





A. Results at the Idaho Experi-mental Station indicate that hog lice of infestation of lice was reduced more in the DDT group than in those treated with rotenone, due probably to the higher residual effect of DDT. After the second treatment with DDT all pigs were free from lice, and in the rotenone group only one pig was slightly infested with lice.

Q. Do mites remain dormant poultry houses over the winter?

A. Yes, they do remain dormant in brooder houses, colony houses, and range shelters. These should be thoroughly cleaned in the spring, or the mites will cause a lot of trouble when the warm weather comes. vault or from any other place
