





Commissioners Will Share Equipment

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, March 14, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00, court convened to address the 12 items on the agenda.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted.

The court approved the payment of the hourly payroll time sheets as submitted.

The bills were approved for payment.

Action on the budget consisted of transferring \$208,000 from the General Road and Bridge fund; each county precinct received \$52,000 in their Road and Bridge fund. This money will be used for the purchase of equipment.

No action was taken on the burn ban. The ban remains in effect.

The court approved the software contract with Local Government Solutions for the County Clerk and District Clerk. The contract includes a monthly maintenance fee.

Precincts 1 and 2 requested permission from the court to advertise for bids to purchase a new, used or refurbished AWD motor grader. The request was approved.





Time Running Out For Amnesty Prog.

Of the 713,444 people who are eligible to participate in the Driver Responsibility Program amnesty, only 54,035 (about 7.5 percent of the total) have signed up so far. The amnesty program allows delinquent drivers to pay just 10 percent of the original amount owed on all surcharges combined, or a maximum of \$250.

Drivers are not required to make a payment when they sign up, however they must pay off all money owed by April 17 to retain their driving privileges. Eligible drivers have until April 7 to sign up for this program and must pay all surcharge amounts by April 17.

This one-time amnesty applies to drivers who had a surcharge assessed between Sept. 30, 2004, and Dec. 31, 2008, and are delinquent on those payments.

Once the online or telephone application is approved, the surcharge suspensions will be cleared on the applicant's driving record within three business days. After three business days, the applicant can review the reduced amount on line and begin making the necessary payments.


