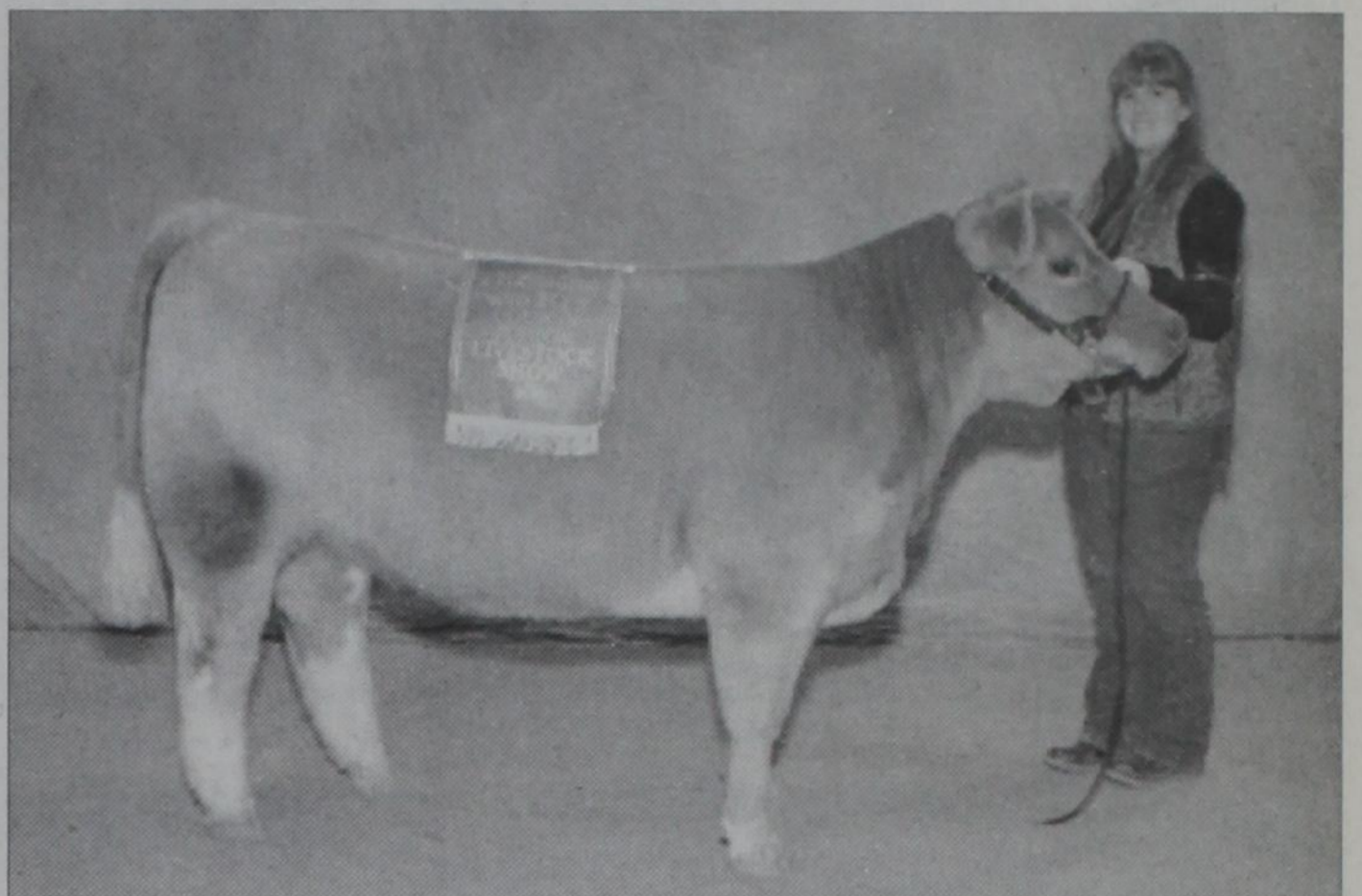

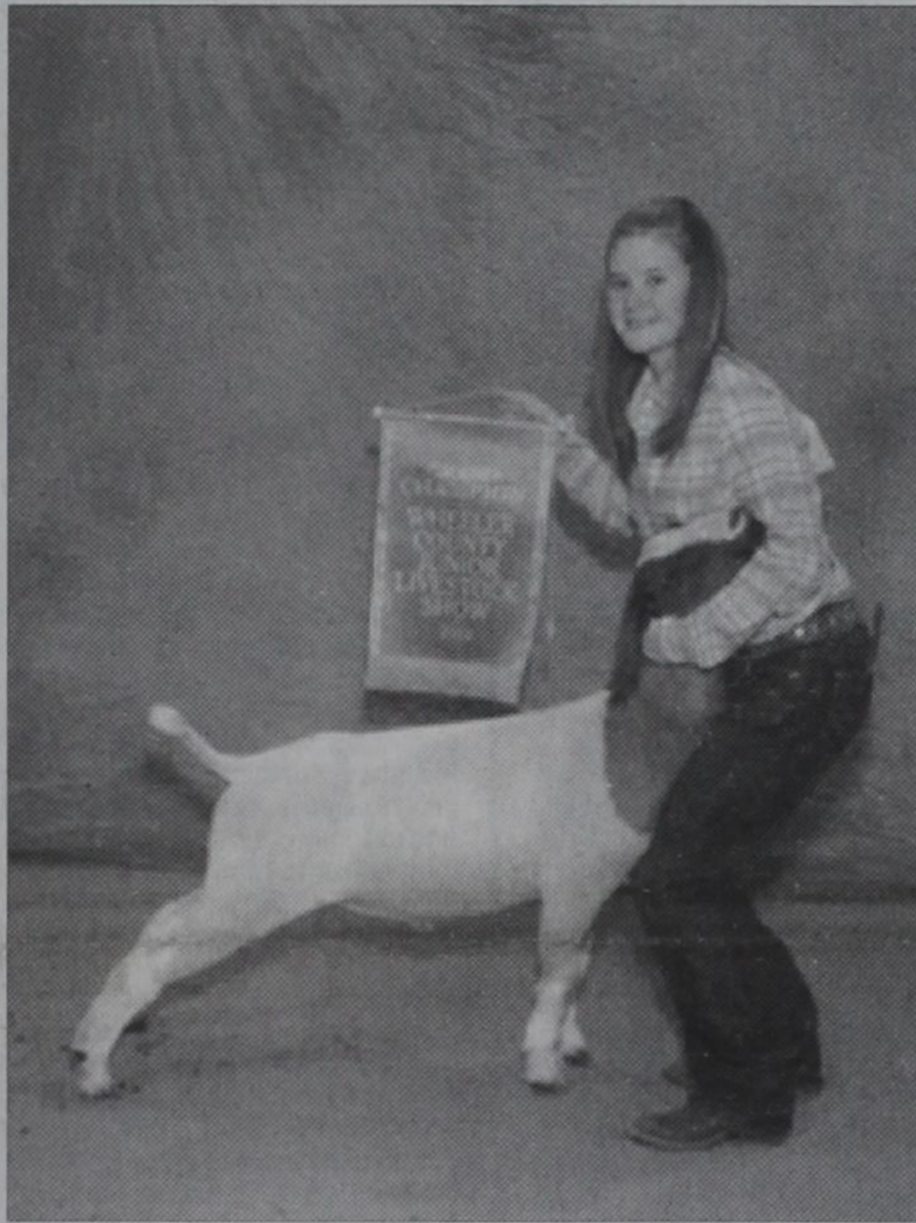

The Moore brothers of Texas take on another challenge in their freestyle dreams

Known around the world for their amazing abilities on atv's, Caleb and Colten Moore, have been invited to compete in this years Winter X-Games in Snowmobile Freestyle...yes, that's right, 'snowmobileFreestyle.

The ATV freestylers have long wanted to get quads into the X-Games. With that yet to happen, the brothers decided to transfer their talent over to something that was already in the X-Games...snowmobiles. Their quad sponsor, Polaris, sent 2 Polaris 600 IQ sleds to Texas in mid December. They began practicing in their foam pit and within 2 weeks went to Upper Michigan to actually put the machines to snow.

Within the first day, they were already back flipping and have since added flip variations and body variats. Once video was submitted to the Xgames selection committee, the brothers were both invited to compete in the snowmobile freestyle event. There is also a "best trick" competition. However, all the slots were full for the best trick competition before the boys presented themselves to the committee but both Caleb and Colten have been named alternates for that event. These events of the 14th Winter X-Games will be televised on ESPN and ESPN2 January 28th thru the 31st.

WANNA SEE MY TONSILS? & FISHBAIT IN THE CELLAR

While living on the "Old Double Tuff" farm, I started having a sore throat really often. I'd no more than get over one bout of it, than I'd get it again. Dr. Harold Nicholson, in Wheeler, said I needed to have my tonsils taken out. An appointment was set up to get it done and when the day finally arrived, everybody told me how much better I was going to feel when I healed up. They told me that when I woke up, I could even have some ice cream. Boy, that all sounded good!

However, things didn't go exactly like I had thought it would. When I woke up after the surgery, I was sick as a dog. Back then, ether was used for anesthesia. That stuff would make you sick for about two days. I don't think I ever did get my ice cream, but I did get one of the nicest "presents" from Dr. Harold. He had put my tonsils in what looked very much like an olive jar. They were about the size of small almonds, floating around in some sort of liquid. I was pretty proud to have them, something to

share with my friends and their parents.

Tonsils. Now that would make a good "show and tell" item. I really wanted to take them to school and do just that, but Mom wouldn't let me. She was wise enough to realize that they might get stolen

if I took them up there. I had my "bottled tonsils" for two or three years before they finally ... disappeared. I had kept up with them pretty good, so maybe Mom lost them after showing them to some of her friends.

Speaking of keeping things in jars, one time Mom was killing chickens, to go in the "deep freeze." We had raised about a hundred baby chickens and they had reached frying size. She was taking the young roosters to be put in the freezer. The pullets (young hens) would be kept as laying hens.

Anyway, I asked Mom if I could save some of the chicken guts to

use for catfish bait. I'd planned on going fishing pretty soon. I put the guts in a fruit jar with a lid, and put it in the cellar. A couple of weeks later, Jimmy Hill and his family came over one Sunday to visit. Jimmy, his little brother, Wayne, and I had been playing for quite a while when we happened to go by the cellar.

Every now and then, I liked to go down in the cellar and get a jar of dill pickles to eat, so I asked Jimmy and Wayne, if they'd like some pickles. Naturally, just like me, they were always hungry, so we went down in the cellar to get the pickles. What I really wanted was some of mom's pickled peaches, but was afraid I'd get caught up with, if we got them.

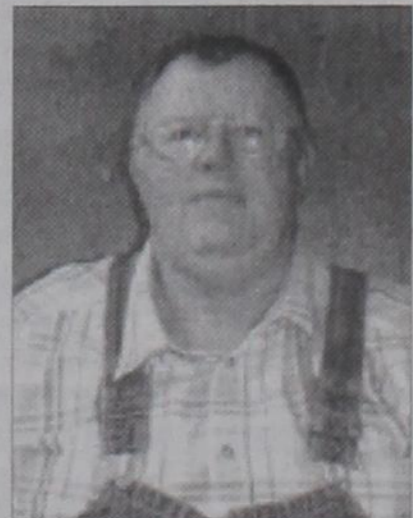

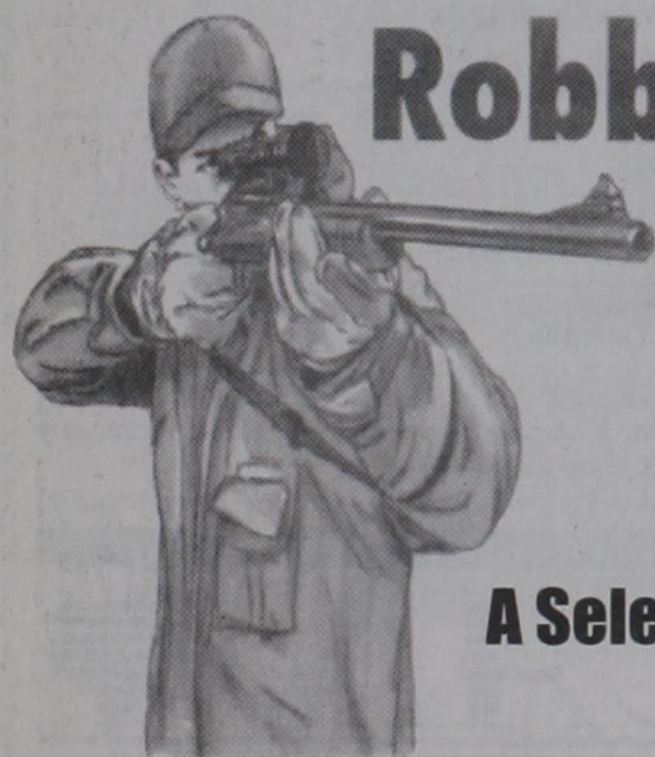

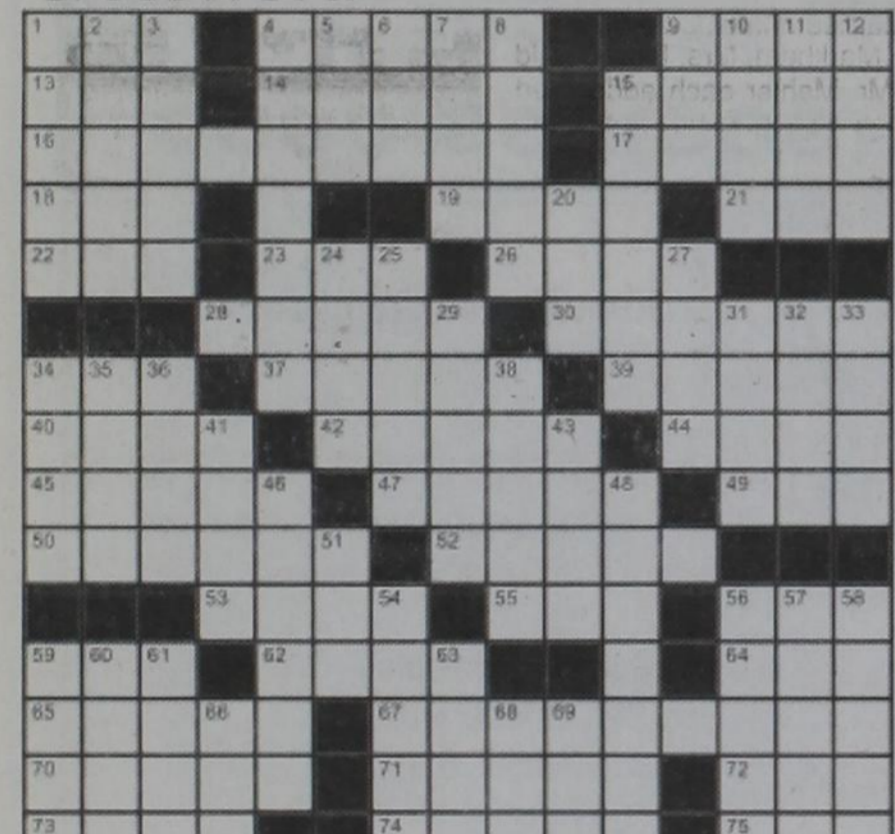

NRCS Accepts Applications For Farm, Ranch Lands Protection Program

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is accepting applications for the Farm and Ranch Lands Protection Program (FRPP), a voluntary conservation program that helps farmers and ranchers keep their land in agriculture.

Eligible entities can apply at any time, but must submit applications on or before March 1, 2010, to receive consideration for initial funding in fiscal year 2010.

FRPP provides funds to help purchase development rights to keep productive farmland in agricultural uses. Working through existing programs, the NRCS joins State, tribal, or local governments and non-governmental organizations to acquire conservation easements.

Only eligible entities may submit applications of eligible farm and ranch land. Eligible entities are State, tribal or local governments and non-governmental organizations that have the authority to acquire, hold and manage easements and the funds to match the Federal contribution.

The FRPP can provide up to 50 percent of the appraised fair market value of the easement on the farm or ranch. At least 50 percent of the appraised fair market

Livestock Diseases Are Being Studied

Researchers study microbes in cattle to unlock metabolic disease mysteries

Switching from warm-season grasses to cool-season forages can give livestock a belly ache, in some cases a deadly one, according to Texas AgriLife Research scientists.

Dr. Bill Pinchak, Texas AgriLife Research animal nutritionist at Vernon, is leading a team of scientists who are using state-of-the-art technology to determine how changes in diet affect microbial communities in the digestive tract of cattle and how these changes may increase risk of disease.

Metagenomics is a field of molecular microbiology where the presence of a microbe is determined by identifying its DNA in a sample rather than trying to grow the organism in culture, said Dr. Jason Osterstock, AgriLife Research ruminant animal health scientist in Amarillo and part of the team.

Pinchak, who is head of the Bloat Research Project, said they want to understand the role of rumen microbial communities in metabolic disease, specifically frothy bloat of cattle grazing winter wheat pastures. Bloat is a costly and sometimes fatal disease of cattle, with an estimated \$400 million negative impact on the beef cattle industry.

Their goal is to determine the interactions among rumen microbes that lead to the onset and duration of disease, he said.

Studying individual microbial genus or species in the rumen only provides part of the story, Osterstock said. In fact, the rumen is a complex microbial system comprised of bacteria, protozoa and fungi where the impact of a specific microbial species is dependent upon the activity of other microbes in the system.

Metagenomics is an ideal approach to studying these microbial communities because less than 10 percent of rumen microbes can be grown in culture using routine anaerobic methods, Osterstock said.

The team's current work has focused on bacterial populations in the rumen using sequencing methods and bioinformatics to classify which bacterial genera are present under different dietary conditions.

The bloat team recently completed the first genomics-based characterization of bacterial populations from steers associated with changing from a warm-season grass hay diet to a cool-season grazed forage diet. Their study included 14 steers sampled at two time points, the largest study of its kind to date, the scientists said.

During their research, the scientists found that the distribution of bacterial genera changes dramatically when stocker cattle transition from Bermuda grass hay to winter wheat forage diets, Pinchak said. In addition, analyses determined that bacterial communities were clearly different in the fiber, liquid and whole rumen fractions within the rumen, he said.

Overall, more groups of different bacteria occurred on Bermuda grass hay than wheat forage di-

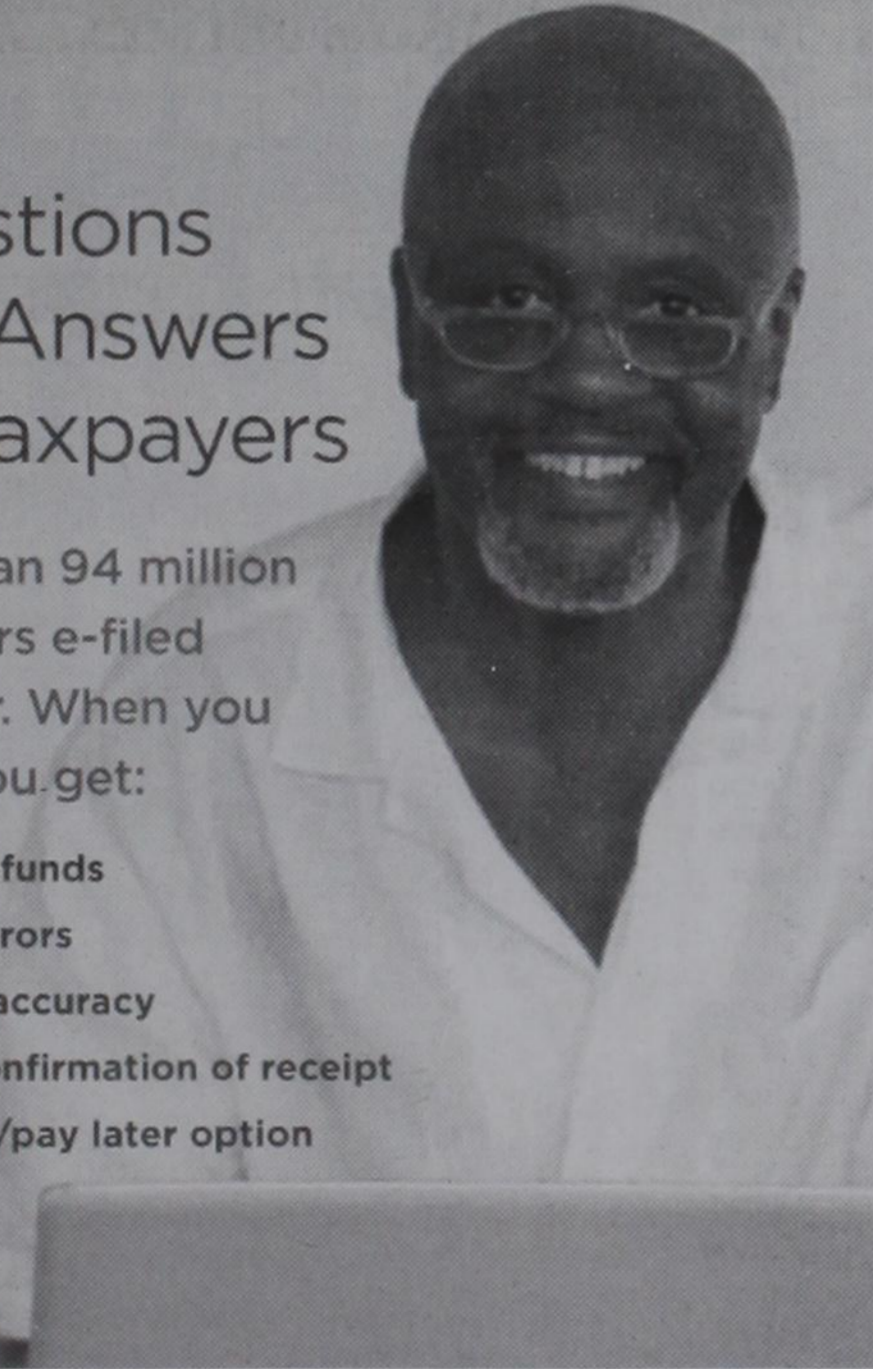

ets, which is consistent with the increased rumen retention time of the less digestible Bermuda grass hay, Pinchak said.
During the study, they found that specific bacterial groups would increase, decrease, appear or disappear from one diet to the other, highlighting the complexity, plasticity and specificity of rumen bacterial populations, he said.
These results point toward the potential to use deeper metagenomic sequencing, including characterization of non-bacterial microbes, to gain better resolution and begin to unravel more complex relationships in future studies, Pinchak said.
Pinchak and Osterstock are joined on the research team by Dr. Dipti Pitta, an AgrLife Research post-doctoral research associate in Vernon; and Dr. Scot Dowd, director of the Research and Testing Laboratory in Lubbock.
The Bloat Research Project team recently formed a consortium with scientists at the Borlaug Institute at Texas A&M University; the J. Craig Venter Institute, a leader in genomic research in Rockville, Md.; and the University of Illinois.
Pinchak said metagenomics also can be used to study how cattle adapt to diets containing bioenergy co-products, discover novel enzymes for biofuel production, or to help understand how microbial community dynamics affect food safety pathogen prevalence, feed efficiency and greenhouse gas emissions. -30-

Funding Available For Texas Grassland Owners

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is accepting applications to participate in USDA's Grassland Reserve Program (GRP), a \$4.6 billion conservation program in Texas.
"While GRP is open to anyone who owns grassland, we are giving priority consideration to threatened areas of Texas so ranchers can protect their land resources through rental agreements or perpetual easements," said Don Gohmert, NRCS state conservationist in Texas.
GRP is a continuous sign-up program, but landowners are encouraged to apply as soon as possible to be eligible for the initial funding cycle, which begins February 1, 2010.
The NRCS and USDA Farm Service Agency administer GRP, a voluntary program reauthorized in the 2008 Farm Bill to protect grazing uses and other related conservation values by restoring and conserving eligible grasslands and certain other lands through rental agreements and easements.
The enrollment options for GRP include:
• Rental agreements - 10, 15, or 20-year duration, USDA pays 75 percent of the grazing value in annual payments for the length of the agreement.
• Permanent easements - USDA makes payment based on the fair market value of the property less the grazing value.
Land that is privately owned is eligible for GRP. The land must be grassland for which the predominant use is grazing. Land that has been historically dominated by grassland and provides habitat for animal or plant populations of significant ecological value, or land that contains historical or archeological resources is eligible.
Land previously enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program is eligible for GRP.
Publicly owned land is not eligible or land already under protection from conversion to non-grazing uses is also not eligible.


