STORM REPORT

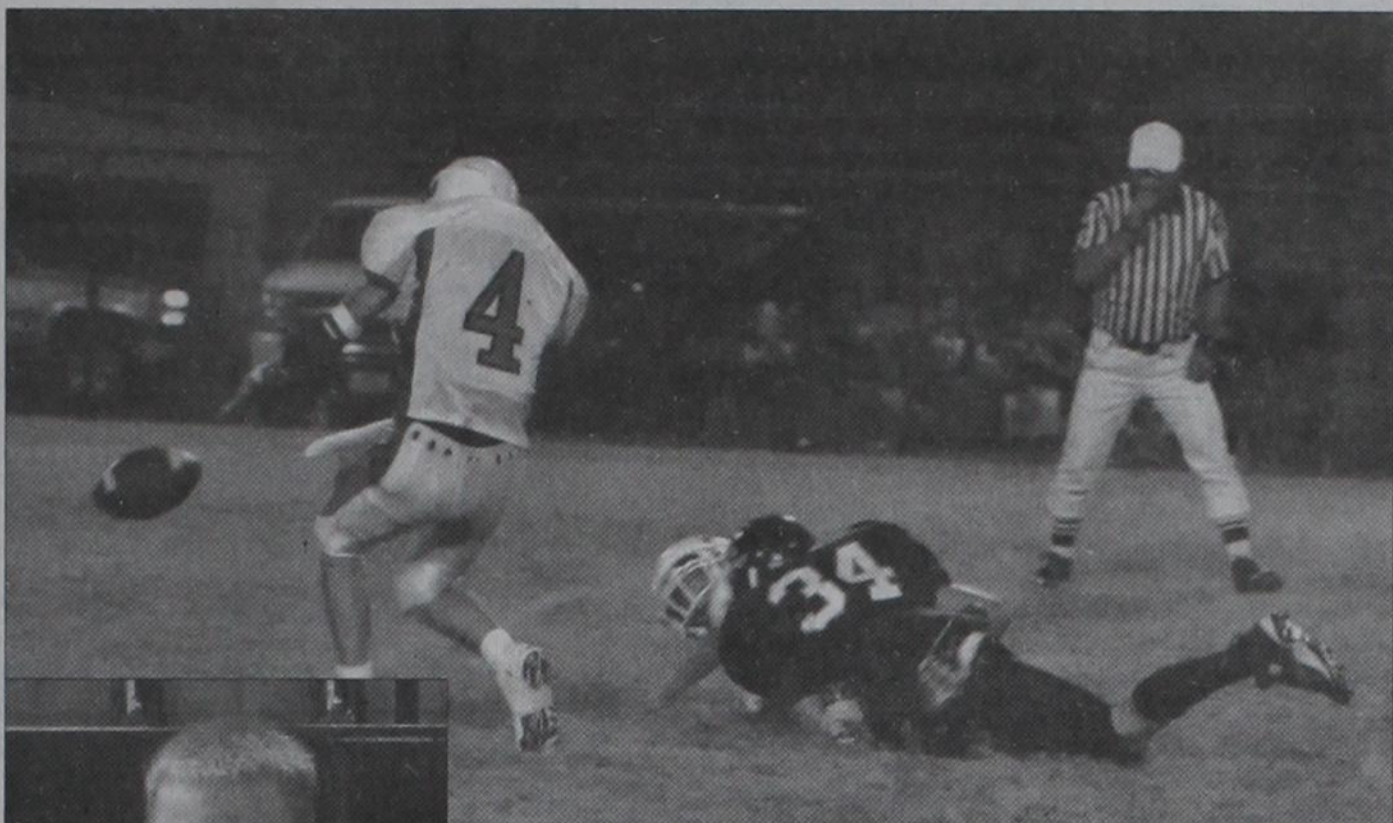

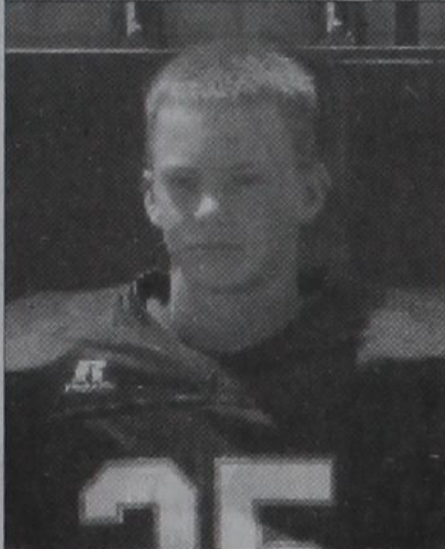

J.D. is a good bug catcher. We catch bugs at the park. One day J.D. tried to catch a squirrel. That was funny!

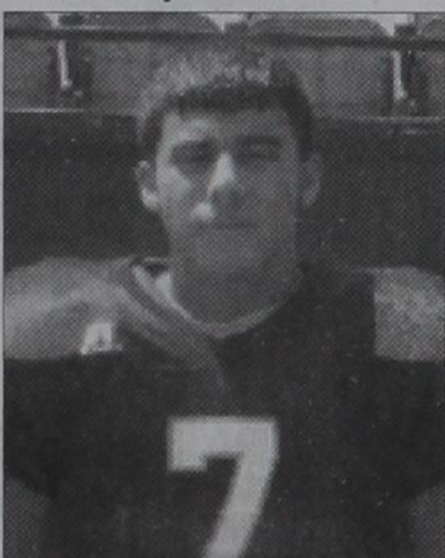

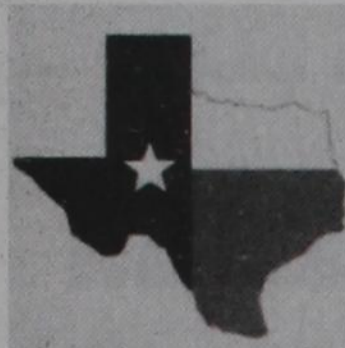

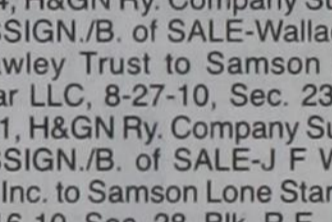

DRIVERLESS TRACTOR equals NEAR-DEATH EXPERIENCE

Most of us, as adults, have heard the statistics on farm related deaths. I don't ever remember hearing much, if anything, when I was a kid. I'm sure my dad warned me more than once, but then as now, teenagers don't take warnings very seriously.

Dad, had asked me to run the

stalk-cutter over the 'lister' ridges in our field. These ridges are rolled up by a plow called a lister. Later, a planter would be used to plow the ridges up while planting cotton seed. Anyway, he liked for the lister ridges to be run over first with the stalk cutter, to break up the clods and smooth them up a little.

That seemed to help the planter do a better job.

Eager to make the day fun as well as work, I took the tractor to the field and was feeling pretty good about the day. I knew from past experience that the tractor wheels would stay in the furrows, so you didn't have to guide it. Knowing this, I didn't see any reason to stay on the tractor all the time. I could jump off, play, chase sand rats, or whatever I wanted, just as long as I chased the tractor down and jumped on in time to turn it around at the turn-row.

I had done this a lot and it had worked out mighty fine, every time. I guess the law of averages finally caught up with me, because this time when I jumped for the running-board, my foot slipped off.

I had my left arm on the tractor fender and my right arm on the steering wheel. I was dangling there with the tractor's rear wheel cleats rubbing on my pants! I re-

member thinking, if I fall on the ground, the tractor will run over me then the stalk cutter will, too! I told myself, if I get out of this alive,

I sure won't do this anymore! Just another one of my experiments that didn't work out like I'd thought it would. It was a lesson learned, and never forgotten!

Xcel Energy Recognizes B&W Pantex's Long-Term Protection Plan

Xcel Energy's Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) is recognizing B&W Pantex this month for its avian protection work at the National Nuclear Security Administration's Pantex Plant located near Amarillo as part of October's national Raptor Month designation, a celebration of birds of prey.

Installation of raptor protection on 500 utility poles — 20 miles of electric lines — was a proactive step by Pantex and parallels Xcel Energy's commitment to keep birds of prey safe from harm.

Electrocution incidents cause unnecessary deaths to protected

migratory birds and contribute to power outages and fires. Installation of special protective equipment on power lines helps reduce bird incidents.

"B&W Pantex has done avian protection work that was not necessarily required of them, protect-

ing a vital part of our ecosystem," said Riley Hill, president and CEO of Southwestern Public Service Company, an Xcel Energy company. "I applaud their efforts as an example to be held high for companies with similar infrastructures."

B&W Pantex is the contractor at the Pantex site. The company is responsible for the Plant's operations involving nuclear weapons, plutonium pit storage, high explosives, engineering, safety, security, facilities management, quality, environmental protection and general administration.

David Lorenz, Xcel Energy environmental analyst whose duties include tracking the effects of electrical structures on wildlife, said, "Since Xcel Energy is also committed to protect our natural resources, which includes eagles and all migratory birds, by assessing high risk structures and proactively making identified structures bird friendly, Xcel Energy can fully appreciate the cost, cooperative efforts and commitment required by Pantex employees to do the same for its high risk structures."

"By insulating the middle phase and the exposed ground wire located near the crossarm of the vast majority of its three phase distribution poles, Pantex has significantly reduced the potential of electrocution such as bald and golden eagles, hawks and other birds of prey," Lorenz said.

In addition to protected structures, Pantex provides habitat to many large raptors susceptible to electrocution such as bald and golden eagles, barn, short-eared, long-eared, and great horned

owls; ferruginous, northern harrier, red-tailed, rough-legged and Swainson's hawks; prairie and peregrine falcons; and turkey vultures.

"Raptor conservation at the Pantex site demonstrates a commitment to protect and manage these important components of the state's natural heritage," said Matt Wagner, Ph.D., Texas Parks & Wildlife deputy director.

"The Texas Parks & Wildlife Department applauds the dedicated staff at Pantex for doing their part in setting the example for other industrial installations in the area to follow," Wagner said.

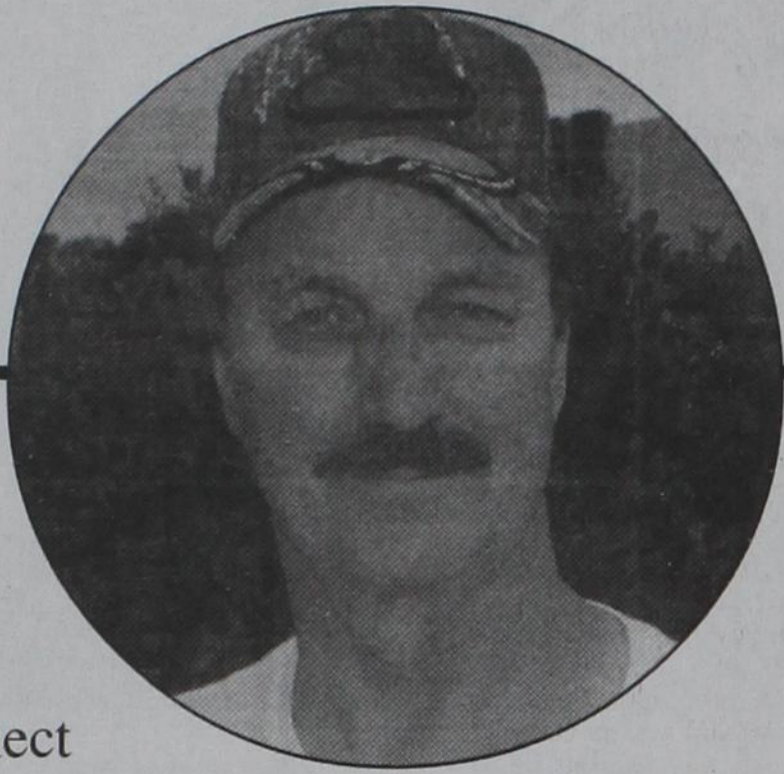
"The Pantex Site Office is committed to protecting and managing our natural resources," said

Steve Erhart, United States Department of Energy/National Nuclear Security Administration's Pantex Site Office manager. "We fully support B&W Pantex's efforts to prevent the loss of raptors from electrocution."

U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service's Tom Cloud, field supervisor, Texas Ecological Services in Arlington, added, "We appreciate Pantex's proactive approach to protecting birds of prey on electric infrastructure, including the forethought to monitor impacts of planned wind farms on raptors and other wildlife."

Xcel Energy is currently implementing an Avian Protection Plan (APP) approved by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, said Jeffrey West, Xcel Energy environmental lead analyst.

"Implementation of the plan includes the retrofit of over 1,100 structures throughout avian sensitive areas of the SPS territory," West said.

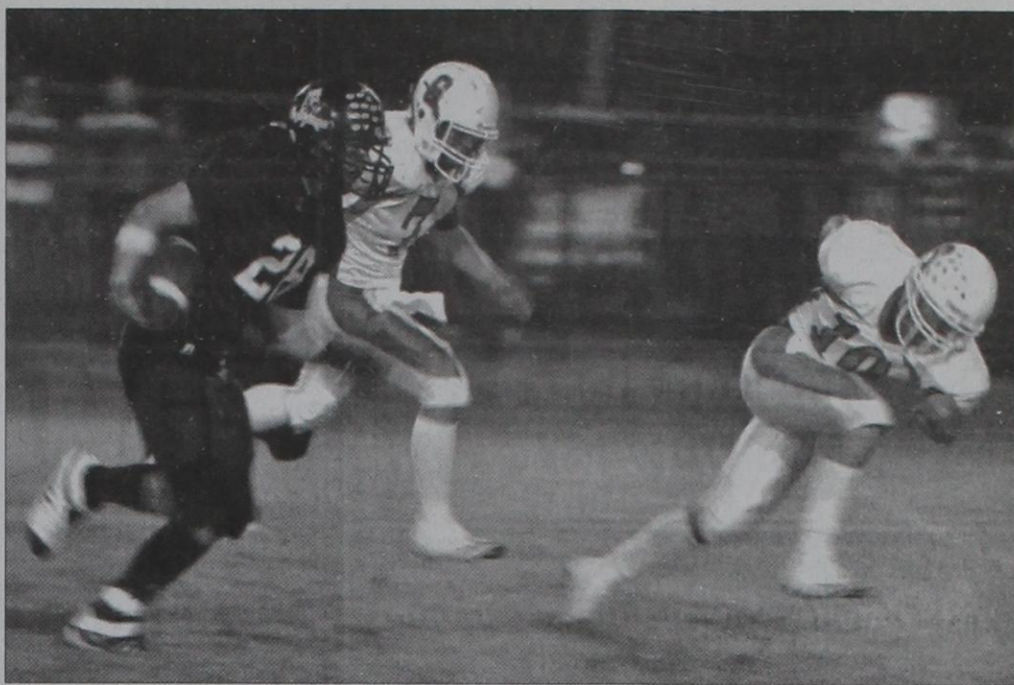
