been. Thank goodness this tank wuz empty and lopened the valve and got all of a sudden I saw this buddy runnin
and as Ilooked high in the trees I saw
and and as Ilooked high in the trees I saw
why. The tall trees nearby sort of
exploded. It is called a crownover and very dangerous to fire fighter.
Many fiks don't realize that they
too may become a firefighter instead
of gawkers with their cars parked in the wrong place and maybe their kids ewin and dwin standin there in the way
of the folks that are tryin to contain the fire. I have seen many folks called to
fight that really didn'tintend to get their duds dirty and smutty nor their shoes
skinned up. Many times I have asked skinned up. Many times thave asked
folks to get off the line as they had pollyester or other very flamable
clothes on. When this type of clothing gets to burnin you can hardly get it off quite disfigured or killed.
Some of the best firefighters I have
ever worked with are high school kids. ever worked with are high school kids.
They usually listen and work. Many
times I have had a crew of these folks and we would work hours on end with oone foot in the black and one in the
fire. This is puttin out the fire in the pine needles and pine cones. Very impor-
tant part of firef efightin and oft timesthis kind of fire will creep along till it finally
gets into higher brush and become another big blaze.
One time there in New Mexicol was ne of the fire crew and had come
pon a place where there wuz still a bit upon a place where there wuz still a bit
of smoke comin from a small area. It
had an Indian pack as it wuz called. It had an Indian pack as it wuz called. It
