winners drawn. You **MUST** be present to win; however, husbands and wives may claim each other’s prizes.

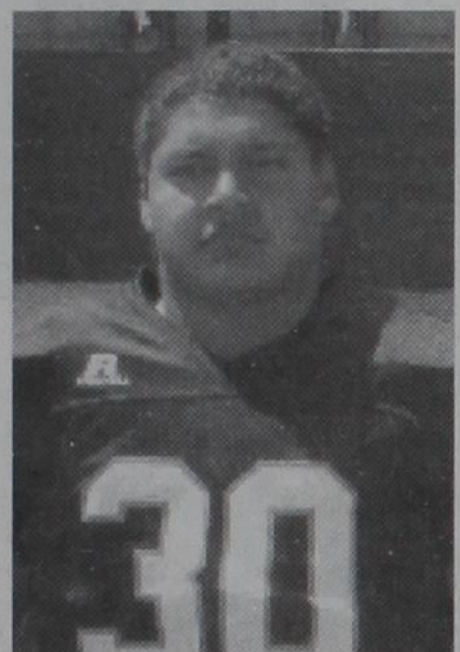
Each sponsor giving tickets will display a poster in their window indicating they are giving drawing tickets.

The 52nd Special Cancellation activity will take place at the Wheeler Texas Post Office, 507 S Canadian St., on December 29, 2010. For the rest of the year, a Post Office in every TPTR county seat will be offering their respective version of the design. The city, date and county will change each week.

The Texas Plains Trail is one of 10 such trails in the state, part of the Texas Heritage Trails Program, implemented by the Texas Historical Commission.

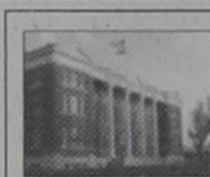

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### I BROKE JACKIE'S LEG ?

While growing up at Wheeler, it seemed like the whole town lived for Friday-night football games. Whether they were at home, or on the road, we always had a good turnout, just like it is now.

If a boy was reasonably healthy, he was pretty much expected to go out for football. Back then, we didn't have to take a physical to prove that we were healthy. If you wanted to play, all you had to do was show up. Of course, the coach wanted us to play basketball, track and baseball, also. He found out right away, he didn't want me to play basketball. I just didn't seem to get the hang of running and dribbling at the same time, so I quit basketball. I did go out for track and baseball, though, and had a small measure of success in the 880 run and pole vault.

Our vaulting pit was just a square pit filled with sand to land in. It also doubled in use for the high jump. If the sand was really dry, it wasn't bad to land in, but sure wasn't too good when it was damp.

One day at practice, I did my vault wrong, somehow, and landed outside of the pit. I never could do quite as well after that; a mental thing, I guess.

Now, about Jackie Johnson's leg. The way I remember it, Jackie played halfback, and so did I. We were practicing at school one day on 'end-run' plays and we were supposed to block for each other. This particular play, we were running around his side, so I was carrying the ball. He was right in front of me, where he was supposed to be, threw his block, just like he was supposed to, and I accidentally stepped on his right leg, be-

tween his ankle and knee. As you know, it broke his leg.

I couldn't hardly believe it! My buddy Jackie, tries to help me out and I wind up breaking his leg! I sure did feel bad about that for a long while. If you ever get an opportunity to look at a 1956 school annual, there's Jackie's picture with the football team. He's standing there with his crutches, smiling, making the best of a bum deal.

I'll have to admit that this accident was probably not avoidable, but it did get me started to thinking about some of the accidents that happened to me, or because of me, during those growing up years.

In the second grade, there was the "flaming hand" trick. Later on, the "porch jumping" accident, when Billy Caswell fell face-first in mom's flower bed; then the time I slung the fish bait on Jimmy Hill. At least that didn't actually injure him; just made him smell bad 'till he could get a bath. Then, there was the time the bullet came back and hit me, when I shot the old car fender. Later on yet, I set the red ants and my friend Hugh Wayne, on fire. Another time, I almost ran over myself with the tractor. At least, when Dale Wofford went horse riding with Darrell, Charles and me, I wasn't the one that ran over him after he fell off; it was Charles. And then there was the time Jerry Henderson shot his fingers with the .22 rifle. That was just one more accident that I contributed to.

After all those incidents, it's surprising that I had any friends who were willing to hang around with me. I expect it made their moms, a little nervous....

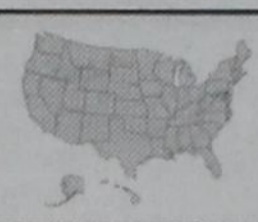

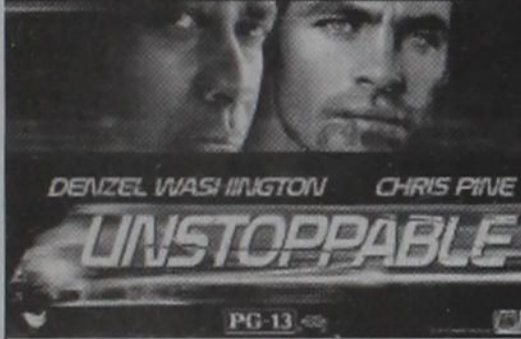

Many Texans will do some, if not most, of their holiday shopping on the Internet. According to the National Retail Federation, 50.8 percent of Americans will make at least one holiday purchase online. But as more consumers turn to the Internet to shop, so do the fraudsters with their scams. The Texas Bankers Association suggests that consumers follow some simple steps to protect themselves while shopping online.

- **Some people like to shop online because of the convenience and others like the exclusive sales available only on the Web.** Whatever the reason, we all have to take steps to protect ourselves and our financial information," said TBA Chairman Jeff Austin III, vice chairman of the board of Austin Bank, Texas in Jacksonville. "Don't let the spirit of the season get ruined by online fraud."
- **The Texas Bankers Association offers the following tips:**
  - **If you're not sure, don't share.** Anyone can set up a website these days so be sure you're familiar with the retailer's site before you give them any of your financial information. The Better Business Bureau has a list of about 70,000 safe websites. Check it out at <http://www.bbb.org/online/consumer/default.aspx>
  - **Is the site secure?** Look for the "s" in <https://> and a small padlock at the bottom of the screen before entering any payment information.
  - **Know the terms of your purchase.** Is the product returnable and if so, who pays the shipping fees? How long will the product take to ship? What does shipping cost? Read the fine print. If it's not clear or you don't agree, make the purchase elsewhere.
  - **Print & Save.** Be sure to print and save the transaction receipt, the order number, a customer service phone number, and any other information you can just in case there's a problem with your order.
  - **Check the privacy policy.** Find out what they're doing with your information by reading the privacy policy. If it's too complicated to read or they don't have one, choose to do business with a more consumer friendly website.
  - **TMI.** Don't divulge too much information to anyone on the Internet. If a website is asking for your bank account number, social security number or driver's license number, don't share it.
  - **Know your rights.** If you suspect you are a victim of fraud, you can contact the Federal Trade Commission at: [www.ftc.gov/complaint](http://www.ftc.gov/complaint). You can also contact the Texas Attorney General at: [www.oag.state.tx.us](http://www.oag.state.tx.us). Be sure to report it to the Better Business Bureau, too.

## Texas Monthly Oil & Gas Statistics

### OCTOBER PERMITS TO DRILL

The Commission issued a total of 1,515 original drilling permits in October 2010 compared to 1,003 in October 2009. The October total included 1,302 permits to drill new oil and gas wells, 39 to re-enter existing well bores, and 174 for re-completions. Permits issued in October 2010 included 398 oil, 196 gas, 887 oil and gas, 22 injection, one service and 11 other permits.

### SEPTEMBER CRUDE OIL PRODUCTION

Texas preliminary September 2010 crude oil production averaged 938,457 barrels daily, up from the 897,156 barrels daily average of September 2009.

The preliminary Texas crude oil production figure for September 2010 is 28,153,714 barrels, up from 26,914,676 barrels reported during September 2009.

### OCTOBER OIL AND GAS COMPLETIONS

In October 2010, operators reported 451 oil, 259 gas, 38 injection and one other completion compared to 477 oil, 575 gas, 63 injection and four other completions during October 2009.

Total well completions for 2010 year to date are 8,723 down from 13,575 recorded during the same period in 2009.

Operators reported 740 holes plugged and one dry hole in October 2010 compared to 469 holes plugged and four dry holes in October 2009.

### SEPTEMBER NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION

Texas oil and gas wells produced 553,183,240 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas based upon preliminary production figures for September 2010 up from the September preliminary gas production total of 533,618,142.

Texas production in September 2010 came from 140,331 oil wells and 91,160 gas wells.

### RRC Production Stats & Allowables

AUSTIN — The Texas average rig count as of Nov. 12, 2010, was 726, representing about 44 percent of all active land rigs in the United States. In the last 12 months, total Texas reported production was 351 million barrels of oil and 7.3 trillion cubic feet of natural gas.

Texas natural gas production represents approximately 29 percent of total U.S. natural gas demand.

The Commission's estimated final production for September 2010 is 29,738,198 barrels of crude oil and 529,429,553 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas well gas.

The Commission derives final production numbers by multiplying the preliminary September 2010 production totals of 28,153,714 barrels of crude oil and 488,629,029 Mcf of gas well gas by a production adjustment factor of 1.0563 for crude oil and 1.0835 for gas well gas. (These production totals do not include casinghead gas or condensate.)

Texas natural gas storage reported to the Commission for October 2010 was 455,184,728 Mcf compared to 458,359,717 Mcf in October 2009. The November 2010 gas storage estimate is 463,200,224 Mcf.

The Texas Railroad Commission's Oil and Gas Division set initial December 2010 natural gas production allowables for prorated fields in the state to meet market demand of 13,887,404 Mcf (thousand cubic feet). In setting the initial December 2010 allowables, the Commission used historical production figures from previous months, producers' demand forecasts for the coming month, and adjusted the figures based on well capability. These initial allowables will be adjusted after actual production for December 2010 is reported.

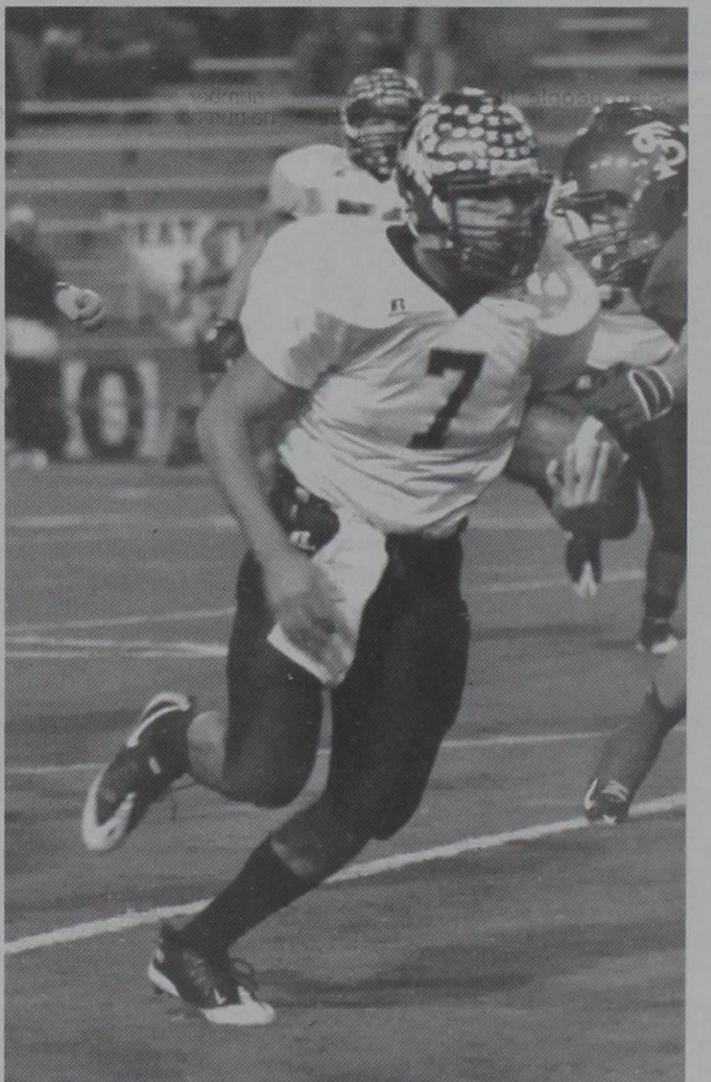

### Wheeler One-Play Dinner Theatre Set

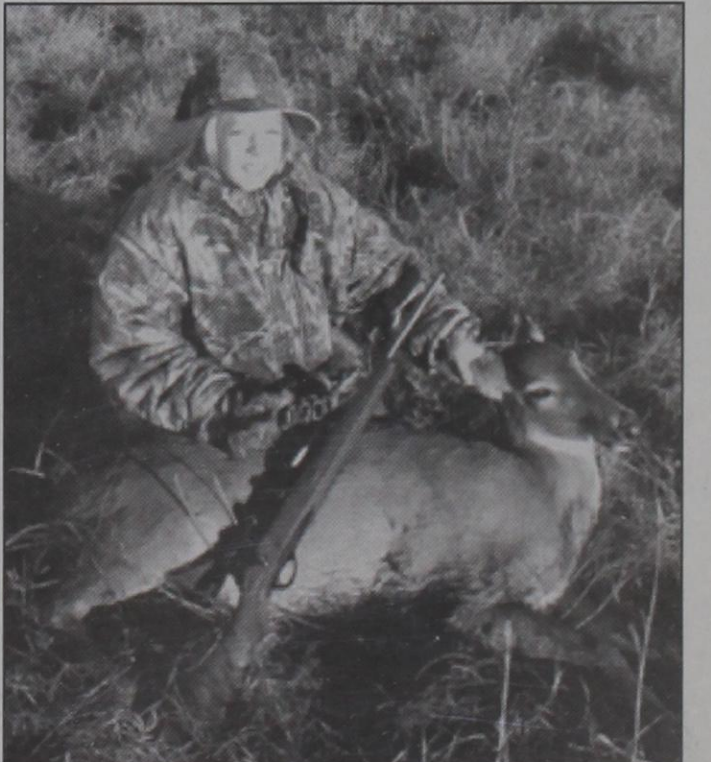
