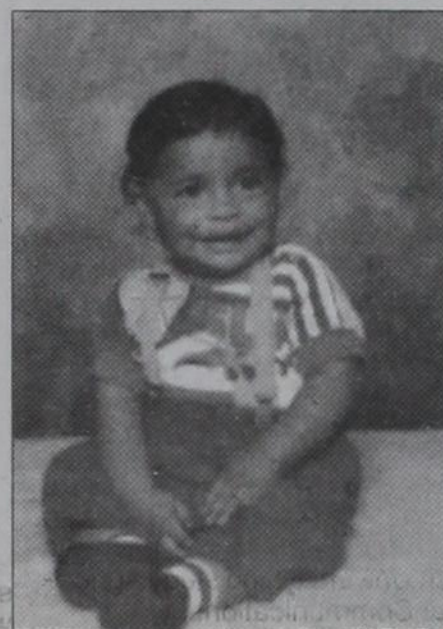
As a contender in U.I.L. his junior year, his subject was Number Sense.

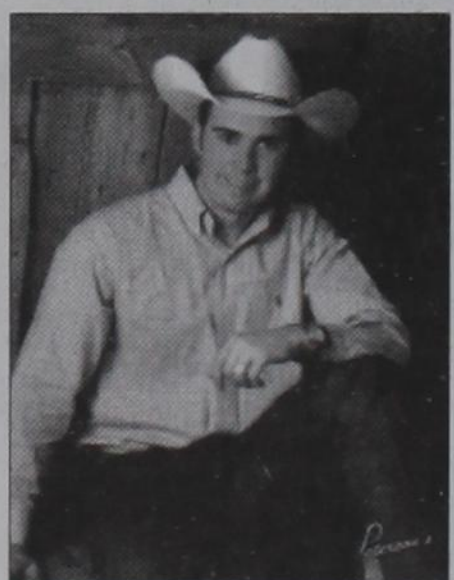
His membership included FFA, Basketball, Track, Powerlifting, Boy Scouts of America and Saint Peter Lutheran Church Youth Group.

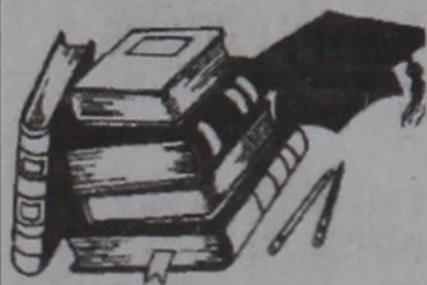

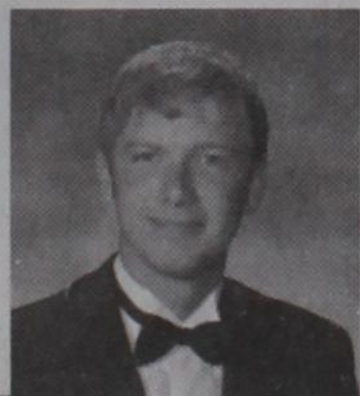

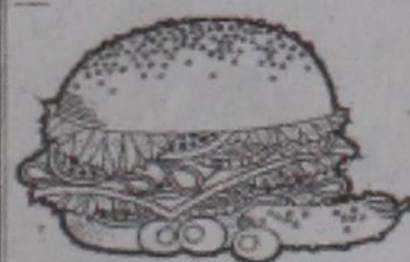

sion and distribution facilities, as well as more cost to make its generating fleet cleaner and more efficient. Additionally, pension and healthcare costs continue to rise, and in order to maintain a top-notch workforce, the company must invest more dollars in these employee benefits, Hill said.

"In order to prepare for and sustain growth in our communities, and integrate more renewable energy, we must be able to recover the costs of these investments," Hill said. "But even with the increase, we will remain among the lowest cost providers in Texas — a critical economic drawing card for businesses seek-

ing to expand in this region."

In a proposal filed today at the Public Utility Commission of Texas, and with each of the 80 municipalities Xcel Energy serves in Texas, the company seeks a residential base rate increase of 21 percent. But because a monthly bill is made up of both base rate charges and fuel charges, the net effect on the overall bill would be a 10.7 percent increase, or \$8.89, for a customer using 1,000 kilowatts per month. Texas commercial customer bills would increase by 1.9 percent, industrial customer bills would rise by 4.8 percent, and municipal customer bills would rise by 11.6 percent.

This filing reflects an overall increase in revenues of \$62 million.

However, nearly \$8.5 million of this total represents existing line-item charges that will be moved from separate charge into the base rates. The effective, non-fuel net increase will be \$53.5 million, or 7 percent across all customer classes.

The average residential bill in Texas is 11.6 cents per kilowatt-hour, and under the new rate structure, Xcel Energy's residential customers in Texas would be paying 9.2 cents per kilowatt hour — still well below both state and national averages.

Xcel Energy's 80 municipalities will consider the proposal first, but the issue likely will be appealed to the PUCT as in the case with past base rate changes. It could take six to nine months before a

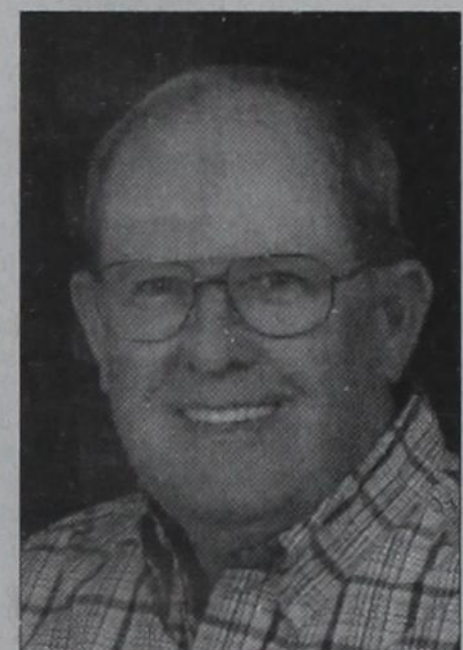

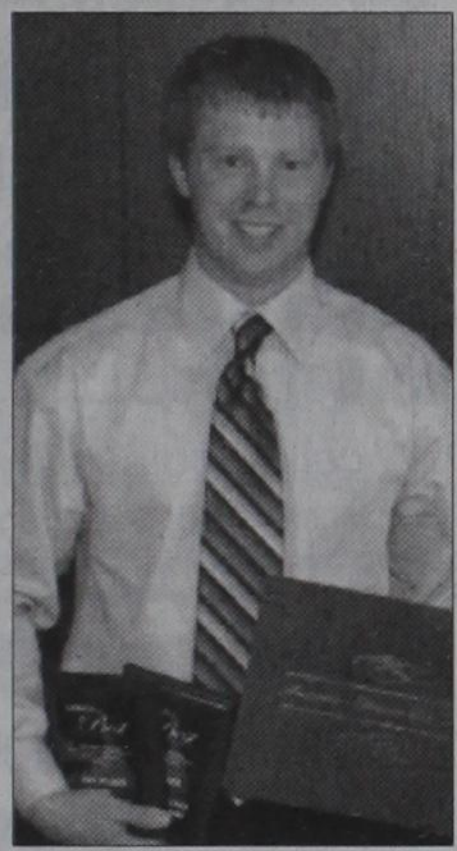
Twelfth Annual Ja'Nae Goad Tournament Is Played May 15

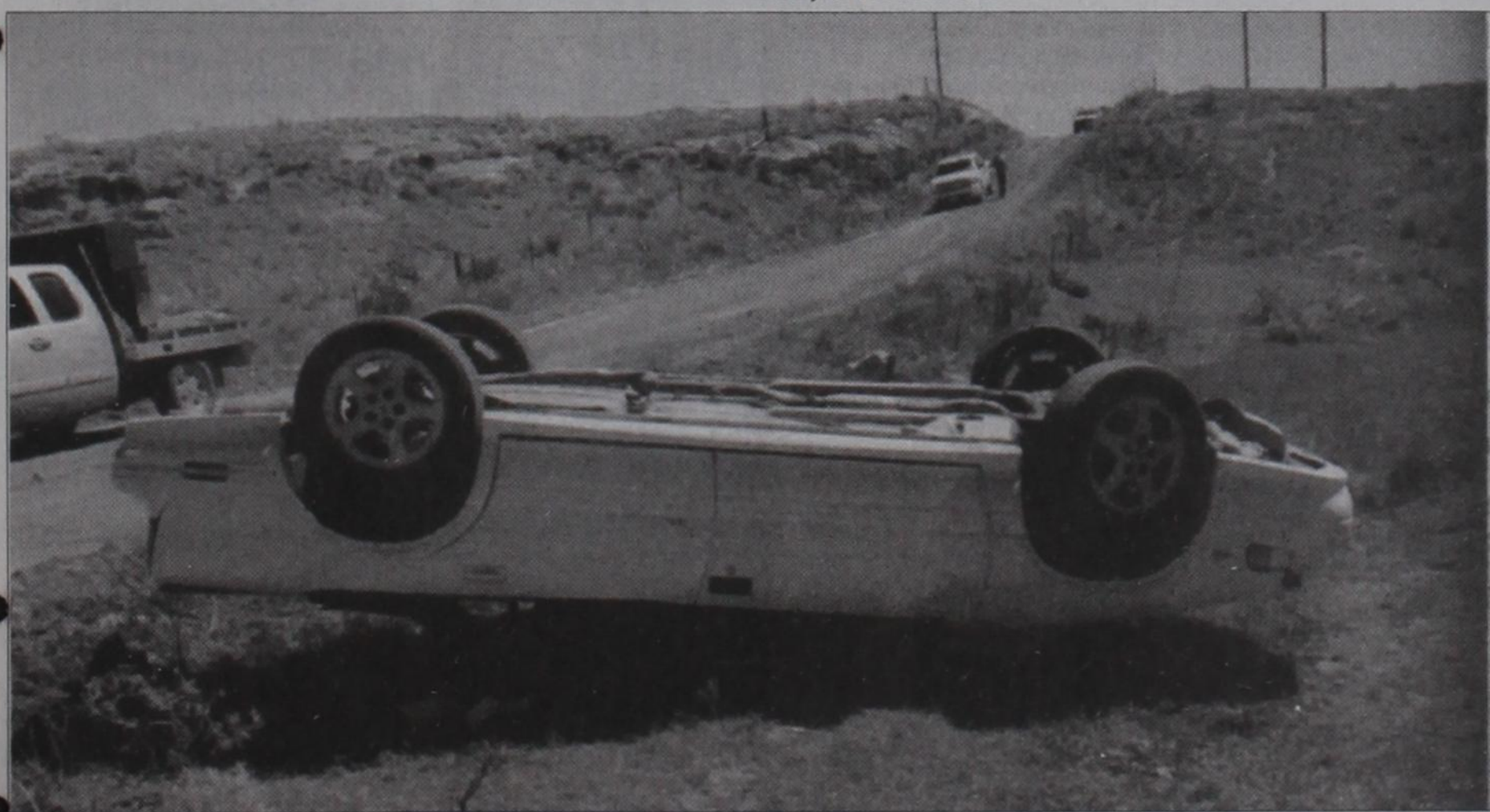
get a chance to play either time because of the weather.

Assistance Offered For Biofuel Producers

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced today that USDA Rural Development is accepting applications from advanced biofuel producers for funding under the Bioenergy Program for Advanced Biofuels. The Bioenergy Program for Advanced Biofuels works to support and ensure expanding production and usage of advanced biofuels by providing payments to eligible advanced biofuels producers in rural areas. Advanced biofuels are derived from renewable biomass, other than corn kernel starch. These include cellulose, sugar and starch, crop residue, vegetative waste material, animal waste, food and yard waste, vegetable oil, animal fat, and biogas (including landfill gas and sewage waste treatment gas).

Eligible advanced biofuel producers are those individuals or legal entities, including, but not limited to, a corporation, company, foundation, association, labor organization, firm, partnership, society, joint stock company, group of organizations or non-profit entity that produces an advanced biofuel. The eligible advanced biofuel must be produced at an advanced biofuel biorefinery located in a rural area.

Recently, local advanced biofuel producer, New Energy Fuels, of Waller, TX received over \$5,000 in funding to ensure an expanding production of advanced biofuels. This funding is consistent with the Obama Administration's work to reduce the nation's dependence on foreign oil by creating alternative energy sources and promoting rural economic development.

USDA Rural Development will accept applications from advanced biofuel producers until July 06, 2010. All applications from Texas advanced biofuel producers must be submitted to the USDA Rural Development Texas State Office, 101 S Main St, Temple, TX. View http://www.rurdev.usda.gov/tx/Section_9005.htm for application forms and submission requirements. For additional information, contact Daniel Torres or Michael Self at 254-742-9780. Funding is provided under the Bioenergy Program for Advanced Biofuels, authorized under the 2008 Farm Bill.

Enforcement Phase Of Booster Seat Law

Enforcement phase of new booster seat law begins June 1. Are you ready for the next phase of the new booster seat law? Starting June 1, law enforcement officers may issue citations for violations of the recent changes to the child passenger safety law.

The law requires all children younger than eight years old – unless already taller than 4'9" – to be in the appropriate child safety seat system anywhere the child rides in a passenger vehicle. (A passenger vehicle is defined as a passenger car designed to transport not more than 10 occupants including the driver, a truck, light truck, truck tractor, sport utility vehicle and a passenger van designed to transport not more than 15 occupants including the driver.)

The law also requires that all safety seat systems (safety or booster seats and safety vests) be installed according to the manufacturers' instructions – including age, height, weight requirements and the proper placement in the vehicle. (Some manufacturers prohibit using their products on the front seats of vehicles.)

The law was passed last year during the legislative session and went into effect on September 1, 2009. Officers could only issue verbal or written warnings for the first nine months – but now the enforcement phase is in effect.

Fines are \$25 to \$250 plus court costs...potentially much more than the cost of a safety or booster seat.

Safety seats and booster seats not only save lives: they save families. Consider the impact to your family if your child isn't buckled up properly and is injured or killed in a crash. Many times the injuries an improperly restrained child receives are life-long. Are you ready for the consequences of not securing a child?
