Aquifer and contaminate millions of gallons of precious drinking water. enty can not only ruin your drinking
water but the water of others for miles around.
These open abandoned or unused wells also pose a physical threat to
small children, livestock, and wild life. small children, ilivestock, and wild ifte.
Small children and animals can fall

doned well and result in serious injury doned well and result in serious injury
