Wow! In just an utterly unbelievable finish, the Wheeler Mustangs rode a fluttering 19 yard field goal off the toe of Sammy Zepeda with no time left to claim the 1987 Class A football championship, 23-21 over the Bremond Tigers.

The victory is the Mustangs third state crown in four ties in the past ten years and this has got to go down as one of the sweetest if for no other reason than how it was accomplished.

Coach Wendell Robinson of Bremond probably summed it up as well as could be as he led a dejected team off the turf of Shotwell Stadium in Abilene Saturday night when he said, "You can coach against everything except heart," and to everyone who saw the game, they showed it!

Trailing 21-20 after failing to convert on a two point effort after their final touchdown, the Mustangs kicked off with just 1:23 to play in the game and let's face it, Mustangs hopes were pretty dim. Wait, you forget the heart element.

Richard Smith's onside kick bounced off a Tiger at the Bremond 49 and who beat the Tigers to the ball but Timm Rodgers, a special teamer, and the Mustangs were on the midfield stripe with 81 ticks left on the clock and only one timeout remaining.

One running play lost a yard and two incomplete passes left the Mustangs facing fourth down, needing 10, and had used their last timeout. Shawn Bradstreet sidestepped the rush and passed to his left; Bubba Smith leaped for the ball at the Tiger 27 but it was too tall. Kyle Sword was on the 22 and wrapped the ball up for a first down.

Another incomplete pass and then a 12 yard completion to Smith who got out of bounds at the 21 for another first down. Bradstreet, who directed this drive like a true veteran, not the sophomore he is, passed to Grayson Benson for 5 more to the 12 and then chunked the ball out of bounds to stop

A field goal would win it and the kicking team came out but Lee McCasland never got his foot on the ball as Darrol Scott was in the Mustangs backfield practically with the ball and smothered the attempt. A flag fell to the ground and Bremond was signalled offsides and Wheeler got one more shot at victory and Sammy Zepeda came on to do the

It appeared that the kick could have been tipped but it floated over the crossbar by less than a foot and pandemonium broke out on the floor of the stadium.

This was a classic state championship football game. Bubba Smith set a new championship game rushing record in Class A as he rushed for 191 yards on 21 carries and crashed over from the 1 yard line to put the Mustangs in the position of going for the win or the tie and a co-championship. The choice was to go for broke and Smith's run came up a yard

With 5:26 to play in the game, the Tigers broke a 14 all tie when Tim Scott broke a tackle at the line of scrimmage and raced 90 yards to put Bremond up 21-14 but they didn't touch the ball again on offense.

The Mustangs started at their 29 and drove for their third touchdown and decision time in 9 plays with Smith doing the honors on his one yard leap on fourth down. A 21 yard pass from Bradstreet to Benson was a big play that put the ball on the Bremond 5 with a first and goal.

Wheeler got on the scoreboard first on their second possession of the game with an 11 play march that just covered 46 yards but the Mustangs had to overcome two procedure penalties in route. Benson swept left end from 8 yards out and McCasland booted the Mustangs into a 7-0 lead.

Right back came the Tigers to score after a short kickoff and a personal foul penalty against Wheeler. Charles Bailey ran off his right tackle from the 7 and the game was tied.

Trading touchdowns, the two teams went to the locker rooms at halftime all knotted at 14. Bremond took a 14-7 lead when the Tigers drove 69 yards and got the six pointer on a 3 yard Bo Robinson pass to Jeff Kasowski. Wheeler came back to counter and tie on a quick 6 play, 85 yard excursion. Smith got the drive started when he broke loose at right tackle, stiff armed a tackler near midfield and was finally hauled down on the Bremond 19.

Four running plays got to the 3 before Smith took an option pitch and scored standing up at right end. McCasland booted his second extra point and the score remained tied until the final quarter heroics.

As said earlier, this team of Mustangs never knew the words, give up or quit. They thought they could whip anybody and headed for this final game with this in mind and proved themselves with the miracle finish and there was no doubt who was champions as the Mustangs took turns holding the state championship trophy aloft for all to see!

Think Santa is bringing me fiddle strings and bows. Looks like Joe is goind to wear them out before I get a chance at them.



Billy Egley, on December 9, 1842, designed and offered for sale in England what is now regarded as the first Christmas card created for mass circulation. It is preserved in the British Museum. Billy was only 16 at the time.
