

In the mean time the Wares had recruited their daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Bob McNeil, who moved to Wheeler from Woodward, Oklahoma.

Bob became the chief mechanic and the McNeils lived in Wheeler until about 1963, when they moved to Muleshoe, Texas. In 1958, N. D. Ware, Jr. bought the old Ford building from Mr. Jud Johnson and Ware Chevrolet moved across the street. In 1964, N. D. Jr. bought the business from his father and in 1976, Bob Ware

Ware Chevrolet Co. became Ware Chevrolet-Buick-Olds-Pontiac, Inc. in 1983 and moved to its present location on South highway 83 in April of 1984.
