


CALEB FINSTERWALD

GUARD YOUR CARD NUMBERS

You don't have to be mugged on the street to lose money to a thief. With an increasing use in credit cards and other forms of plastic, people can't be reminded enough to be careful. Most of us carry credit cards, A-T-M cards and even the new debit cards to avoid carrying cash. but we can be robbed just the same. You need to take great care to make sure criminals don't come in contact with your cards or the numbers on those cards. Federal law says credit card holders are liable for only 50 dollars on unauthorized charges per account. But note, that is per account. That number can add up if you lose more than one card. The same rules apply for A-T-M and debit cards but only if you report the missing card within two business days. You need to keep a list of your card numbers in a secure place and include with it the phone numbers to call if your card is lost or
