Yes, we were able to drive home but did have damage to the undercarriage of the pickup, the bumper, flash guard, exhaust and tie rods, as well as the major clean up. (What if this had been after dark or a young person who did not mind playing in the mud and was going faster).

P.S. While waiting for Matt to arrive we noticed there are not bar ditches for the water to run off this road, therefore, it can do nothing but build up and why the bolder rocks were there, we do not understand. This is very dangerous and someone is going to get hurt if this is not addressed.

as they begin a road trip and includes the names of their friends on billboards they pass along the way. Teens who participate will be entered into a contest to win prizes.

The enforcement time for this year's campaign by the Texas Department of Transportation is May 24 through June 6. During that time, extra law enforcement will be on the roads to enforce the new laws, with the goal of saving lives.

In setting the initial May 2010 allowables, the Commission used historical production figures from previous months, producers' demand forecasts
