



KENT SIMS SEEKS ANNOUNCES CANDIDACY FOR RE-ELECTION TO OFFICE OFDIST. JUDGE

Judge M. Kent Sims, 31st Judicial District Judge, a lifelong resident of Wheeler County has announced his candidacy for re-election to the office of District Judge, subject to the Democratic primary in March.

Judge Sims has served as 31st District Judge since being elected in 1990 and states that "I have worked diligently for the past three years attending to the many diverse issues brought to my court. These controversies have involved private individuals, corporations, state government, criminal matters and individual rights as well as public policy. Through out all of these, my efforts have been to follow the law and merit the trust you have placed in me." As well as handling the controversies through court cases Sims points out that the many administrative duties of a District Judge, such as serving on five juvenile boards, being chairman of the adult probation departments, appointing county auditors and other duties have kept him extremely busy while not on the bench. Judge Sims has also received State

recognition from his peers, being selected to serve as a faculty member of the College for new Judges for the State of Texas in 1992 and 1993. After receiving his Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from Texas Tech University in 1969, he then received his Doctor of Jurisprudence Degree from Tech in May 1972, set up his office in Wheeler, and continued to practice locally until being elected to the bench.

Judge Sims is active in civic and church activities, having served as President of the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce, President of Wheeler Kiwanis lub and is very active in all aspects of the United Methodist

Christmas! It comes every year, and for me there has been almost 100 of them. I've enjoyed everyone of them. If my husband were still with me he would say, "You still believe in Santa Claus." Why not?

But Christmases now are quite different to what they were early in the 20th century. I mean the physical difference. The thing that prompts the celebration is the same-the birthday of Christ-the physical birth. I think the first Christmas song I remember is "Away In A Manger". The next must have been "Silent night". We still use them and love them.

but some of the physical celebration has certainly changed. My family lived on a very flat plane in the middle of the Texas Panhandle, about halfway between Lubbock and Plainview. there were no trees, except planted ones, which were few, for hundreds of miles. you didn't look to the east or west, north or south to see your neighbors trees-there were no neighbors close enough. I can't remember the planting of our trees, but before I was a teenager we had a yard and orchard full-mulberry, black walnut, apricots in the yard. The fruit trees were in the orchard. What sis we do for a Christmas tree? We usually didn't have one. If a tree happened to have a dead branch we were allowed to cut it off, somehow prop it in the corner of the room and decorate it with popped corn, crepe paper and a few bobbles. (I still have a few of those bobbles that my mother used. Now that bush (tree) wouldn't hold many gifts. but we didn't have many gifts. (We had a few candle chips, which held small candles. We had to be very cautious when they were lighted some adult was right there watching to see that no fire started. (Lighted candles sure were not kid stuff.) As I said, we had few gifts. Usually after we youngsters were sleep chairs were placed by our beds and gifts were placed on a chair for the person sleeping there. But they were just as much fun and appreciated more than they are in modern times. As far back as I can remember we had a church in our community. It might be sponsored by Methodist or Baptist or any other, but everybody went to the same church at Christmas time. We always had a program and gifts giving and Santa Claus at the church. Where did we get the tree? Usually 2 or 3 devoted men of the neighborhood would take a wagon and team and tools and drive to the "breaks" almost 100 miles away and get a cedar tree. If there bappened to be a dead tree in someones orchard, they would donate it for the occasion. The men built a framework to hold it up. "That's not counting some books kept by department personnel and any harvest during the late archery season, which runs through the 6,593-a slight increase over last end of the year," he said.

Three basic problems beset male n relationship to their prostate. The irst is prostatitis. This is a low-grade infection or inflammation of th prostate. Almost always, it is readily ontrolled by any one of the anibiotics now available.

WASHINGTON (AP) - U.S. farmers' net cash income for 1994 is expected to range between \$55 billion and \$62 billion, compared with the \$59 billion forecast for 1993.

The Agriculture Department's Economic Research Service said, however, the net farm income should rebound from its 1993 drop.

"The structure and composition of farming through the rest of the decade is expected to be similar to that of today,' the agency said in a situation and outlook summary on agricultural income and finance.

"Off-farm sources will continue to provide the major portion of the average household's income,' the report said.

Receipts for all crops, except cotton and tobacco, are expected to rise in 1994, it said. Feed grain receipts, led by corn, also are forecast to rise.

Total receipts for livestock may fall slightly, the report said. Red-meat receipts are expected to be steady to slightly higher.

After dropping in 1992, red meat prices recovered in 1993. For 1994, cattle prices could fall slightly, but hog prices are forecast

Milk prices are forecast down nearly \$1 per hundred pounds for 1994, expected increase in production.


A few well-placed rows or clumps of trees can mean money to cattlemen. The use of trees as windbreaks can reduce the chilling effects of winter winds and stress factors on cattle. Cattle protected by windbreaks will have an average gain of 35 pounds per animal during a mild winter and lose 10 pounds less per animal during a severe winter. This is because the windbreaks reduce air flow and allow the cattle greater efficiency in converting feed to weight

gain. Cattlemen in Western Oklahoma say unprotected herds lose 50 to 70 pounds per head during severe

winters. Another important function of a well-placed windbreak is its ability to prevent snow from blocking the many lanes, roadways, feed bunks, sorting and working areas, feed storage areas, and in general, the entire area where tractors, trucks and other machinery must be able to operate seven days a week.

When cattle are not protected from blowing and drifting snow, it is sometimes impossible to get the proper daily feed ration to the animals. This too, can add to the lost weight gains and resulting economic loss in unprotected cattle.

Oklahoma residents can obtain low-cost tree and shrub seedlings for establishing and maintaining windbreaks and other conservation plantings in the state. DALLAS (AP) — Texas A&M scientists think they have taken an important first step toward countering aphids that have been causing extensive damage to the state's pecan crop.

Texas pecan production, valued at about \$39 million annually, occurs in most regions of the state and represents 20 percent of the nation's total pecan crop, second only to Georgia.

But in Georgia, the aphids are kept in check by large numbers of ladybugs who feed on them.

If it's good enough for Georgia, it's good enough for Texas, at least in this case.

Texas A&M entomologists Allen Knutson and Bill Ree made a trip to Georgia last month and collected 12,000 ladybugs, occur on warm, sunny days, formally known as Harmonia lady beetles, to bring back to Texas via commercial airplane.

The ladybugs will hibernate in refrigerators, 1,000 per carton, at the Texas A&M Agricultural Research and Extension Center in Dallas until their release next spring to feed on aphids that attack pecans.





----changes proposed for beef industry

PHOENIX-The Long Range Planning Task Force, appointed by the four national organizations representing the United States beef industry, announced Dec. 10, findings and recommendations from its 10-month study of industry challenges and opportunities.

"The U.S. beef industry has, for too long, been focused inwardly," said Rob Adams of Chicago, chairman of the task force. "We have been productiondriven, not consumer-driven," he said. "We have demonstrated neither the ability nor the inclination to respond adequately to consumer signals in the marketplace. This task force was charged with developing a long-range plan and structure for the industry that will resources in order to help achieve desired outcomes. enable us to better meet consumer demands and expectations."

A key part of the plan is a set of eight leverage points that will require specific actions in order to formation of a new unified industry organization that will be lean, responsive and efficient and will maximize the industry's ability to address the leverage points.

"Developing this plan required that we fairly and nonestly identify and assess current challenges facing he beef industy, as well as opportunities for growth," Adams said. "It also demands that we make recommendations to ensure the most effective and efficient se of human and financial resources in the future."

The plan's leverage points are: Beef Quality and Consistency-Reducing consumer dissatisfaction and increasing the amount of branded,

case-ready beet. Domestic Marketing-Improving consumer price and value perceptions and stopping the decline in the market share of beef.

International Marketing-Issue Management-Managing disruptive issues and speaking with one voice

on government and other issues. Public Relations-Presenting a postive image of cattlemen and incrasing consumer confidence in beet.

Production Efficiency-Making beef more pricecompetitive

Producer/Packer Alliances-Increasing cooperation with packers.

Strategic Alliances-Developing efficiency-improving arrangements among two or more businesses in the production chain.

"When you look at what has happened to beef compared to its competition, the need for change is even more dramatic," Adams said. "In the past 10 years, the average amount of all meat consumed per person per year increased 20 pounds, but beef's share of the total dropped 10 pounds. Average spending per person for all meat increased nearly 20 percent, but beef spending increased only 2 percent—or much less than the rate of inflation. On a per capita basis, the amount of money spent on poultry increased nearly 100 percent. Pork, an increasingly tough competitor, experienced an increase of 25 percent. The pork industry has declared that pork will be the "meat of choice" slew of films. He writes poetry, reads n the year 2000.

Reasons for beef's slippage include inadequate and neonsistent quality, lack of product development and nnovation, the public's dict-health and environmental concerns, attacks by activists and critics, ill-advised government laws and regulations, and beef's lagging rate of efficiency improvement.

Problems within the industry included an "island mentality" and adversarial relationship among industry segments, hurting the industry's ability to focus on consumers.

The checkoff-funded task force's charter was to develop a long-range strategic plan focusing on domestic marketing, interantional marketing, issues management, efficient and effective use of industry resources and industry governance.

The task force concluded that the current organizational structure presents numerous impediments to over- holidays are over. Some will move in all success of the industry:

with mesurable objectives and results;


The Task Force analyzed the current industry organizations and found that they did not include the structural criteria of focus, coordination, control and cost effectsiveness necessary to achieve "outcomes," or objectives, in the plan.

One goal would be to take out waste and overlap, achieve desired results. Another recommendation is the cut down on bureaucracy, reduce overhead and improve efficiency and effectiveness. The industry would speak with just one voice; it would have one clearly defined plan of action, with measurable objectives; and accoun-The unified organization would handle the functions tability for results would be clear.

Adams said that beef's total share of consumer organizations—the Beef Industry Council of the Meat spending for red meat and poultry had dropped from almost 60 percent in 1980, to less than 50 percent in 1992. "This represents a decrease of \$9 billion at the retail level and \$5 billion per year at the producer level—an amount equal to \$200 per fed animal with current numbers marketed.



We cannot compete effectively unless we also restructure, unify our efforts and get more bang for every buck going into organizations and programs.

Arsonist blamed for deaths of racehorses

LUBBOCK (AP)-Someone deliberately set the fire at Lubbock Downs on Nov. 30 in which eight quarterhorses burned to death, fire officials say.

"The state fire marshal's office has concluded its preliminary report, and the evidence points to arson," Lubbock County Sheriff's Capt. Bill Drewell said.

"Evidence found during and after the fire, and then later examined, points to the fact that some sort of flammable material was used to ignite the fire in the barn."

Drewell said several pieces of burned rags were found at the scene.

The horses were trapped inside the flaming barn while firefighters from the volunteer fire department in the nearby community of Woodrow, 10 miles south of Lubbock, battled the nighttime blaze.







WASHINGTON (AP)-The 1993 U.S. cotton harvest has progressed ahead of schedule and is complete or nearly complete in all states, according to the Agriculture Department's Economic Research Service.

As of Nov. 28, it said, 92 percent of the cotton crop was harvested, compared with 83 percent last year and a five-year average of 85 percent.

States nearing completion include New Mexico, 79 percent complete; Texas, 83 percent; and Oklahoma, 85 percent. They were well ahead of their averages.

Before Dec. 1, there were 13.6 million bales of cotton that had been ginned, up from 12.9 million bales in 1992.

The 1993 crop is estimated at 6.3 million bales. Based on that estimate, 83 percent of the crop has been ginned, compared with 80 percent in 1992, the report said.

Cotton consumption for the first three months of the season totaled 2.67 million bales, and mill use was expected to reach 2.79 million bales by the end of October.

"Since August-October consumption is below the seasonal expectations, mill use will have to strengthen in the coming months to reach the current 1993-94


