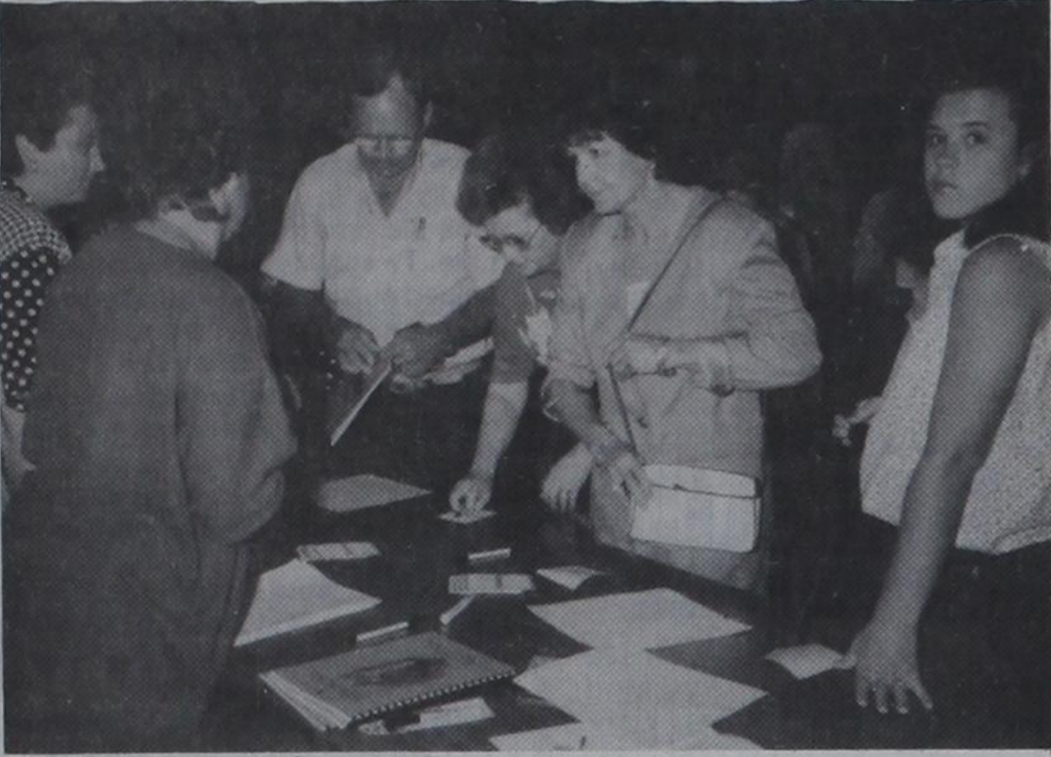

## 100TH MERIDIAN TO MAKE DEBUT

A news and advertising cooperative has recently been formed by the publishers of nine newspapers along the 100th Meridian, the line that separates Texas and Oklahoma in the Panhandle, and will be distributed in *The Wheeler Times* beginning next week.

The purpose of this new addition is to combine the paid circulation of nine newspapers in order to spread advertisements over a larger area for less money. Consequently, the advertiser will see better return on his or her advertising dollar.

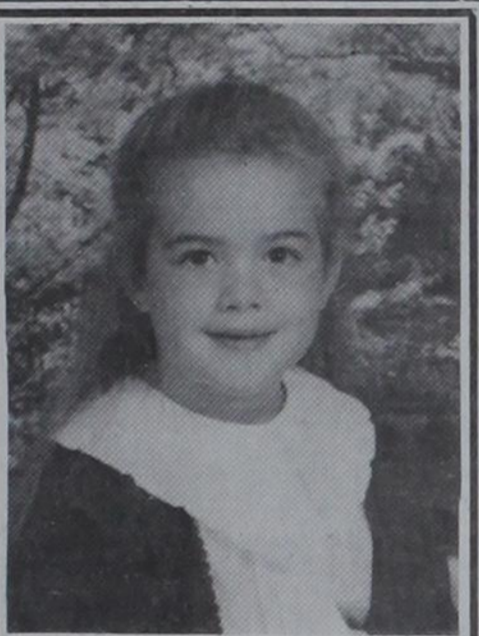

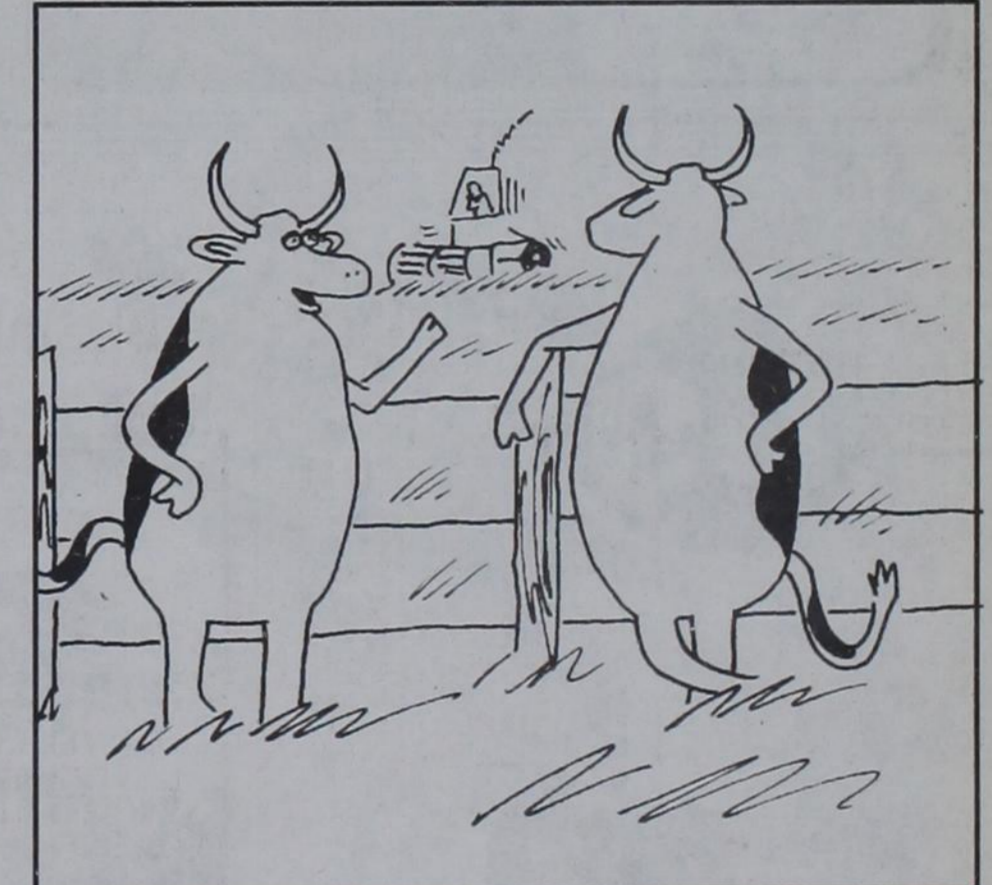

## Wheeler Church of Christ

**Congregational Concerns:**  
On this coming Sunday, June 20th, a fellowship luncheon will be held in the multi-purpose building at the conclusion of the morning worship service. This fellowship luncheon will honor the men of this congregation. Sympathy must be expressed to Don Whiteley upon the death of his mother, Mrs. Kansas Whiteley. Her funeral was held last Thursday afternoon in Wheeler.  
Ardie Martin is hospitalized in the local hospital. Her condition is slowly improving.

**From the Minister's Desk:**  
As a young minister, I served for several sessions as a Bible teacher at a summer youth camp which was located near San Antonio. During one of these sessions a young girl made a statement that literally changed the nature of my ministry. Her statement was: "I have committed some terrible sins. I am sure I have committed the unpardonable sin. I am sure that God can never forgive me."  
Like most young ministers, my teaching and preaching had emphasized the two new Testaments truths. The two truths were the reality of sin and seriousness of sin. But this young girl's statement caused me to do some serious study of the new Testament, asking: "While the New Testament teaches the reality of sin and the seriousness of sin, does it teach that sin can become unpardonable?"  
From this study of the New Testament I learned three important truths. These three truths are:  
1. The New Testament teaches that people are saved by the grace of God. Ephesians 2:8-9 says: "--By grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, that no one should boast. "As this text clearly shows, people are not saved by their attainment, but by the grace of God.  
2. The New Testament teaches that there is a limit to the grace of God. Matthew 12: 31-32 records that Jesus said: "--I say to you, any sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven men, but blasphemy against the Spirit shall not be forgiven. And whoever shall speak a word against the Son of Man, it shall be forgiven him; but whoever shall speak against the Holy Spirit, it shall not be forgiven him, either in this age or in the age to come." With these lucid statements, Jesus Christ, who was God's substitutionary atonement for the sins of people emphasized that there was a limit to the grace of God.  
3. The New Testament teaches that the grace of God is limited by the unwillingness of people to repent not by God's willingness to forgive. Hebrews 6:4-6 says: "For in the case of those who have once been enlightened and have tasted of the heavenly gift and have been made partakers of the Holy Spirit, and have tasted the good word of God and the powers of the age to come, and then have fallen away, it is impossible to renew them again to repentance, since they again crucify to themselves the son of God, and put him to open shame." It is not impossible for God to forgive the sins of people, but "--it is impossible to renew--" some people "--to repentance--" And since these people refuse to repent the forgiveness of their sins it is impossible.  
I will always be indebted to a little girl who attended a summer camp session where I was a Bible teacher. Because of some statements about the sins of her life, I restudied what the new testament teaches about sin. And this study changed the nature of my ministry. I still teach the reality of sin and the seriousness of sin. But I also teach that sin--any sin--can be forgiven by the grace of God if people are willing to repent and to accept the grace of God.
