The petition asks District Judge Kent Sims to issue an order requiring Adams to answer the charges and that he be immediately suspended from his law enforcement duties. Adams could be removed from office for official misconduct and be required to pay court costs.

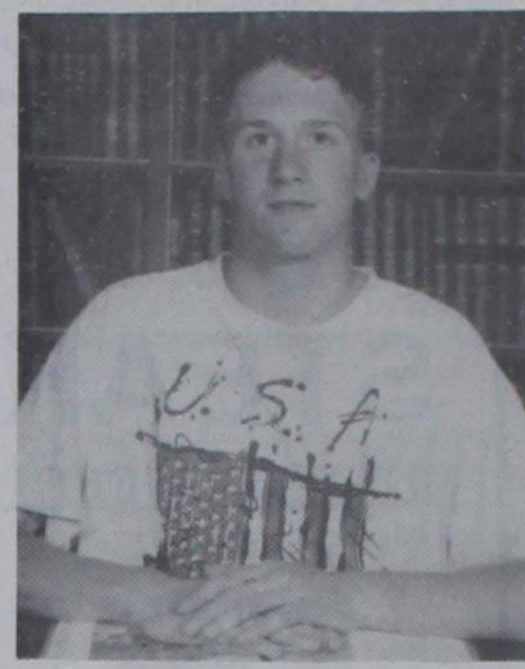

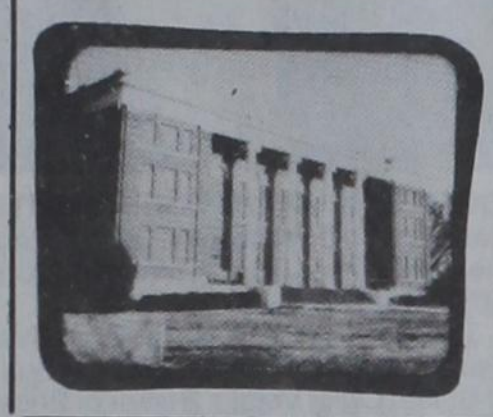

Ware Chevrolet Company was established in April of 1949. Mr. N. D. Ware of Fargo, Oklahoma, had previously been a Chevrolet dealer in Fargo during the 30's, but when WWII became a reality and cars were impossible to obtain, he went out of the car business and into the farm implement business.

When Nick Ware found out there was an opening for a Chevrolet dealership in Wheeler, Texas, he and his wife, Kate and his son, N. D. Ware, Jr., came to Wheeler to look the town over and explore the possibilities of opening a new business. Even though they came from a smaller town than Wheeler they were not too impressed with Wheeler's appearance. At that time there were no paved streets, no new school building, no new hospital and no landscaped, modernized bank and plaza.

Wheeler was just a friendly little country town with houses of assorted sizes scattered here and there. Most of the homes were stucco and a few others were wood frame. The courthouse square was surrounded with small businesses.

In April of 1949, Ware Chevrolet opened. It was first housed in a tiny one room building directly behind the old First National Bank building. The building later became Mr. Deering's shoe repair shop. There was room to park two or three cars on the lot, and at that time that was about all the cars Ware Chevrolet had at one time.

Nick and Kate Ware moved into a little four room house that had been a garage behind the home of Mrs. Fanny Wofford. In July, N. D. Ware, Jr., and his bride two weeks also moved to Wheeler and N.D. went into business with his dad.

Ware Chevrolet Co. became Ware Chevrolet-Buick-Olds-Pontiac, Inc. in 1983 and moved to its present location on South highway 83 in April of 1984.

I have no intention of telling you how to build a barbecue place. I had not intended to try to describe it. But a friend, Ed Forrester, came over the other day to inspect the picnic table. Then after satisfying himself on that, he walked over to the barbecue structure. "You must write this up," he said. I probably can't put it into words so that you have a mental picture but here goes. This edifice starts on the ground with a 4 inch slab of concrete about 6 ft. square. Centered on the slab, two walls of brick about 2 ft. apart are built about 3 1/2 ft. high at one end and 8 ft. high chimney is built, front open inside of course, wings the height of wall are built on either side of chimney, topped with small concrete slabs (about 18x9). This makes a nice place



for tools of the trade while the cook is at his job. The inside of these brick walls is a lining of heavy sheet iron. Inside the grate to the ash pan is built of what looks to be small pipes. This is welded to an up right frame. Above this is an open-work iron grill, which is to hold the meat to be cooked. This grill is on a track (like a drawer), which allows it to be pulled out and in. (I'm sure there had to be a professional welder on this job.) Above this grill is a sheet of iron padded with brick, to be used if you prefer charcoal cooking. The top of the whole works is covered with a sheet of heavy iron, making a stove-top for skillet cooking. An iron dutch oven with lid was perfect for "cowboy potatoes". If scrambled eggs were preferred there was a iron skillet for that. A huge iron grill was used for skillet cooked hamburger patties, fried chicken, or to make Texas Toast. (Oh my! Oh my! We must have lived well in those days.)

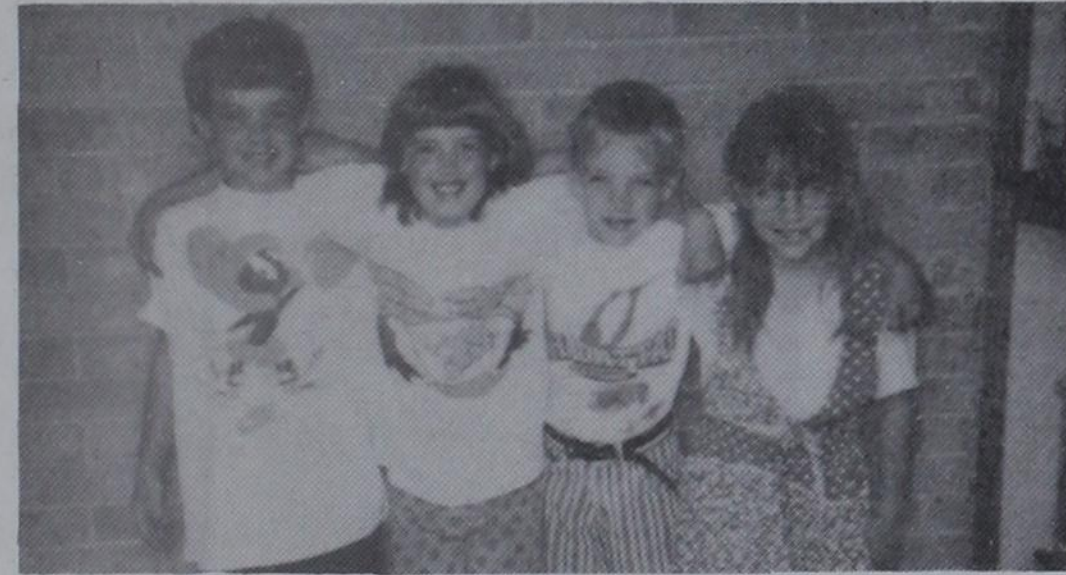
