Graveside services were at 10:30 a.m., Tuesday, October 20, 2009, at Edith Ford Memorial Cemetery with Gary Jahnel officiating and Rev. Donald Hill, assisting. Viewing was held at Sacred Heart Catholic Church. Burial was in Edith Ford Memorial Cemetery under the direction of Hughs Funeral Home of Canadian, Texas.

Dick was born August 4, 1919, in Mangum, Oklahoma, to the late Mr. Andrew Pickens Dickinson and Mrs. Martha Minerva (Boone) Dickinson. He attended Zybach schools in Wheeler County. He was a United States Army veteran having served in World War II stationed in Germany where he served as driver of an artillery half track. 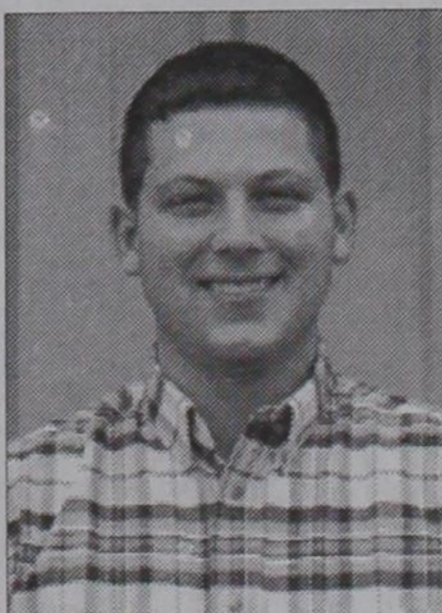

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

Model-T Hog Pen

Dad, was a really ingenious sort of guy. Near genius in my opinion. Not only did he build a sled he could haul water and me on; he invented one of the neatest hog pens ever in the history of hog-raising! He took an old, Model-T Ford, car body and raised two hogs in it. This old car body was out in our pasture, left there years earlier by someone. Sand was up around it, wheels gone, and kind-of all rusted up. It had been a convertible, or touring car in it's day. Anyway, it didn't have a top and that made it perfect for it's new life.

With a plan in mind, to make the most of this discarded piece of automobile history, Dad built a trough out of a couple of 2x6 boards nailed together with another 2x6 on each end. Looked like a good trough to me, and it fit just right in the car body. Then into this un-usual, one of a kind pen, ...went the two hogs. They weighed about 15 or 20 pounds each when we first got them; they "went to town" at about 220

pounds each. "Going to town," wasn't a good deal for farm animals. Okay for kids, but not hogs. For kids it meant soda-pop and peanuts, for

hogs it meant a one-way ticket... to the packing house.

At about the age of eight, not long after my duck drowned, Uncle Fat, asked me if I'd like to have a pig. One of his sow's had a litter of ten or twelve and he figured the runt would die, but if I wanted to try and keep it alive, he would be glad to let me have it. It

would give me something extra to do, so I jumped on the idea of becoming a hog farmer real fast. I said, "yes," before he changed his mind and kept it himself. I named my runt, "Old Red." I thought that was pretty original and classy.

We took him home and kept him in a little pen we fixed in the corner of the cow lot. The Model-A" pen was too far from the house and with Old Red being so little, I wanted him close by. Now, I could feed him and watch him grow real easy. Mom, gave me table scraps (then called slop) at the end of the day and clabber (sour milk). He even got "shorts" which is ground up wheat mixed with water. Yes sir, that little pig was eating high on the hog!

When Old Red got big enough that the coyotes wouldn't get him, we let him pretty much run loose. He'd never run off, he knew he had a good deal right where he was.

One day, I looked over at the

cow lot and he was nursing on one of our milk cows. We penned him up, to make sure that didn't happen again. After all, we sold cream

at town, because we needed the income and he was definitely interfering with that.

We probably had Old Red for about four months. By this time he had gone from a half-starved runt, to about 240 pounds. Not a good thing for his future. He wasn't a cute little pig anymore, he was a full "top hog." As you've already figured out, my not so little piggy, "went to town." This has always been the down-side of having a farm animal for a pet. They grow up and...."go to town."

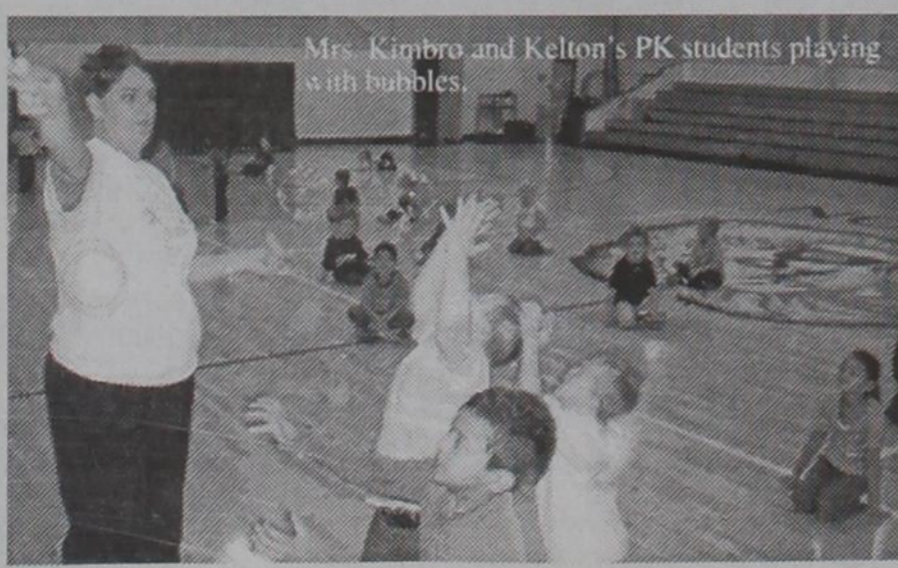

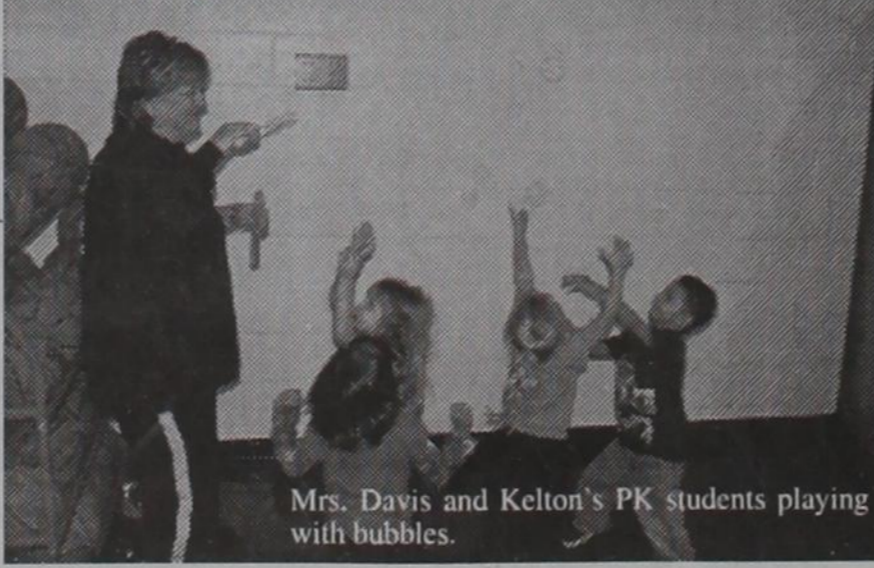

When Someone at Home has the Flu

Influenza is caused by a virus that spreads easily from person to person.

Flu causes headache, chills and fever, cough or sore throat, and body aches. Some people can become seriously ill if they get the flu.

The best way to prevent getting the flu is to get flu vaccine each fall. If vaccine is not available, there are still things you can do to reduce your risk of getting sick, especially if someone in your household is sick with the flu.

Recognize Flu Symptoms
Watch for these symptoms:

- Fever, chills
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Muscle aches/pain
- Lack of energy
- Runny or stuffy nose

Unlike a cold, with symptoms that comes gradually, usually hits all at once. Fever and severe body aches are common. Call your health care provider if you think someone in your family has the flu. Information on treating many symptoms can be given over the phone. If you think you have the flu, stay home unless you need medical care. In that case wear a surgical mask to help prevent spreading germs.

• Rinse hands well under running water.

• Dry your hands using a paper towel or air dryer.

• If possible, use your paper towel to turn off the faucet.

* If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based wipe or hand gel!

Keep your hands away from your face.

Since you can't wash your hands all the time, make a habit of not touching your face. Keep your hands away from your eyes, nose and mouth to prevent germs from entering your body.

Clean and Disinfect Surfaces
Disinfecting surfaces will help kill flu germs.

Cleaning and disinfecting is not the same thing! Cleaning removes germs.

Disinfecting destroys them. Cleaning with soap and water to remove dirt and most of the germs is usually enough. But, when it comes to flu germs, you will want to disinfect for an extra level of protection.

Mix 8 cup of chlorine bleach into one gallon of hot water to disinfect surfaces. Disinfect doorknobs, light switches, handles, telephones, toys and other surfaces people frequently touch such as tabletops, counters and chair backs.

Don't let germs hang around on cleaning cloths or towels, either! Choose paper towels that can be thrown away OR Cloth towels that will be laundered after one use.

Please, keep your germs to yourself!

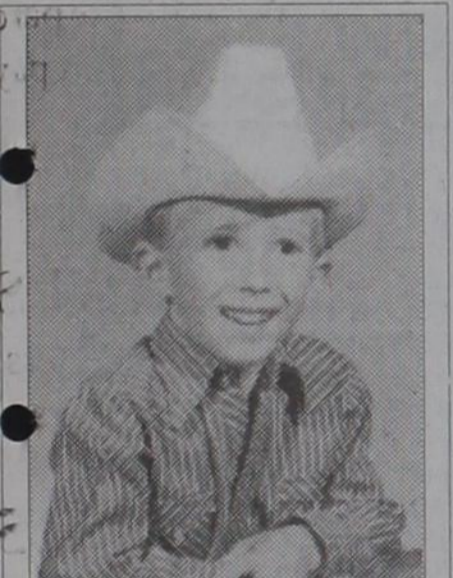

Hwy Patrol Officers To Ride Sch. Buses

As part of National School Bus Safety Week (Oct. 19-23), Highway Patrol troopers will ride school buses looking for motorists illegally passing school buses.

"Motorists should remember that state law requires them to stop for a school bus when its red alternating flashing lights are on. Loading and unloading are the most dangerous times for students who ride school buses," said David Baker, DPS Assistant Director—Texas Highway Patrol.

"We'll have Highway Patrol troopers riding random school buses across the state, and we'll issue citations to drivers who violate the law."

Motorists who are cited for driving past a stopped school bus whose red alternating flashing lights are activated can expect to pay up to a \$1,000 fine.

Although 35,000 school buses transport 1.4 million Texas children daily, school buses provide one of the safest modes of transportation, accounting for less than one-half of one percent of Texas roadway crashes.
