The Wheeler County Soil and Water Conservation District will be taking tree orders from now through February 25, 2011. Trees will be available for pick up towards the end of March 2011.

Bare root species available are Bur Oak, Chinkapin Oak, Green Ash and Shumard Oak. They are sold in multiples of 25 only and priced at \$40 each.

Plastic containerized species available are Austrian Pine, Eastern Red Cedar, Pinyon Pine, Fourwing Saltbush and Lacebark Elm. They are sold in multiples of 30 and priced at \$60 each.

Paper containerized species available are Arborvitae, Austrian Pine, Colorado Blue Spruce, Eastern Red Cedar, Pinyon Pine, Rocky Mountain Juniper, Lacebark Elm and Lilac. They are sold in multiples of 30 for \$75 each.

Wildlife packets for squirrel, deer, quail and pheasant are also available at \$110 each. Each packet includes 25 seedlings per species. Squirrel packets include Shumard Oak, Chinkapin Oak, Black Cherry, and Sawtooth Oak. Deer packets include Bur Oak, Hackberry, Fourwing, and Flameleaf Sumac. Quail and Pheasant packets include

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

GREAT "CROW" BOMBING

I've mentioned before, every fall the crows would migrate here and spend the winter. They didn't have a clue that they weren't welcome and plans were being made to give them... a big send off!

Naturally, farmers really wanted to get rid of these crop marauders and the sooner, the better! Crows, were destroying maize fields on a big scale by breaking down the stalks and eating the maize heads. The cotton fields were ravaged by pulling cotton out of opened bolls to get at the seeds to eat, and they were ruining watermelon and cantaloupe crops earlier on. Not good for a farmer's income!

Some folks got together and came up with a solution. Because crows roost in huge numbers in shinnery patches, it would be easy to bomb them, once they were all settled down for the night in one of these spots.

Most of the kids at school were excited about the idea of a "crow bombing." Football season had come and gone, so I was really craving some excitement. Jerry Henderson, asked me if I could spend Friday night with him and then we could all go to the crow bombing together. My folks agreed to let me go; so that evening, Jerry, his brother Larry, and I got off the bus at their house.

The garage doors happened to be open, so we just started through the garage toward the kitchen door. As we passed by his step-dad's pickup that was parked there inside, Jerry stopped. Then he said, "Let me show you Bus' new .22 pump rifle." He reached in behind the seat and pulled it out, then took it out of the felt gun-

sack that it was in and handed it to me. Wow! That was sure a nice rifle. Jerry and I both had a .22 pump, but not nearly as nice as this one.

Doing what most any gun lover would do, I looked it over, side to side and then I pulled the hand grip that works the slide and it threw out a live shell. Jerry picked it up off of the floor and told me, "I'd better put this shell back in the magazine; we're not supposed to be messin' with Bus' gun." He took back the gun and started raising up the magazine. I'd forgotten to un-cock the hammer and so did Jerry. Just as he was lifting up the magazine, the gun went off. The bullet went through three of his fingers and into the sheetrock ceiling sideways.

Jerry grabbed his fingers with his other hand and was kind of 'hopping' around the garage. He started to go into the house, but Larry told him "Wait, I've got to put the gun back in the pickup!" He seemed to be taking a lot of time to do this, but the problem Larry had, was that the felt gun sack had holes worn in the sides, and the barrel kept going through the holes. (Stuff like this always happens when you're in a hurry)... He finally got the gun put back in the pickup and we went in the house, quietly...

Their mom was fixing supper and it sure was smelling good in there: if only we didn't have this problem. Since she was busy, she hadn't turned around when we came in. Larry said, "Mom, Jerry just shot his fingers." She turned around facing us, and all she said was, "Well, AJerry David Henderson, I told you not to be

messin' with that gun!" (She thought it was his gun that he had shot his fingers with). We sure weren't going to tell her any different. She poured some alcohol on his fingers and gave him a rag to wrap them up with. Then she went back to fixing supper again and remarked, "Bus will be here in a few minutes and he'll take you to see Doc Walker."

Sure enough, in about ten minutes, Bus got home and with 'little' information given by any of us, we loaded up into his pickup and went to town.

Doc Walker, told Jerry that the bullet went through the joint of one finger, so it would be stiff from then on. The others would be alright. Back to their house we headed...supper time.

After supper, we went to the crow bombing, but it turned out to be a dud. The dynamite didn't explode for some reason that I never knew. Whatever the problem, it got fixed, because the following week the planned bombing went off without a hitch. The dynamite set off the barrels of drip gas that had been placed in the shinnery patches where the crows roosted.

That ball of fire must have been 200 feet tall, killing thousands of crows outright and burned the feathers off of hundreds more. People that came to witness this, did what was needed to the ones that were injured, but many got away. The next day, you could see naked crows five miles from there. I guess they had hopped all night long. Coyotes had easy picking's for a while and it was the start of "fighting back" for many farmers.

After two or three times of having these events, the Humane Society got it stopped and that was the end of the crow bombings. Thankfully, the crows were never again the big problem they had been before. I'm convinced, they got the message...

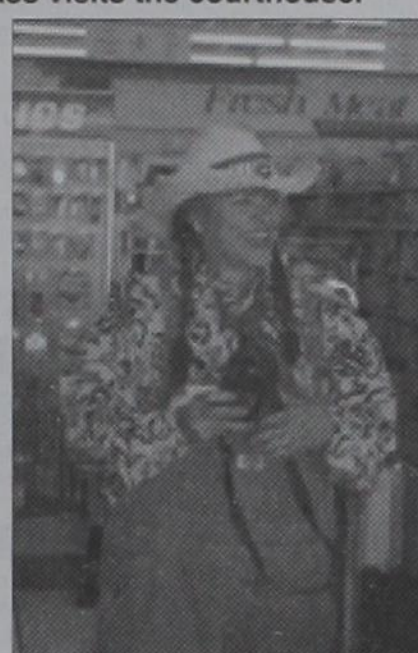

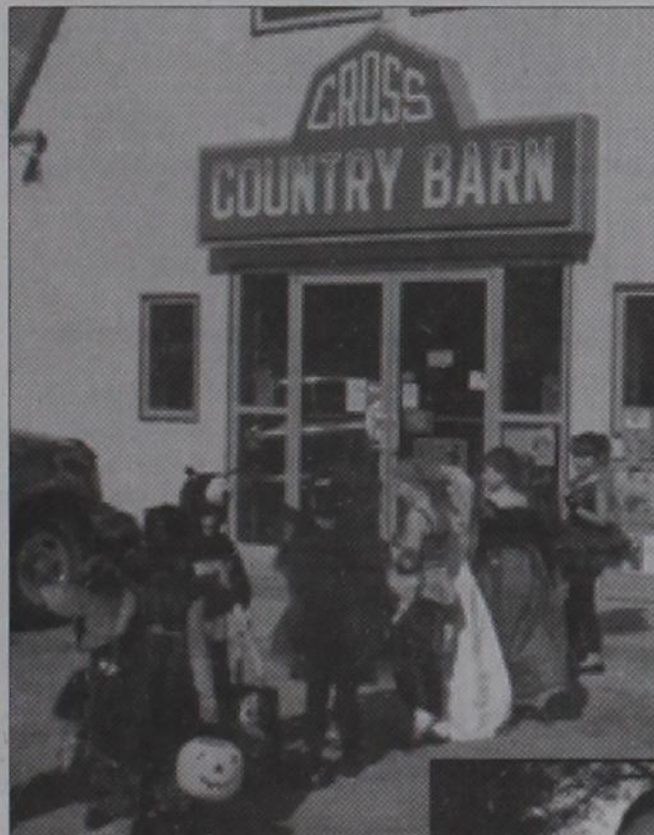

So what do you do when u see someone in distress?
Remember old-fashioned CPR? You were supposed to clear the airway, push on the chest, give mouth-to-mouth breaths, and check for a pulse every once in a while. The procedure has been streamlined for cases when a person suddenly collapses and has no pulse or heartbeat. In this situation, the American Heart Association says to forgo airway clearing, breaths, and pulse checks and just concentrate on pushing on the chest—a procedure called "hands only" CPR. Even if you've never taken a CPR class in your life, if you see someone suddenly collapse, the heart association says to call 911 and then start pushing hard and fast on the person's breastbone—100 times a minute—until emergency medical technicians or paramedics arrive. It's also important to have someone go get an automated external defibrillator (AED) if one is nearby so you can attempt to shock the heart back into a normal rhythm. Administering hands-only CPR before professional help arrives is just as effective as traditional CPR at helping someone survive a sudden shutdown of the heart. People with "noncardiac" arrest, which usually means they had breathing problems before their hearts went haywire, benefit from traditional CPR.

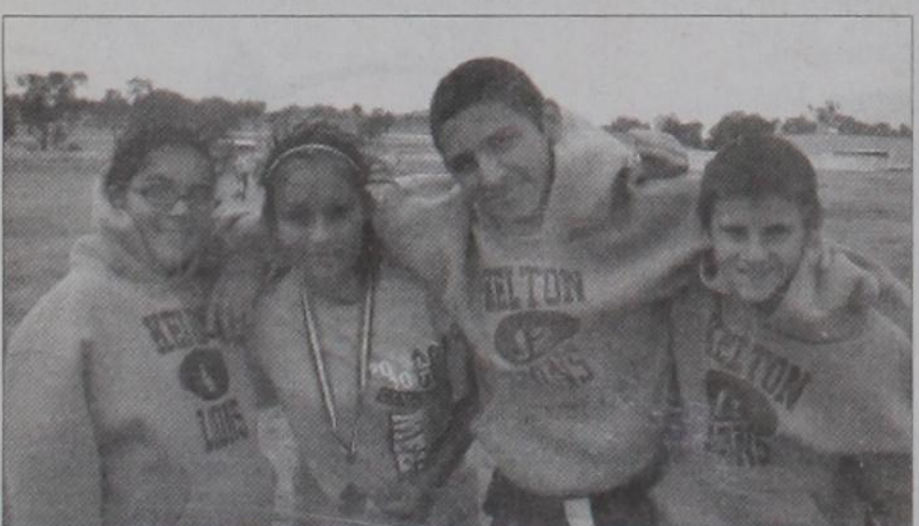

Responding To Stress

According to the American Psychiatric Association "one-third of Americans are living with extreme stress, and nearly half of Americans (48 percent) believe that their stress has increased over the past five years. Stress is taking a toll on people—contributing to health problems, poor relation-

ships, and lost productivity at work." Some short-term stress can be positive—causing us to deal constructively with daily problems or meet challenges or deadlines. But, when stress remains long-term—chronically or continuously—it can be damaging both emotionally and physically.

When we become stressed, it's like an alarm goes off in the brain, and our body prepares to deal with the stress by going into a biological "fight or flight" response. The nervous system is aroused, and hormones are released to sharpen the senses, quicken the pulse, deepen respiration, and tense the muscles. This response is positive when it helps us defend

ships, and lost productivity at work." Some short-term stress can be positive—causing us to deal constructively with daily problems or meet challenges or deadlines. But, when stress remains long-term—chronically or continuously—it can be damaging both emotionally and physically.

When we become stressed, it's like an alarm goes off in the brain, and our body prepares to deal with the stress by going into a biological "fight or flight" response. The nervous system is aroused, and hormones are released to sharpen the senses, quicken the pulse, deepen respiration, and tense the muscles. This response is positive when it helps us defend

against threatening situations. When stressful situations go unresolved, however, the body is kept in a constant state of activation, which increases the rate of wear and tear to biological systems. Ultimately, fatigue or damage results, and the ability of the body to repair and defend itself can become seriously compromised. As a result, the risk of injury or disease escalates.

So what can be done about stress in our lives? First, we need to identify what is causing the stress. Take time to really think about what causes your stress. If it is shopping with your spouse or going to an office party, you may be able to just choose not to participate (of course, with your spouse, this requires communication, but you may be able to say "no thank you" to the occasional office gathering). Think about whether your stressors are:

- major or minor (e.g., lost keys or lost job),
- temporary or permanent (e.g., giving a speech or a poor marriage relationship),
- relational (e.g., uncomfortable living situation or stressful work relationship), or
- internal (e.g., unrealistic expectations, perfectionistic or pessimistic attitude, or low self-esteem or self criticism).

Once you identify the cause(s), it may be easier to choose strategies to help alleviate the stress. Below are four approaches that may help.

Emergency Stress Stoppers

When you need to deal with stress on the spot, try these strategies: count to 10 before you speak; take 3-5 slow, deep breaths; go for a walk; walk away from the situation and say you'll handle it later; say "I'm sorry" if you make a mistake; drive in the slower lane or avoid busy roads (if possible) to stay calm while driving; and begin the day by breaking bigger problems down into smaller ones.

Wellness Approach

The healthier you are, the better able you are to manage stress. Try to get 30 minutes of exercise most days of the week. Exercise not only helps you get in shape, but it also helps you relieve pent up tension, sleep better, and burn up some of the chemicals that are released with the bodily response to stress.

Get enough sleep. Not getting enough sleep increases stress and can make you less able to handle stressful situations. Regardless of age, most adults need about 8 hours of restful sleep a night.

Eat a healthy diet. A healthy diet includes lots of fruits, vegetables, and whole grains, as well as

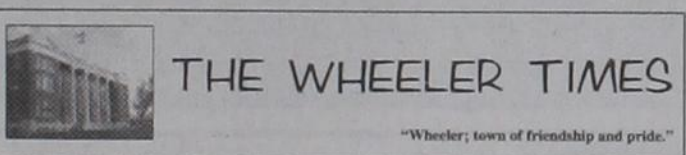

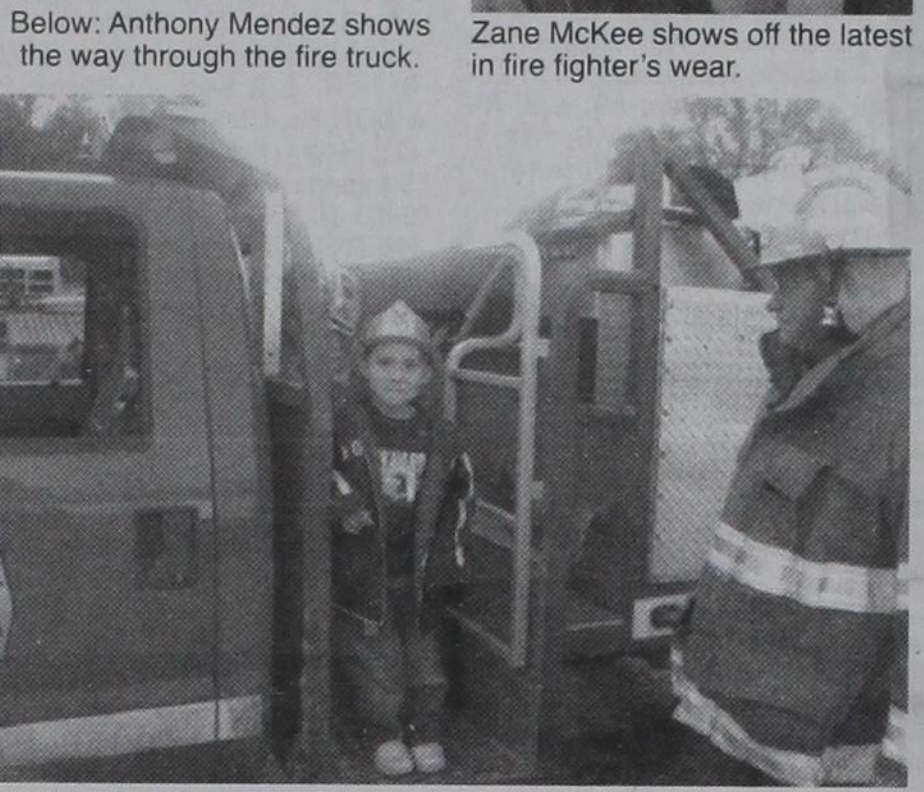

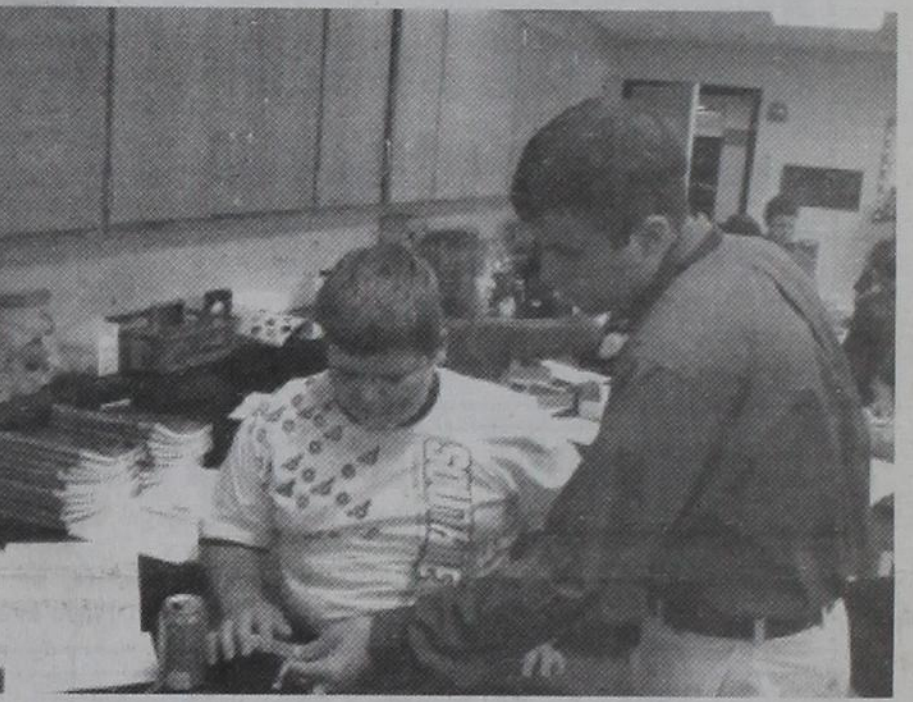

choosing lean meats and eating less refined sugar, processed foods, and saturated fats.

Have a healthy attitude. Changing the way you think can help you manage stress. Most people who are resilient to stress do two important things: they focus on immediate issues — what needs to be done right now, and they have an optimistic explanatory style — assuming their troubles are temporary ("I'm tired today") rather than permanent ("I'm washed up"); specific ("I have a bad habit") rather than universal ("I'm a bad person"); and crediting themselves when things go right, while externalizing their failures ("That

was a tough audience," not "I gave a wretched speech"). Frame the words you say to yourself about the situation in a positive way — "I can do this if I take it one step at a time" or "things will work out," rather than "I can't do this, I hate it when this happens" or everything is going wrong."

Find enjoyment in life. Doing things you enjoy is a natural way to fight stress. Try to find one thing to do each day that you enjoy — even if it's just for 15 minutes.

Prepare, Prioritize, Realize, and Organize.

Prepare to the best of your ability for events you know may be stressful. Prioritize what needs to be done. Be realistic. Realize your limitations, and say "no" if you need to. Take small steps to get organized. Getting organized can

take time, but it can go a long way in reducing stress.

Avoid, Communicate, and Resolve.

Avoid controllable stressors, like saying "no thank you" to a stressful gathering. Communicate by listening, smiling, admitting wrong, giving compliments, and expressing thoughts and concerns assertively. Seek resolution by being willing to negotiate, compromise, or seek outside help (mediation or counsel).

Understanding how our bodies respond to stress; identifying our personal stressors; using strategies such as emergency stress stoppers, the wellness approach, and organizational and interpersonal skills can be useful tools for reducing the stress in our lives

and keeping us healthy in mind and body. Left alone, stress can be bad for both your physical and mental health. The time and energy you spend managing your stress will pay off in the long run.
