The commissioners approved the monthly reports by the Justice of Peace, Pct. 1 and the County Tax Assessor.

At a previous meeting the court had approved a \$500 fee for the crossing of county roads for the placement of pipelines. A check of the law showed a misinterpretation of the law by the county; a fee cannot be charged if the crossing is made via boring. If road damage results from the boring, the pipeline company will be responsible.

Enbridge Pipelines (A Texas Gathering), L.P. requested permission to cross County Road B with an underground Utility and/ or pipeline crossing. Permission granted with a fee if the roadway is cut.

A maintenance agreement with Tascosa Office Machines for the Canon IR-505N copy machine was approved.

The court gave Tom Puryear permission to look into the purchase of a truck and trailer at a cost of over \$5,000.

Item #10: Consideration of resolution to make the Courthouse pet free except for service animals was tabled

Julian Torrez asked to be removed as Wheeler County Chief Deputy until personal matters could be "taken care of". Rowdy Clark was appointed temporary Chief Deputy for the County Sheriff's Department, effective May 24, 2010.

The court approved the adjustment (lowering) of rental fees for the Wheeler County AgriLife and Family Center. The adjusted rates can be found elsewhere in the paper. County Extension Agent Kenny Brdecko presented an income/loss tally for the seven months the facility has been in use. Income from the use of the facility totaled \$4,255.00; utilities amounted to \$4,503.67-\$248.67 above the income.

# Information On Renewable Energy

As the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Texas PUC or "PUCT") prepares to review 21 cases to build electric transmission lines between May and October, many Texas landowners want to know how the proposed power line routes may affect their properties.

"When an electricity company submits its preferred route for a new power line, many landowners may give sighs of relief," says Shawn St. Clair, partner at McGinnis, Lochridge & Kilgore, L.L.P., an Austin-based law firm that regularly represents clients before state administrative agencies including the Texas PUC. "But you can't assume your land won't be affected because you're not on the utility's preferred route. You could still wind up with a power line in your yard.

"Every application for a new transmission line is evaluated on many factors, including its environmental impact, the number of homes and businesses that are affected, the length and cost of the line, how it crosses private property and whether it makes good use of existing rights of way," says St. Clair.

As recently as late April, St. Clair and other attorneys have appeared before the PUCT and administrative law judges to present information and arguments about how power lines affect landowners' properties. In most cases, the PUCT selects a recommended route after a hearing; other times, the PUCT may tell the utility company to go back and present a new solution. The PUCT did just that in a recent LCRA case. The PUCT may also approve or modify the preferred route, or any of the alternative routes, described in the utility company's application to build a power line.

"Three new cases were filed at the Texas PUC during the first week in May, with almost a dozen more to be filed over the next three months," says St. Clair.

Landowners in nearly 50 counties are likely to be affected by the newly proposed transmission lines, including the counties of Archer, Armstrong, Borden, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collin, Collingsworth, Cottle, Crockett, Deaf Smith, Denton, Dickens, Donley, Ector, Fisher, Floyd, Foard, Glasscock, Gray, Hall, Hardeman, Haskell, (Continued Page 8)


