I like the pep rally. We say, "Peel it to the left. Peel it to the right. Peel it down the middle and take a bite Go 'ananas' Go 'ananas'."

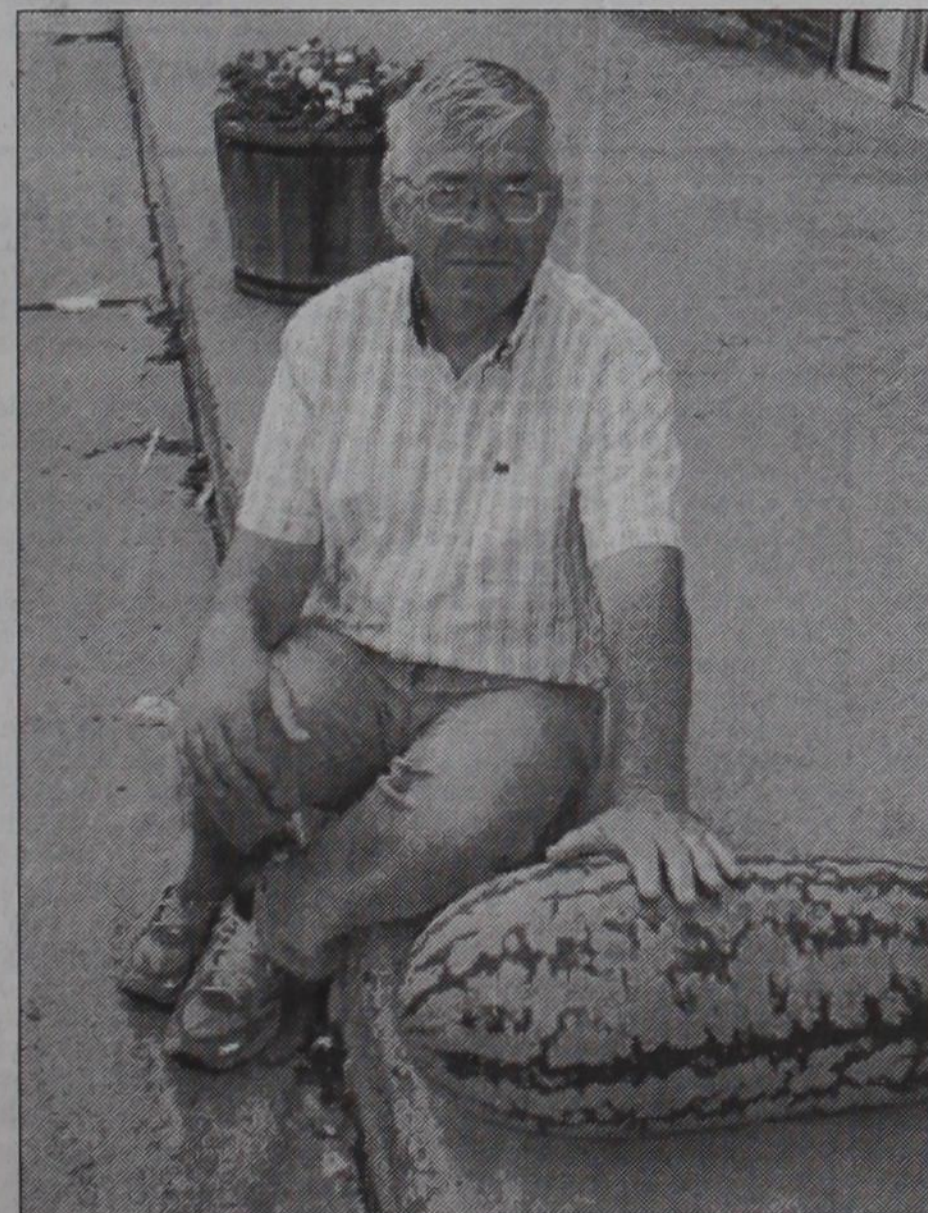

Matching Funds Are Available For Wheeler's Sidewalk Project

The City of Wheeler recently received information from the Amarillo Area Foundations needing assistance with the Area Community Designated Fund Project. The purpose of this fund is to work with Panhandle communities to establish designated funds to benefit programs and meet needs in

their community.

Mayor Wanda Herd spoke to Jim Allison, president and CEO of the Amarillo Foundation and he stated the Board of Directors has voted to match each fund \$50,000 to start the program and an additional \$50,000 to those communities that raise \$100,000 by December 31, 2007. Mr. Allison stated this fund could be used for the "Sidewalk Project".

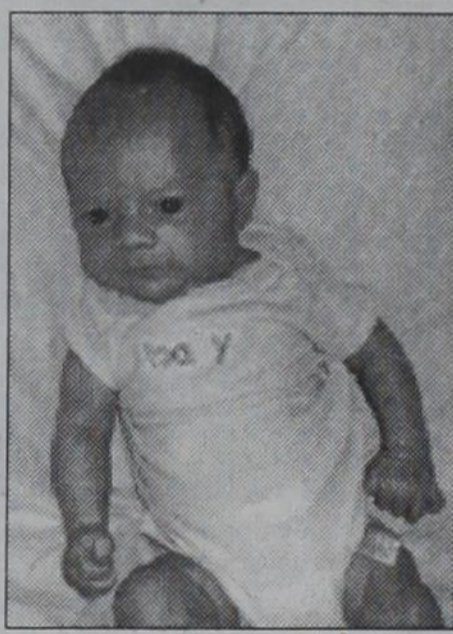

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, September 24, 2007, at 10:00 A.M. in the Commissioners' Courtroom in the Wheeler County Courthouse.

Eight items were on the agenda. The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment as presented.

The court voted to pay the bills as presented.

On the budget, the court voted to transfer \$10,000 from the General Building and Maintenance Fund to the Wheeler County Sheriff's Supplies Fund.

The County Tax Assessor and County Treasurer's Reports were accepted as presented.

Scott Porter, Tax Assessor, presented his Notice of Continuing Education; the document was accepted by the court.

Scott Porter requested and was given permission to advertise for a new computer and program for his office.

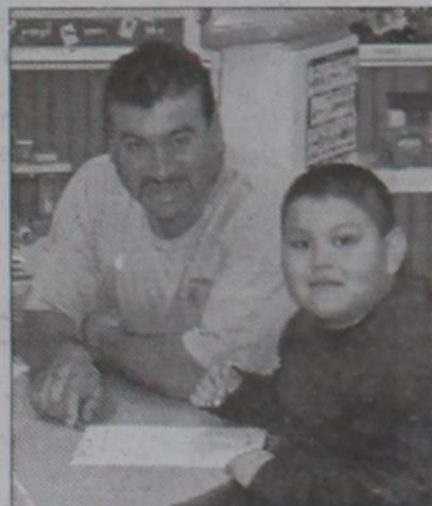

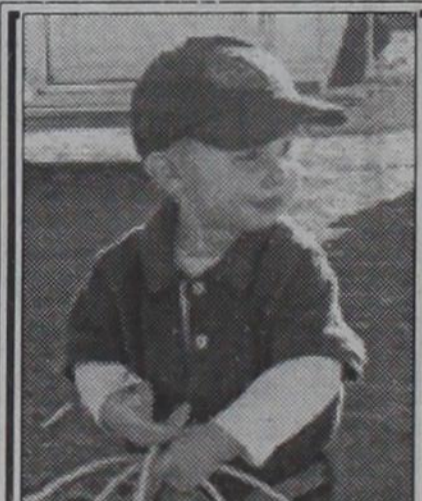
