

L. Prairie Chicken **Aerial Survey Plan**

Texas Parks and Wildlife, Texas Tech University and the US Department of Energy are collaborating to conduct a large-scale aerial survey for Lesser Prairie Chicken booming grounds in the Texas Panhandle.

Surveys began March 15 and will continue through mid-May, resuming during the same time span in 2011. The joint operation is designed to improve knowledge regarding Lesser Prairie Chicken distribution and population status in Texas. Information from these surveys will be used by TPWD to aid in the conservation of the bird in partnership with landowners and private industries including oil and gas, wind energy, and electric utilities.

"This information may also be beneficial in preventing federal listing of the Lesser Prairie Chicken as an endangered species," said Lubbock-based TPWD wildlife diversity biologist Sean Kyle.

A variety of homestead exemptions could lowe your property taxes!

A homestead exemption lowers the property taxes on your I by lowering its taxable value. If your home is valued at \$5 and you receive a \$15,000 homestead exemption, your hom be taxed as if it were worth \$35,000.

Who qualifies for an exemption?

Anyone who owns a home on Jan. 1 and uses it as a primary dence on that date is entitled to a \$15,000 homestead exem to lower school taxes this year...and it doesn't matter if your I is a house, condominium or mobile home. Counties, cities special taxing districts may also offer homestead exemption

Are other exemptions available?

If you're disabled-or if you're 65 years old or older-you entitled to an additional \$10,000 school tax exemption on home. And if you qualify for the 65 or older or disabled ex tion, you're also entitled to a permanent, locked-in "ceiling the school property taxes on your home. (The county, city or j college may adopt a tax ceiling to lock in 2010 taxes as the est amount for 65 and older or disabled homeowners.) The a or older homeowners school tax ceiling transfers to the sun spouse, if the spouse is 55 years of age or older at the tir death and lives in and owns the home. The age 65 or older h owners (or their surviving spouses 55 years of age or older) may transfer the percentage of school tax paid, based on former home's school tax ceiling, to a new home.

If you're a disabled veteran who receives from the Veterans A (VA)-(1) 100 percent disability compensation due to a se connected disability and (2) a rating of 100 percent disablec determination of individual unemployability, you are entitled exemption from taxation of the total appraised value of your dent homestead. A surviving spouse does not qualify.

Do I have to apply each year?

No. If you had a homestead exemption on your home in you won't need to reapply for 2010 unless your chief appr requires it. However, if you haven't received an exemption on present home-or if you've moved to a new home-you'll ne file for an exemption for 2010. If you are 65 this year, you ma for the age 65 or older exemption up to one year after the you turned 65. And if you became disabled, you need to fil the disabled person's exemption.

"Productivity appraisal" may lower the property taxes on your farm, ranch or timberland!

Texas law allows farmers, ranchers and timber growers to pay property taxes based upon the "productivity value" of their land rather than on market value. This means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce crops, livestock or timber-not on its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property tax savings.

When is the application deadline?

If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to your local appraisal district by April 30 to take advantage of this benefit on your 2010 property taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason and ask for it by April 30. If you miss this deadline, you may still be able to apply, but you will pay a penalty. Check with your appraisal district office.

Do you need to reapply annually?


If your land already receives agricultural or timber productivity appraisal, you normally don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to do so. If a new application is required, the appraisal district will notify you by mail.




