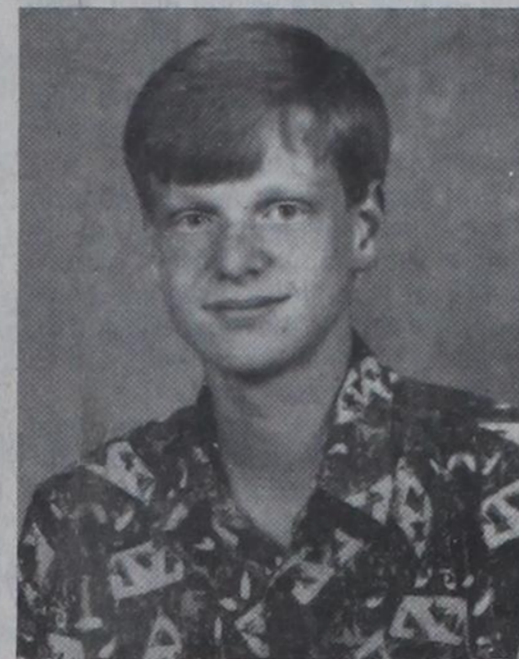

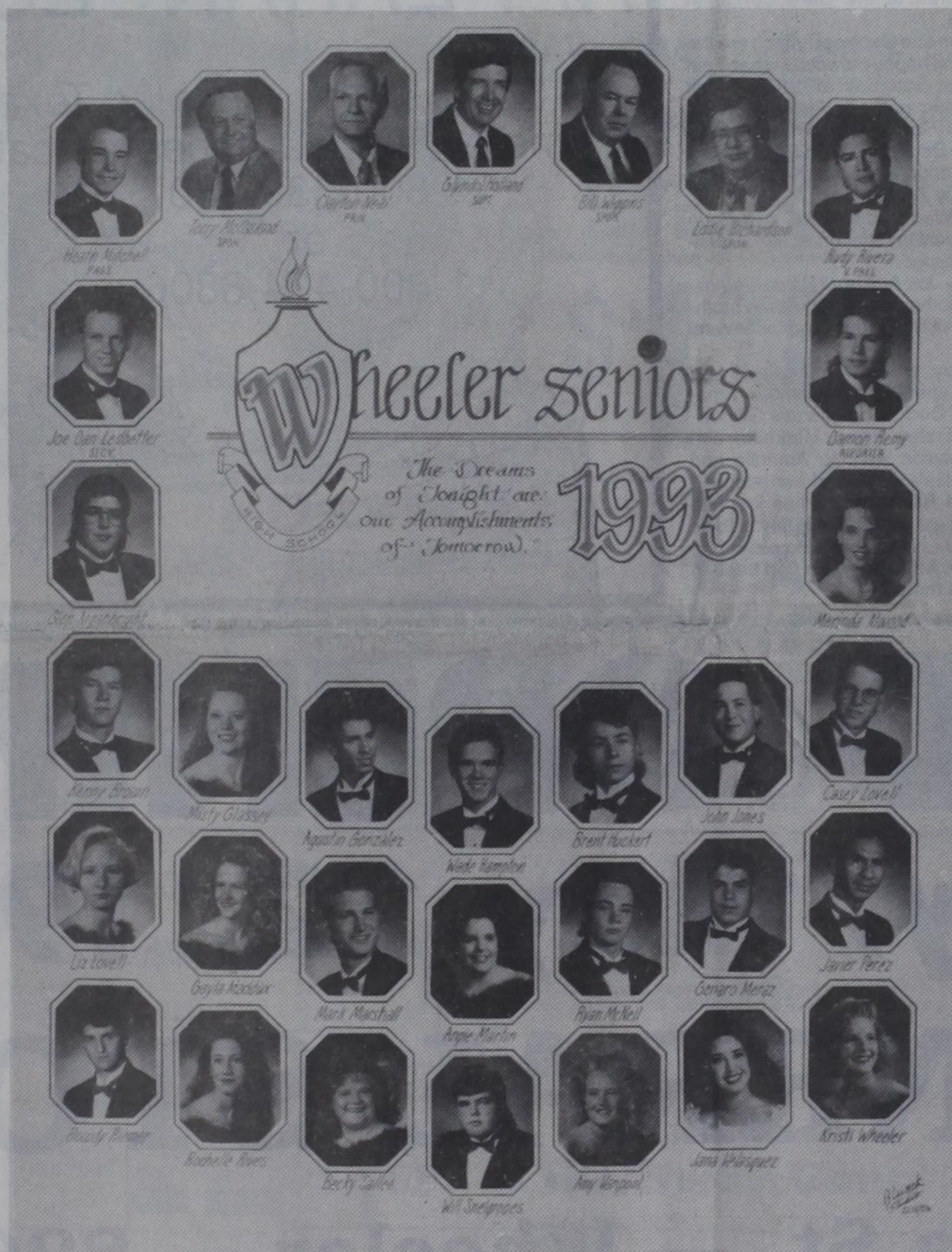

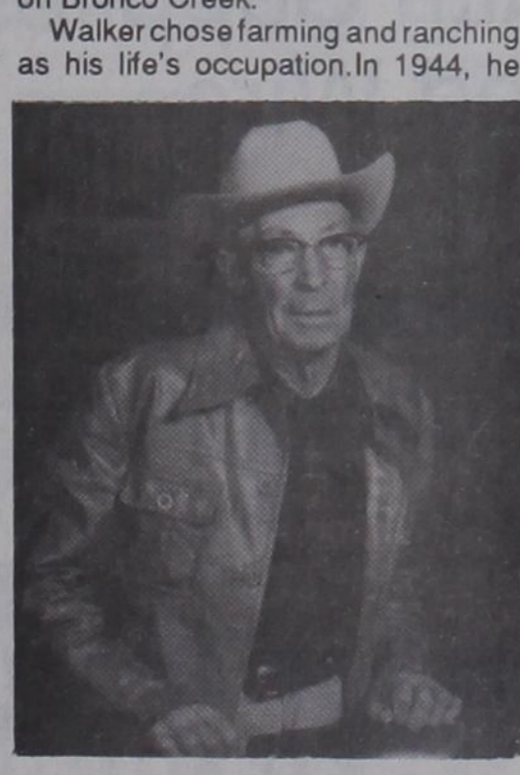


M. W. "Bus" Walker Buried Wednesday, May 20

Funeral services for M. W. "Bus" Walker were held Wednesday, May 19, 1993, at the First Baptist church of Wheeler. The Rev. Max Baird, pastor of the first Baptist church at Kelton and the Robert Helsley, local pastor, officiated.

Mr. Walker died Sunday, May 16. Born in a log cabin to Edwin Albyon and Sarah Emmaline Reed Walker on January 8, 1909 in Bonita, Montague county Texas, Bus moved to Wheeler county in 1916 with the family possessions in a covered wagon. The homestead was located at the southeast edge of Wheeler's present city limits, known as the Templeton place. This piece of property was quickly traded for a quarter two miles east of Wheeler.

A second trade put the family on the place Bus lived at the time of his death, 5 miles southeast of Wheeler on Bronco Creek. Walker chose farming and ranching as his life's occupation. In 1944, he

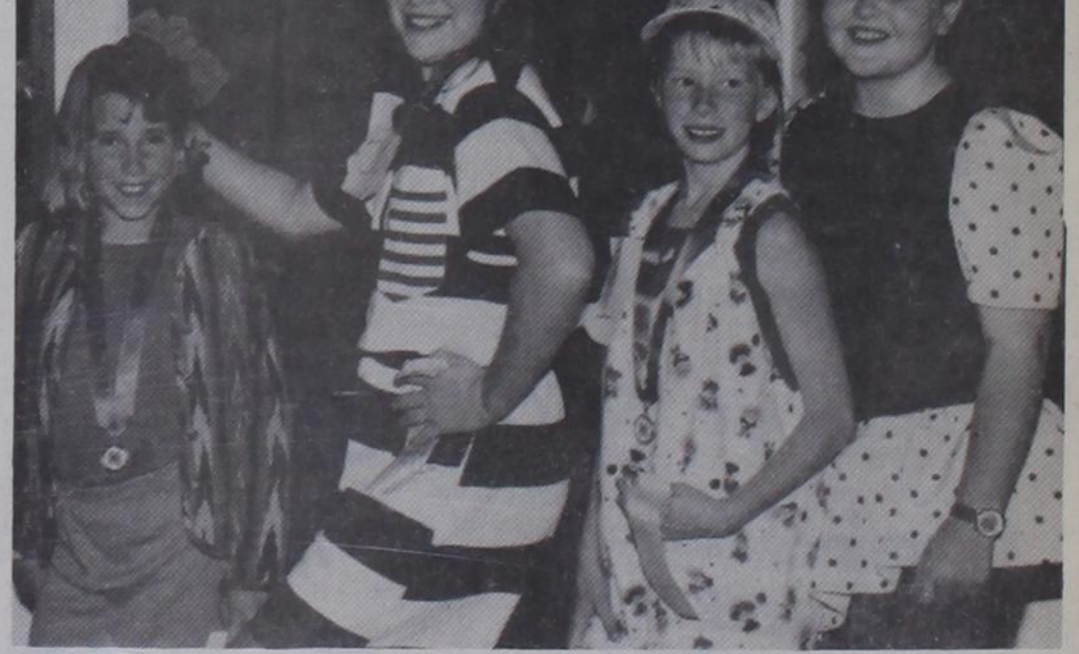
Jennifer is the daughter of Buster and Debbie Haning.
