PLANTING PEACH TREES And THE PEANUT STACK

Up until we moved to Wheeler, I had lived in town most of my life, so I didn't know nearly as much about farm life as my cousins. They were born and raised on the farm and seemed to know all about farm stuff. My cousin, Darrell, was near my age, and it seemed to fall his lot to teach me the ropes of... farm life. Uncle Fat, had a nice orchard which was mostly peaches. Every summer, if the peach trees didn't bloom too early and get frozen out, us cousins would start eating them when they were still about

half green. We would continue to play, eat peaches, then play some more. This wasn't all fun, food, and games though. Sometimes, our moms would make us pick peaches for them to "can" or "put up" as they would say. As if that wasn't bad enough, they'd also

require us to help peel 'em. It's a pretty intimidating sight to be given a paring knife, then have two or three bushel baskets full, set in front of you. This did have one positive side to it, though. Mom, always helped peel too, and let me eat as many as I wanted. If I'd had my say about it, they would have all been pickled, because then, they wouldn't have to be cut up; just left whole. Besides that, I really did like pickled peaches and knew I'd be glad we had 'em next winter. It was great to be able to run down in the cellar "before" dark, and get a jar or two of 'em for after-supper dessert!

After giving all of this as much serious thought as we could possibly muster, Darrell and I, decided we'd just plant a few peach trees of our very own. This way, we could do what we wanted to with

the peaches...eat 'em! there wouldn't be any of that peeling, canning, and no more interference with our playing.

Being very "astute" about orchards, Darrell said, "We might as well plant the seeds to where we won't have to transplant 'em once they come up and get some size on 'em." Not having any past experience with "peach seed" planting, I asked him, "Just what was 'trans-plantin'?" He told me, it was digging up a tree and planting it all over again, all because the seed had been planted, too shallow. I was very impressed that he knew so much; this was going to save us a lot of work later on. Sounded good to me...

We were ready and willing, to start our own peach orchard! Darrell, went to the tool shed and got the posthole diggers. We planted our seeds about two feet deep and figured that was just about right to avoid transplanting. We checked on them the rest of that summer and they never came up. We thought that next spring, for sure, they'd pop out, but they never did. Where did it all go wrong? Bad seed, we guessed. What else could it possibly be?

Another thing I learned about peaches from my cousins... don't eat peach seeds, you'll go crazy if you do! I asked how they knew that and Shirley said, "You ever hear the saying, 'Crazy as a peach-orchard boar'?" Well, eating peach seeds is what made him crazy.

Seems as if us kids were always hungry. Some, call it the "coyote mentality;" if it's available, eat it!

Our grandpa and grandma lived down on Sweetwater Creek, for a few years. That was a really neat place to go and visit. They always appeared to like for us to come and see them. They also, didn't seem to mind if we stayed gone most of the day, wandering around. They had some really big pear trees and in the fall, we would

climb up in them and eat pears until we were so full, we barely could climb down.

One fall day, Darrell and I were at grandpa and grandma's place, wandering around, as usual. We'd gone onto a little pasture road that went by Mr. Sanders house. The road went right through his peanut field, and on each side of the road there was a big stack of freshly dug peanuts. In the center was a post with an old truck tire thrown over it, to help keep the

peanuts from blowing away. He would leave them there until they were dry enough to pull the raw, unshelled peanuts off the vines.

Wow, a deal this good didn't happen every day! We dug right into the stack and really tanked-up on those fresh, not-dry-enough peanuts. By the time we got back to grandma's house, our bellies were hurting bad! I thought I was gonna die. Kind of made me appreciate "store-bought" peanuts a whole lot more.

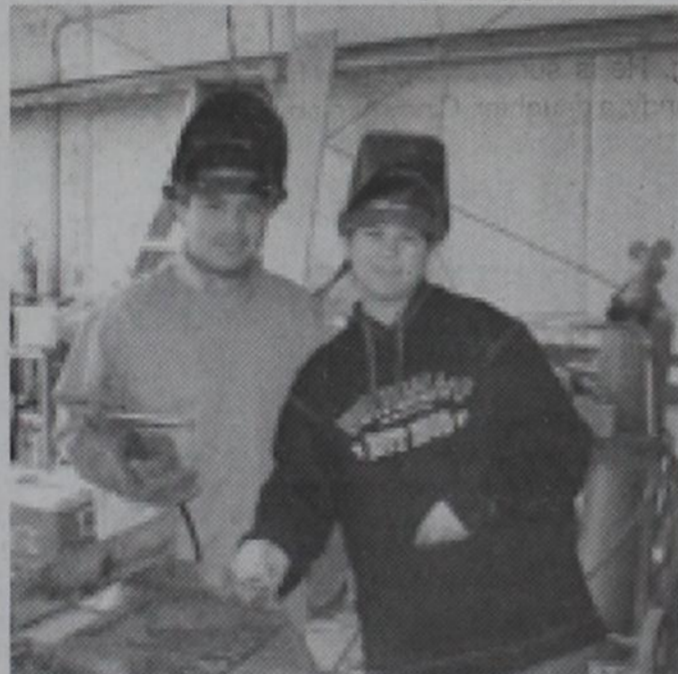

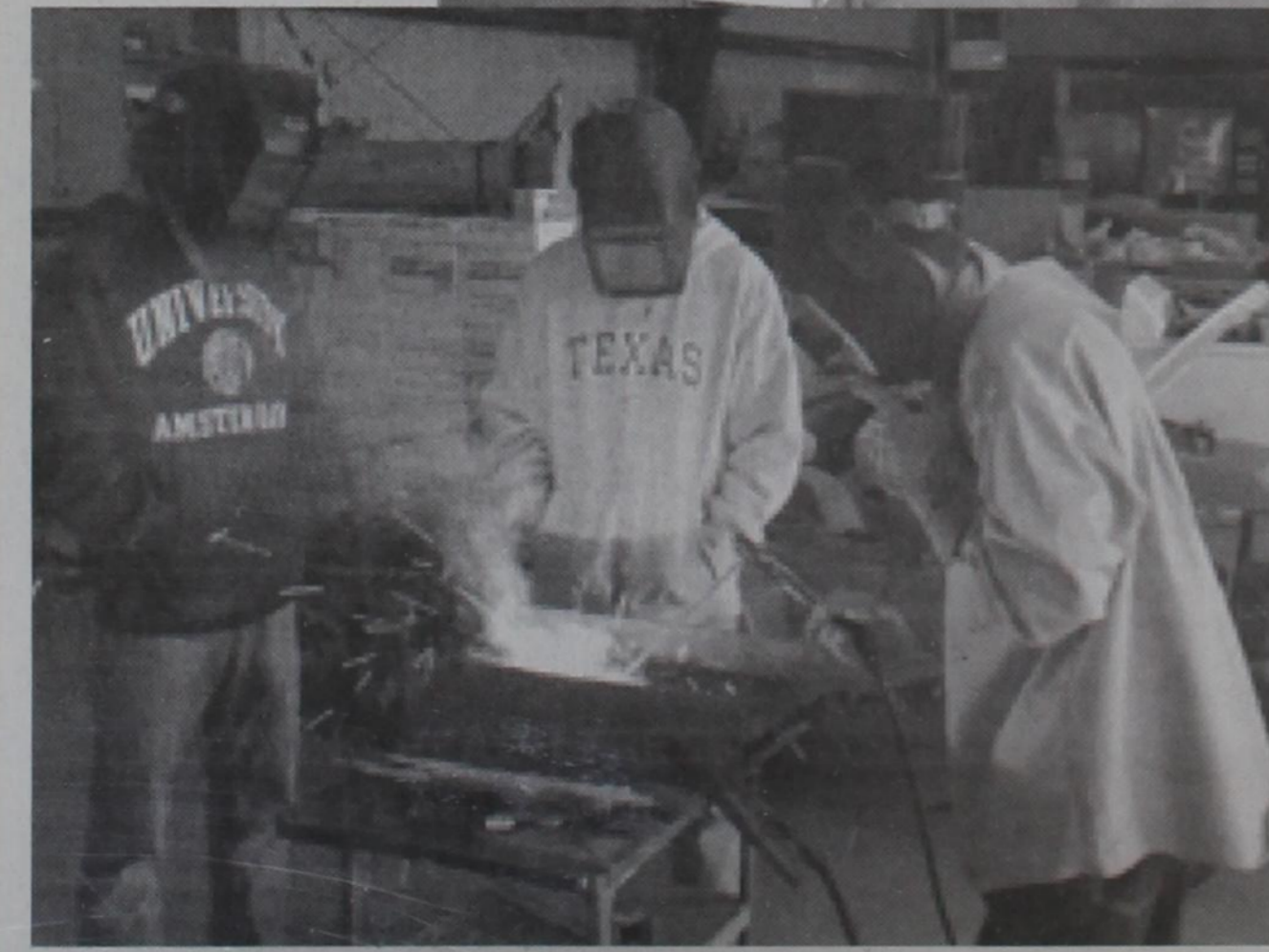

of incorporated city limits, check with the city for applicable ordinances.

Anyone running for office is reminded that it is illegal to put any sign on state highway right of way without authorization. TxDOT's regulatory authority allows the immediate removal of a sign placed on state highway right of way without prior notice, if the sign is not authorized by state law or approved by TxDOT. The penalty for violating this law is a fine of up to \$500 per sign.

The law does not just apply to campaign signs. It is illegal to put any sign, including garage sale and business signs on state highway right of way without authorization. "Sign" is defined as any outdoor sign, display, light device, figure, painting, drawing, message, plaque, or other thing that is designed and/or intended to advertise or inform.

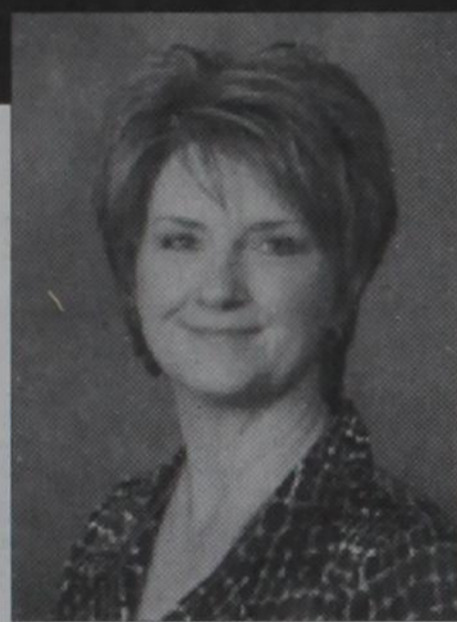

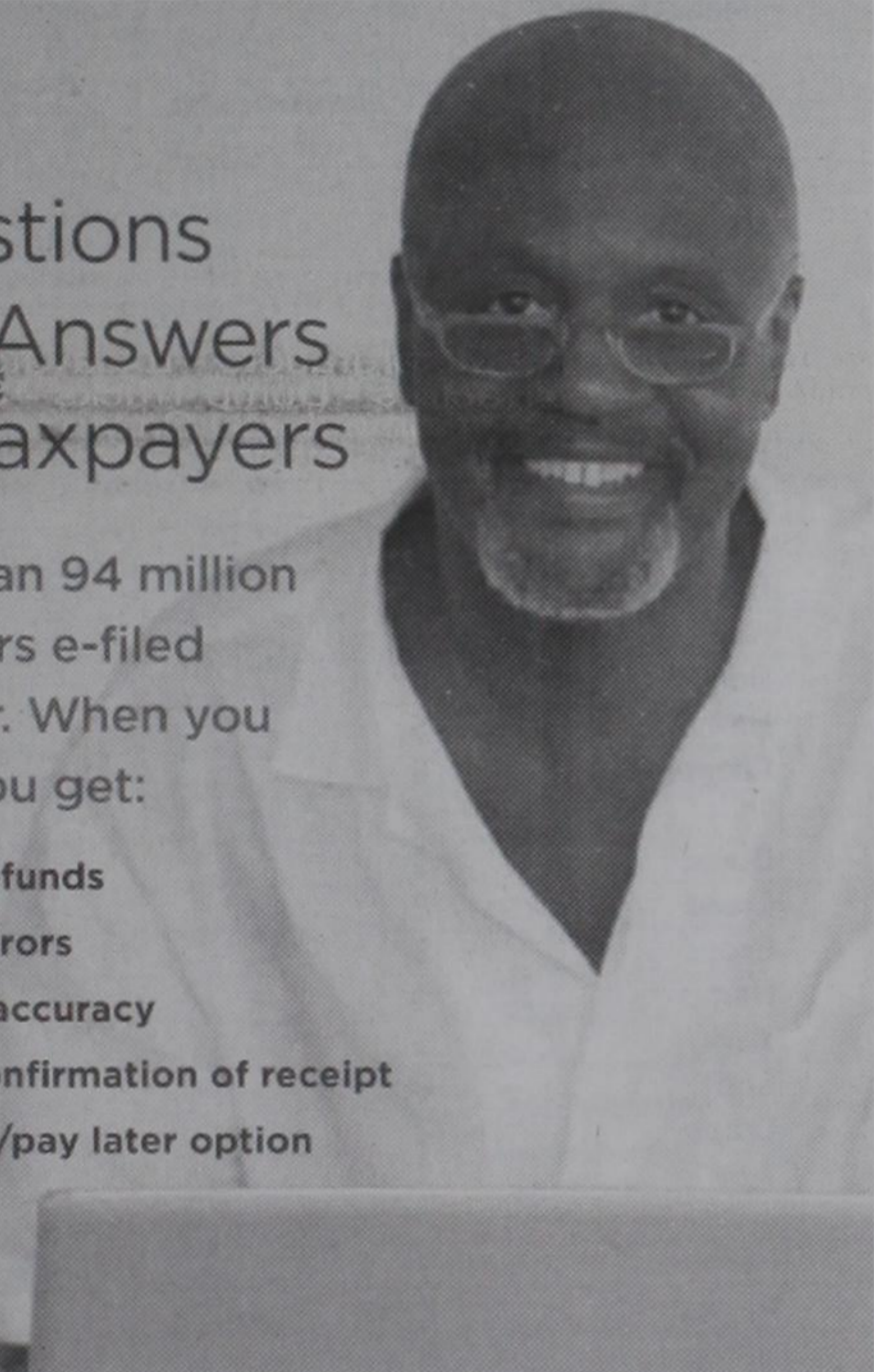
