OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

BUMBLE BEES AND BALING HAY

Most summers when I was alfalfa along the creek bottomland each summer season.

One particular time, Dad was doing the mowing while an older cousin was raking the cut-down alfalfa into windrows. Uncle Fat was pulling the baler behind his tractor and behind the baler, he was pulling a sled made out of 2x6 boards about sixteen feet long. It was eight boards wide with a gap about an inch and a half between the boards. Usually three of us kids rode on this sled

When the baler kicked the bales out onto the sled, we would arrange them into a stack of ten bales. Then we would take a steel bar and stab it into the ground in the center gap of the sled. This would stop the hay and the sled would just slide on out from under it. This way, the individual bales wouldn't be scattered all over the meadow when you came to haul it to the haystack.

Once, a bale came out of the baler and about six inches of a snake was hanging out of it. Seeing that would make you pay even closer attention to the bales, for a while anyway.

That sled was the best invention uncle Fat ever came up with. As you already know, sleds were one of my favorite things to ride on. Riding in the wagon on top of a load of maize heads ranked right up there, too.

One of the days we were baling, my dad was mowing on the other side of the meadow, but where we could see him easily. All at once, he raised up the mower sickle, put the tractor in road-gear and took off across the meadow. He was waving his hat, apparently showing-off, and having a good time. After he got tired of doing that, he drove over to where we

We were all curious about why growing up, Uncle Fat would en- he had been waving his hat. Then list the help of my family and some he showed us...he had a couple of our other kinfolks to help bale of red knots on the bald spot on hay. He had about eighty acres of top of his head. He said that he'd mowed over a bumble bee nest that he usually baled three times and they'd attacked! He'd taken off his hat to swat at'em and that's when they nailed him. I

At one time or another, just about all of us got stung. My mom's cousin, "Leaky," got stung and it made him so sick, he had to stay in the pickup the rest of







RRC PRODUCTION AND ALLOWABLES

The Texas average rig count as of Aug. 13 was 717, representing about 45 percent of all active land rigs in the United States. In the last 12 months, total Texas reported production was 347 million barrels of oil and 7.3 trillion cubic feet of natural gas.

Texas natural gas production represents approximately 29 percent of total U.S. natural gas de-

The Commission's estimated final production for June 2010 is 29,309,835 barrels of crude oil and 539,100,214 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas well gas.

The Commission derives final production numbers by multiplying the preliminary June 2010 production totals of 27,407,738 barrels of crude oil and 498,428,452 Mcf of gas well gas by a production adjustment factor of 1.0694 for crude oil and 1.0816 for gas well gas. (These production totals do not include casinghead gas or condensate.)

Texas natural gas storage reported to the Commission for July 2010 was 375,677,968 Mcf compared to 419,455,991 Mcf in July 2009. The August 2010 gas storage estimate is 345,763,583 Mcf.

The Texas Railroad Commission's Oil and Gas Division set initial September 2010 natural gas production allowables for prorated fields in the state to meet market demand of 15,843,647 Mcf (thou-

In setting the initial September 2010 allowables, the Commission used historical production figures from previous months, producers' demand forecasts for the coming month, and adjusted the figures based on well capability. 

Sharing The Road

"Sharing the road with bicyclists is very important, especially when commuting on busy city streets," writes security guru Ken Bower, Vice President and General Manager for AlliedBarton Security Services, the industry's premier provider of highly trained security personnel DDoday, bicycling has become popular as an environmentally friendly and cost effective transportation alternative as well as a fun and healthy recreational activity. I Novice and experienced cyclists need to make safety a top priority.□ Ken Bower offers Wheeler Times the following tips on Bicycle Safety:

1. Cyclists must obey traffic laws - Do you think that riding on the sidewalk is safer than riding in the street? Cycling on the sidewalk means having to dodge pedestrians, pets, garbage cans, parking meters and signs. Bicycles are considered vehicles and cyclists should obey the same traffic laws as motorists. Travel on the right side of the road with traffic, and do not ride on the sidewalk.□ Obey all stop signs, traffc lights and lane markings.□ Use proper hand signals before making any lane changes or turns.

2. Choose a route that is safe for cyclists - When considering your route, don't think like a motorist. Think like a cyclist. Pick the most pleasant route. Consult Google Earth or Bikely.com to research your trip. Ask your local department of transportation if they have a bike route map. Talk to a professional at your local bike shop or bike club to find out what routes are the safest. Additionally,

bike lanes specific for bicycle commuters. Be aware of other users on bike paths, such as folks with strollers or dogs. Announce that you are passing on the left when overtaking someone on the bike path.

3. Maintenance and repair

make for a safer commute -Make sure all parts are in good repair, and check your brakes, tires and gears often. Have a bike expert teach you the basics so that you can continue routine maintenance. DYour bicycle should be equipped with reflectors and lights. The most common repair you will encounter as a bike commuter will be a flat tire. You should also monitor brake wear. Many bicycle shops, community colleges, adult education programs or bicycle organizations offer workshops or classes in bike repair. Check for classes in your area. Replace your chain every 2,000 miles or so. Clean and oil your chain frequently, especially after riding in the rain, and replace

it regularly. 4. Parking your bike securely - Where do you leave your bike once you get to where you are going? More than half of the one million bikes stolen every year weren't locked. Find a solid object, a street sign or post and secure your bike onto it with a good lock (or more than one, to further discourage theft). Make sure that the pole has something on top that will prevent your bike from being slid

many cities have implemented over it. The safest object to lock your bike onto is a bike rack. You could also ask your manager or supervisor for a storage area where they'll let you leave your bike for the day if you are commuting to work.

5.000 Salety equipment -Safety equipment begins with the helmet. Wearing an approved helmet can reduce the risk of a head injury by up to 85-percent in the event of an accident. Modern helmets protect better and are well ventilated.

6.000 avoid riding your bike at night - However, if you must commute in the dark, you will need effective lighting and reflective equipment. Most states require some kind of front illumination, and it is safer to have a headlight and rear flashers. There are a variety of inexpensive flashers available. Additionally, your clothing should be bright and have reflective strips.

It is also important to carry small repair and first aid kits with you. For the minor repairs you might expect with everyday bike commuting carry a patch kit, a spare inner tube, an air pump and a multitool.
