) of the Government Code, the State of Disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County,
- 3. Pursuant to 418.018© of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk,
- 4. Pursuant to 418.018(d) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the County Emergency management Plan.
- 5. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and

#### **Christmas Trees and Safety**

During the year-end holidays, prevent accidents by following simple tips for trees and decorations.

When planning to decorate a home or apartment for the holidays, always place safety at the top of the list. Choose a Christmas tree carefully. Proper care for live and artificial trees, along with safety checks for lights, decorations and candles, will prevent accidents and possibly a fire. Christmas Tree Care

For artificial trees, purchase only those that are flame retardant. For a real tree, make sure it has fresh green needles that aren't easily broken.

Keep live trees as moist as possible. Water them daily. After bringing a live tree home, cut about one or two inches off the bottom of the trunk. This will allow the tree to soak up water to keep it fresh. Use a sturdy tree stand that will not tip.

Keep trees away from heat sources such as fireplaces, portable heaters, radiators, heat vents and candles. Trees should be at least three feet away from all heat sources.

Never smoke near a tree and never drop or flick cigarette ashes nearby. Never put tree branches or needles into a fireplace or wood-burning stove.

· After the holiday, don't leave a dried-out tree in a house or garage and don't place the tree near the house or garage. Either place the entire tree at the curb for sanitation pick-up, or cut it up and place it in the trash. Another option is to dispose trees at recycling centers.

Holiday Lights and Decorations Safety

Make sure lights, indoor and out, are approved for use by authorized testing organizations. Certifications should be apparent on the package.

· Inspect decorative lights each time you decorate. Look for frayed wires, bare spots, broken or cracked sockets and exces-

Avoid overloading electrical outlets. Don't link more than three light strands of lights into a socket. Be careful with extension cords. Make sure they are in excellent condition and are used properly. Always unplug holiday lights before leaving home or going to bed.

Use only flame-resistant or flame-retardant decorations inside and outside the home

Proper Use of Holiday Candles

Place candles where they cannot be reached or easily knocked over by children and pets, and always extinguish candles before leaving a room or going to bed. Never use real candles to decorate a tree. Even if they aren't lit, the wicks and wax can attract sparks

Keep candles at least three feet away from trees, evergreens, holiday decorations, and other items that can catch fire, such as clothing, papers and curtains. Use candleholders that are sturdy, won't tip over easily, are made from non-flammable materials and are large enough to collect dripping wax. Never use glass holders for candles. They can shatter and

explode from the heat of a candle flame.



#### **OLD CARS** AND **RIDIN' HEADLIGHTS**

When I was growing up, we never had a car that was less than ten years old and part of the time, we didn't have a car at all. Transportation for a lot of folks was simple. You walked!

I remember when we moved to Estelline, we rode a train from Childress to there. The train depot was about a half mile from town, so when we got off, we had to walk the rest of the way in. Being four years old at that time, I got the best deal ever... Dad carried me "piggy-back" most of the way to the small house they had rented earlier. Later on, they bought a second hand bicycle that had a basket on the front and a rack over the back fender that I could sit on. That became a real fun way for Mom and I to get around town, while Dad was at work. Life was good for this kid!

Dad rode to work with some other men for a while, then he bought a '34 Ford car. As I remember, it had a spare tire mounted in one of the front fenders and headlights mounted on the top front of the fenders. Everything about the car was of interest to me, as it is with most youngsters of today. (It has been my experience as a "Pop" that grandson can tell you a lot about trucks.)

This model had what was referred to as "suicide doors." The hinges were on the rear of the doors, so it opened from the front. If you unlatched a door while going down the road, the wind would jerk it open and it might "yank" you out! Another thing that really stuck

with me, were the windshield wipers. They were vacuum-operated. If you went up a hill while it was raining, the wipers would stop moving. The only way to make

It didn't have suicide doors, but it did have headlights on top of the front fenders. When we moved from lowa to Wheeler, we kept it a couple of years longer. It's the one we had when we lived on, "Old Double-Tuff." Sometimes, my folks would let me ride on the fender with my leg wrapped around the headlight. You could really hang on good that way. Of course, this was after we got off of the highway and onto our pasture road. "Riding headlights," was such good sport, my cousins






