The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, November 22, 2010, at 9:20 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. the agenda was addressed and necessary action taken.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment as presented.

The bills were approved for payment.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was taken on the Burn Ban. An agricultural burn remains in effect.

No monthly reports were turned in.

No equipment purchases were considered.

Scott Porter, Tax Assessor, presented the contract with Southwest Data for the maintenance of software. The contract was approved at a cost of \$1102.50 per month; the contract is from 10-1-10 to 9-30-11.

## RIFLE PRACTICE IN THE COURTHOUSE

When I was a teenager, the 4-H Club in Wheeler, was very strong, mostly due to our county agent, Ray Siegmund.

Ray seemed to get the very best out of everyone. During his five or six years here, he had all kinds of teams; land judging, crop judging, range judging, dairy judging, rifle teams, and others that I can't even remember. He'd arrange to take us to contests with the help of a few other local men. Most of the contests were in the panhandle area, except for the State 4-H Roundup, at Texas A&M each summer, which would last for two weeks. The winners of different areas in the state would go there and compete for "State Championship" titles.

One year, Junior and Gene Haddock, from Briscoe, were "State Champions" in Dairy Judging teams. They also placed first and second, high individuals. That particular year, our rifle team placed about fourth or fifth; not as good as we'd hoped, but respectable.

Like all the other teams, our rifle team practiced at least twice a week here at home. For a year or two, there was a man named, Tony Wilker, who worked as a soils scientist, for the Soil Conservation Service. He happened to be a national-ranked, indoor, 50 ft. competitor. Ray asked him to come and help coach us. With his help, we made a lot of improvement.

In the summer, we practiced in a barn of some sort that the city owned, but it was awfully cold in the winter. Ray's office was in the basement of the courthouse, and somehow, he got permission for us to set up our range in the hallway of the basement. I'm sure he had his neck stuck out a mile, just for us to be able to do that. He told us, "Don't any of you ever miss the bullet trap, or we'll be back out in the cold, again!" That fact was a good incentive to hit the target, plus, we appreciated what Ray was doing for us.

The bullet traps were a steel box that had about a twelve by eighteen inch front and a spiraled back end that would stop the bullet safely. The front, had paper clips that would hold a paper target.

Each team member had a particular rifle assigned to him. We were responsible for keeping it clean and in good working order. The ones of us that lived in the country, could even practice a little at home.

courthouse with rifles, I never heard about it. The Sheriff at that time was Bus Dorman, and I'm sure he told them what was going on there. He knew all of us boys and he also knew Ray would keep us on the straight and narrow.

Nowadays, the odds of having rifle practice in the courthouse, are slim to none. Times do change....

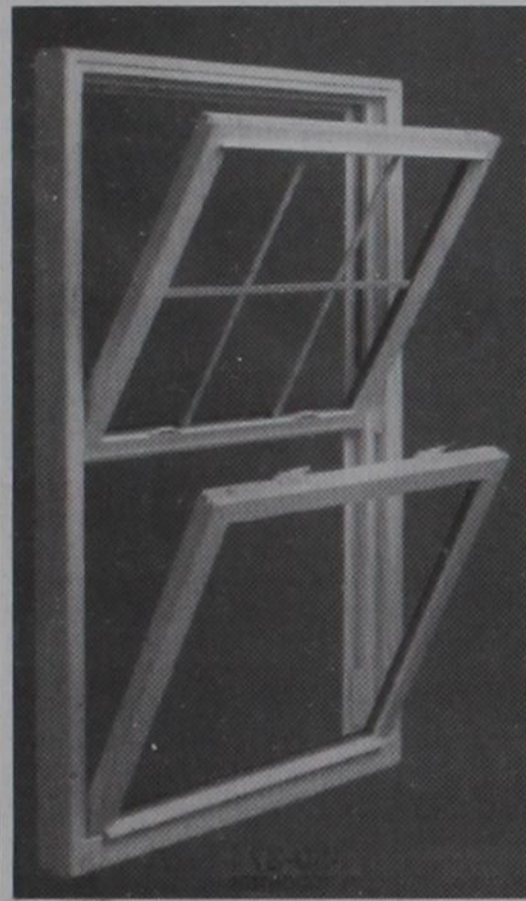

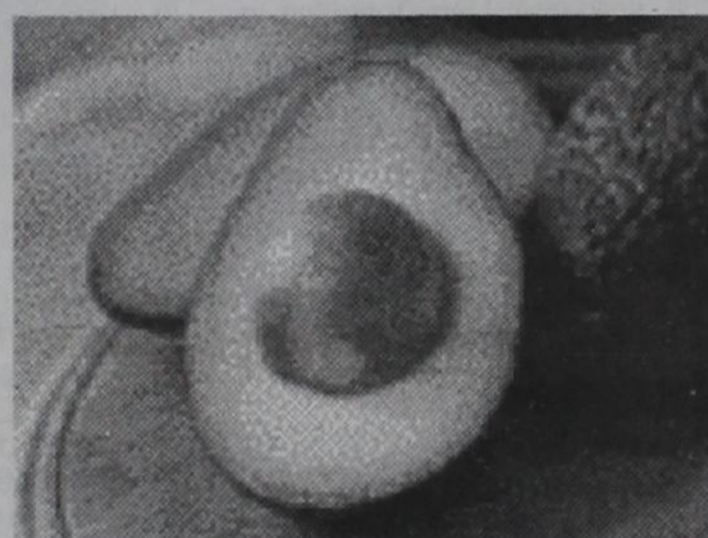

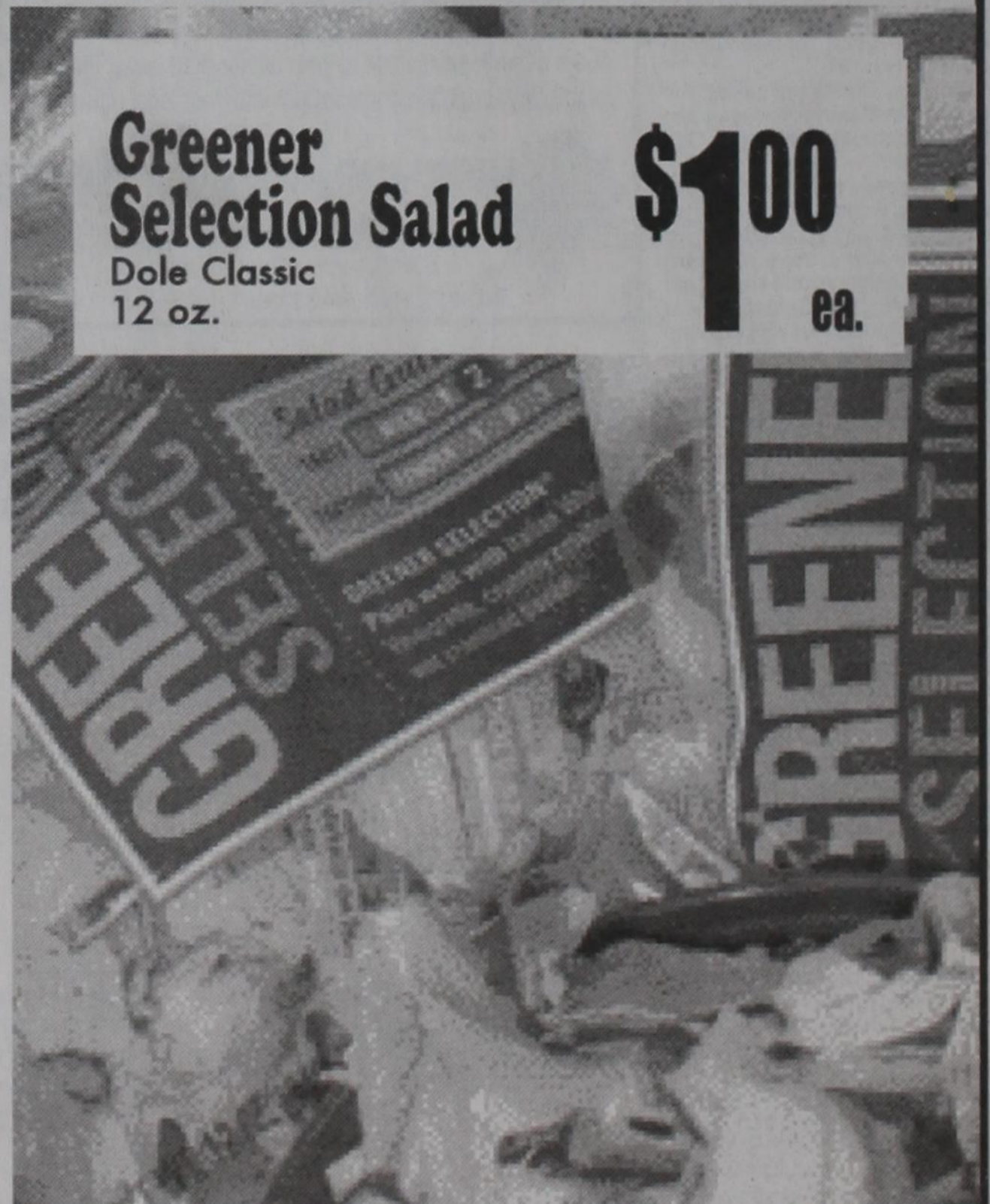
