MARCH 8, 2010

Chairman Thomas Helton called the meeting to order in the Hospital Boardroom at 6 p.m.

Present were: Thomas R. Helton, Chairman; Sue Chandler, Vice-Chairman; James Batton, Secretary; Dale Garner and Ray Hudson. Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, CEO; Sue Stiles, RN, BSN, CNO; John P. Lavelle, M.D., ER Director and Jimmy and Tammy Maddox

Chairman Helton asked Mr. and Mrs. Maddox to retire from the Boardroom and at 6:02 p.m. called the meeting into Executive Session pursuant to Texas Govt. Code 551.071 - Consultation with Attorney - Pending Litigation.

Chairman Helton declared the meeting back into open meeting at 6:15 p.m. and Mr. and Mrs. Maddox were invited back into the meeting. Mr. Maddox was given the floor to have a discussion with the Board regarding his daughter being turned away from the Emergency Room. After his presenta-

tion and some comments and questions by Board Members and Ms. Fagan Cook, Chairman Helton requested that Mr. Maddox arrange a meeting with Dr. Lavelle, ER Director and Board member Dale Garner within the week to discuss the matter further. Mr. Maddox agreed to do so and he and Mrs. Maddox left the meeting at 6:22 p.m.

Dale Garner made a motion to accept the consent agenda. Motion seconded by James Batton. There were no questions or discussion. Motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the investment report as well as current rates for Certificates of Deposit at Wheeler Banking Center, First State Bank of Mobeetie and Farm Bureau Bank. The highest rate was at First State Bank of Mobeetie.

James Batton made a motion to re-invest the mature CDs for 60 months at the First State Bank of Mobeetie. Sue Chandler seconded the motion. Without further discussion the motion carried unanimously.

James Batton made a motion to approve the bad debt. Motion seconded by Sue Chandler and carried unanimously. Dale Garner made a motion to approve charity write-off. Motion seconded by Sue Chandler and carried unanimously.

QAPI minutes and scorecards were presented by Ms. Fagan Cook. After review James Batton made a motion to accept the reports. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Sue Stiles, RN, BSN, Chief Nursing Officer, reported that the electronic medical record installation is moving forward. We will go live with the Emergency Room on April 1, 2010. Project manager from Prognosis will be here for that week to assist with any difficulties. June is the projected date to go forward with inpatient records.

Chairman Helton asked for any new business. Ms. Fagan Cook reported that we had an overpayment from Medicare and that we would be returning the money on March 9, 2010. This was researched by our Cost Report Manager and verified to be an overpayment.

Ray Hudson reported that he had looked at the drainage problem that we have in the back yard that causes a flood in the dining room when it rains. He talked with a contractor and the ball-park figure for fixing the problem was \$3,000. A bid will be presented at the next meeting.

There was no further business and Ray Hudson made a motion for adjournment at 7:12 p.m. James Batton seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

OVERNIGHT COMPANY & SLEEPING ON PALLETS

When I was growing up, folks from out of town would come to see us once in a while. We only had a two-bedroom house at the time and when my uncle Lonnie and aunt Katherine came to visit and stay over night, that meant "pallet time" for us kids. The adults would always have to sleep in the beds, but we kids were lucky enough to get to sleep on the floor... on pallets!

They usually came to stay overnight in the summer time. This was a real treat, having cousins to sleep outside with you. We'd tell stories, look at stars (always trying to find the big and little dipper) and listen to the coyotes howling. We'd wonder sometimes, just how close the coyotes might be and how many were in the pack?

If you woke up during the night, you could even drag your pallet somewhere else... if you wanted to. This was the best camping out a kid could hope for and cousins always made it better.

I slept outside pretty often in the summer, on an old cot my folks bought somewhere. I'd already found out the hard way... "don't sleep under trees!" There were some leaf-eating worms in the trees and the worms would either

fall on you, or poop on you. Not a good thing, either way. Everyone, quickly learned to avoid that area.

One dark night, cousin Dugan and I, were sleeping on our old, rickety, front porch. We'd found a mattress in the smokehouse that had seen better years, and we dragged it around to the porch. This was just about the best idea we'd ever had. (Come to think of it, we hadn't had a lot of ideas, before that one.) We heaved, stumbled around and finely got the mattress in just the right spot. Now we had a soft pallet and we felt real good about our accomplishment.

Sleep came on pretty quickly, because we'd all been playing hard the whole day. Sometime during the night, we both heard a "thump" hit the mattress... right between the two of us! We scrambled like crazy getting off of it; found the flashlight we had with us and started looking to see what had hit our pallet... it turned out to be a bull snake, about four or five feet long.

The snake had climbed up into the porch rafters looking for birds that might be roosting there, lost its grip and fell down on our mattress. The snake was just about as scared as we were!

Since bull snakes are good

"mousers," we had been told more than once, "Never kill a bull snake." So, we turned him loose and he went slithering off toward the pasture where there would be

a lot less commotion, and hopefully, no kids!

Dugan and I, both slept a little lighter the rest of the night....

Cystic fibrosis is a genetic disease that affects the respiratory and digestive systems. The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation (CFF) has helped fund dramatic improvements in research and care of patients with cystic fibrosis. Because of CFF's dedication, patients with CF are living longer and much healthier lives. The CFF has played a significant role in getting a majority of the drugs passed by FDA to treat CF since 1980. Through constant research, for the first time in history, participants are taking oral drugs aimed at treating the basic defect in CF. These drugs could add decades of life for people with CF. Because of the CFF's newborn screening initiative, all 50 states are now screening newborns for CF. This is a vital key to a child with CF due to the early treatment of the disease and better overall health of the patient.

Funds To Enforce Underage Smoking

Schools and local law enforcement agencies battling to keep tobacco out of the hands of children can get financial assistance from the Texas Comptroller's office.
Grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$150,000 can be used for specific activities such as tobacco education for kids, tobacco retailers and court personnel; keeping schools and school events tobacco free; and sting operations to catch retailers selling tobacco products to minors.
"Consistent education efforts show kids and retailers that Texas is serious about preventing young people from taking up an extremely costly habit — in terms of money spent on tobacco and the high cost of tobacco related illnesses," Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said.
The deadline to apply for 2010-11 grants is May 7, 2010, for schools with on-campus law enforcement and May 14, 2010, for police departments, sheriffs, constables and district attorneys. The available grant amount for law enforcement agencies depends on the number of tobacco retailers within a jurisdiction. The grant amount available for school districts is based on the number of students who will be taught about the law prohibiting people under 18 from smoking or possessing tobacco and the consequences of violating the law.

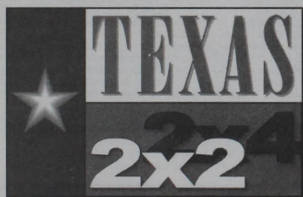

Parkview Artery Child Abuse and Neglect

In these times we live it is an all too familiar phrase. It's all too common a word in this day and time. It's important to be aware of what the signs are of an abused or neglected child, you can make a huge difference in someone's life. Listed below is a list and number of what you can do.

Warning signs of child abuse and neglect

The earlier child abuse is caught, the better the chance of recovery and appropriate treatment for the child. Child abuse is not always obvious. By learning some of the common warning signs of child abuse and neglect, you can catch the problem as early as possible and get both the child and the abuser the help that they need.

Of course, just because you see a warning sign doesn't automatically mean a child is being abused. It's important to dig deeper, looking for a pattern of abusive behavior and warning signs, if you notice something off.

- Warning signs of emotional abuse in children
- Excessively withdrawn, fearful, or anxious about doing something wrong.
 - Shows extremes in behavior (extremely compliant or extremely demanding; extremely passive or extremely aggressive).
 - Doesn't seem to be attached to the parent or caregiver.
 - Acts either inappropriately adult (taking care of other children) or inappropriately infantile (rocking, thumb-sucking, tantruming).

Warning signs of physical abuse in children

- Frequent injuries or unexplained bruises, welts, or cuts.

- Is always watchful and "on alert," as if waiting for something bad to happen.
- Injuries appear to have a pattern such as marks from a hand or belt.
- Shies away from touch, flinches at sudden movements, or seems afraid to go home.
- Wears inappropriate clothing to cover up injuries, such as long-sleeved shirts on hot days.

Warning signs of neglect in children

- Clothes are ill-fitting, filthy, or inappropriate for the weather.

- Hygiene is consistently bad (unbathed, matted and unwashed hair, noticeable body odor).
- Untreated illnesses and physical injuries.
- Is frequently unsupervised or left alone or allowed to play in unsafe situations and environments.
- Is frequently late or missing from school.

Warning signs of sexual abuse in children

- Trouble walking or sitting.
- Displays knowledge or interest in sexual acts inappropriate to his or her age, or even seductive behavior.
- Makes strong efforts to avoid a specific person, without an obvious reason.
- Doesn't want to change clothes in front of others or participate in physical activities.
- An STD or pregnancy, especially under the age of 14.
