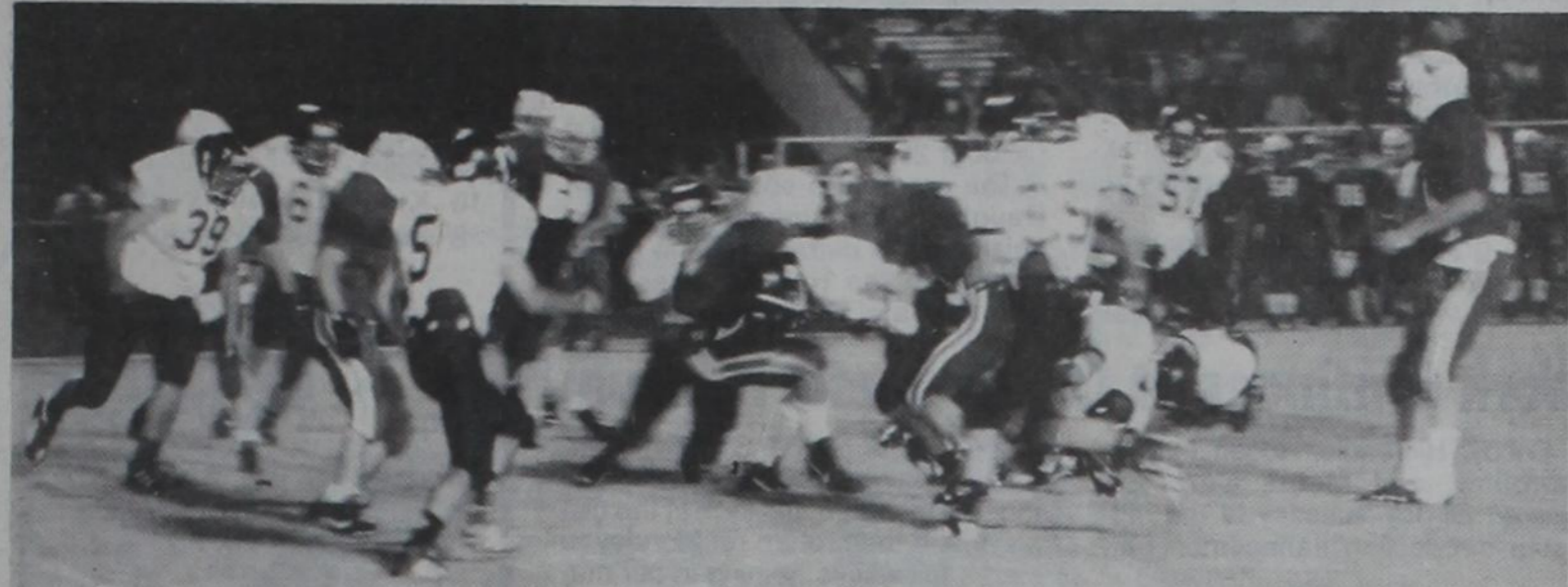

### MUSTANGS SUFFER 28-0 DEFEAT BY WHITE DEER

Last Friday the Mustangs traveled to White Deer to play the 4-0 Bucks who have not been scored on all season.

The Mustangs entered the game with a 2-2 record, but when the final buzzer sounded their record dropped to 3-2.

This game was the Mustang's last non-district game.

The first 18 minutes of the game were mostly dominated by both defenses. Neither defense allowed their opponents to mount any sort of drive.

The only bright spot in the first quarter for the Mustangs was an interception by Aaron Dunnam. Dunnam returned the interception to the White Deer two yard line, but on the next play Wheeler fumbled the ball into the end zone and White Deer recovered for a touch-back.

With 2:00 left in the second quarter the Bucks ended the scoring drought with a 25 yard touchdown pass from Jeremy Crook. Then as time ran out the Mustangs gave up a 45 yard touchdown pass. The Mustangs went into half-time trailing the Bucks by a score of 13-0.

The second half saw the Bucks completely dominate the Mustangs by only allowing the Mustangs 42 yards of offense.

The Bucks added another touchdown in the third quarter and then a final score in the fourth quarter to win the game 28-0.

The Wheeler offense gained on 172 yards on the night. They compiled 10 first downs and 144 rushing yards and 29 yards passing.

Aaron Dunnam was 1-6 passing with one interception. The Mustangs fumbled the ball four times and lost three, and were penalized seven times for 90 yards.

The Mustangs offense was led by Casey Childress who had eight carries for 42 yards.

Jeremy Davis had 14 carries for 35 yards, and Bryan Judd carried the ball eight times for 41 yards.

Aaron Dunnam contributed 23 yards on 13 carries. Dunnam's one pass completion was for 29 yards to Jeremy Davis.

White Deer finished the game with 19 first downs, 138 yards rushing, and 129 yards passing, for 267 total yards. White Deer was 7-19 in the

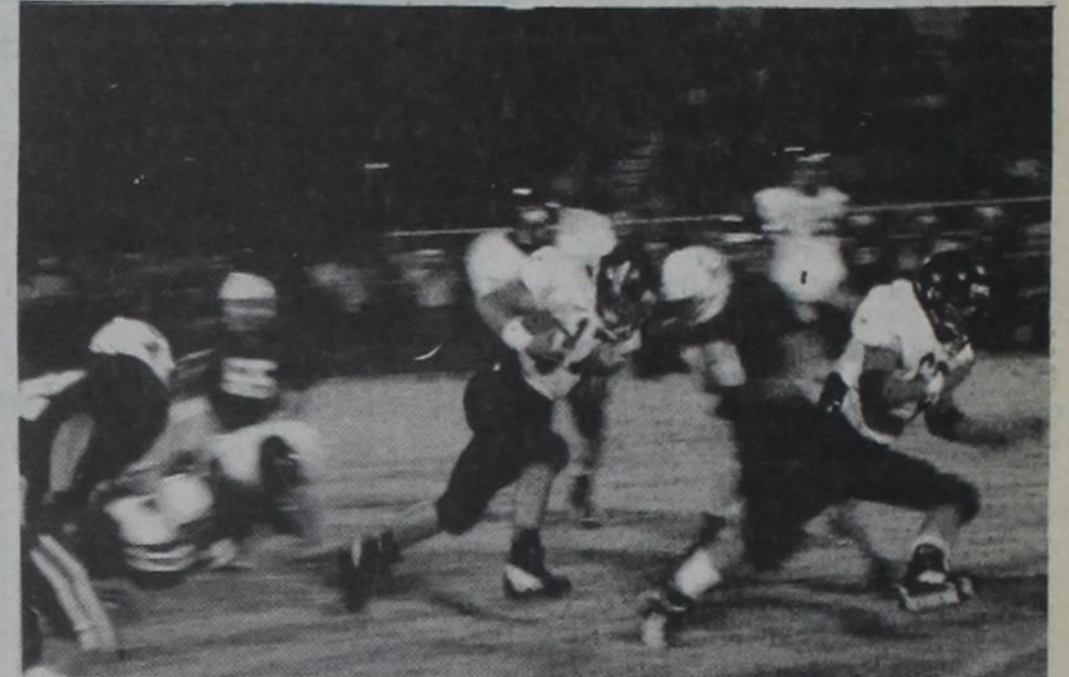
this was that night for the Mustangs.

The report was a little better for Wednesday morning. I measured 1.11" at 7:00 a.m. with the prospects of more.

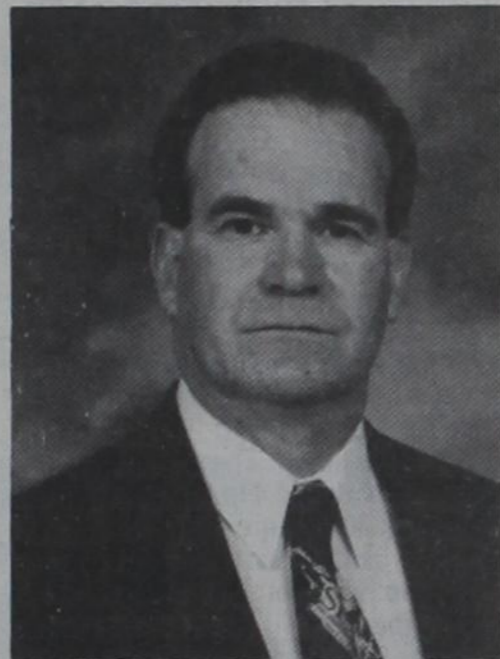

### Accelerated Read Once Again Is in Full Swing

Once again at Wheeler Jr. High, the Accelerated Reading Program is in full swing. Betty Rives and Tammy Moore are the language arts teachers in junior high who work with this program. First grade through fifth also are active in the program. Accelerated Reading is a computerized reading management program that tests students over books read. Students may choose any of over 1,000 books that are available on the computer disks. Our library is well-stocked with many AR books.

After completing a book from the list, the student takes a 10-20 question test on the computer. The test takes about fifteen minutes to complete. The computer keeps track of each student's score and the difficulty of the books. Points are awarded depending on the reading level and difficulty of the book.

This program encourages reading more classics and award winning books, yet the students choose the books that interest them. The program also allows the teacher to actually determine if students are reading books and how they are comprehending the material. Even the smartest kid can't fool the computer. Students learn that they must read carefully and well.

A Junior High Accelerated Reading Store is open daily for students to spend their AR points earned. This store is stocked with many items from pencils to posters to motivate students to read. The financial support for this store comes strictly from donations. Funds are low at present as we start a new year and donations are needed. In past years, the support of parents and community members has been outstanding. I thank you for that support. Your help is always appreciated. Twenty four volunteer hours were spent at football stand bys and twenty volunteer hours were spent at the Tri-State Rodeo held in Wheeler. 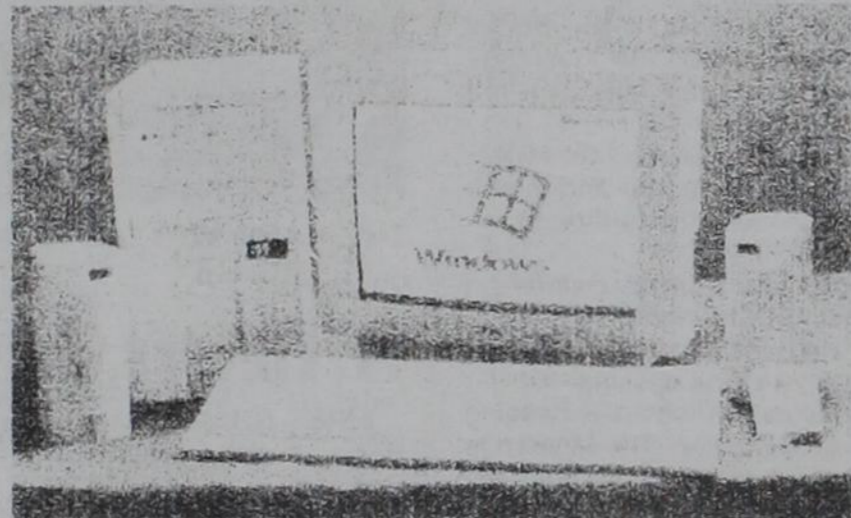

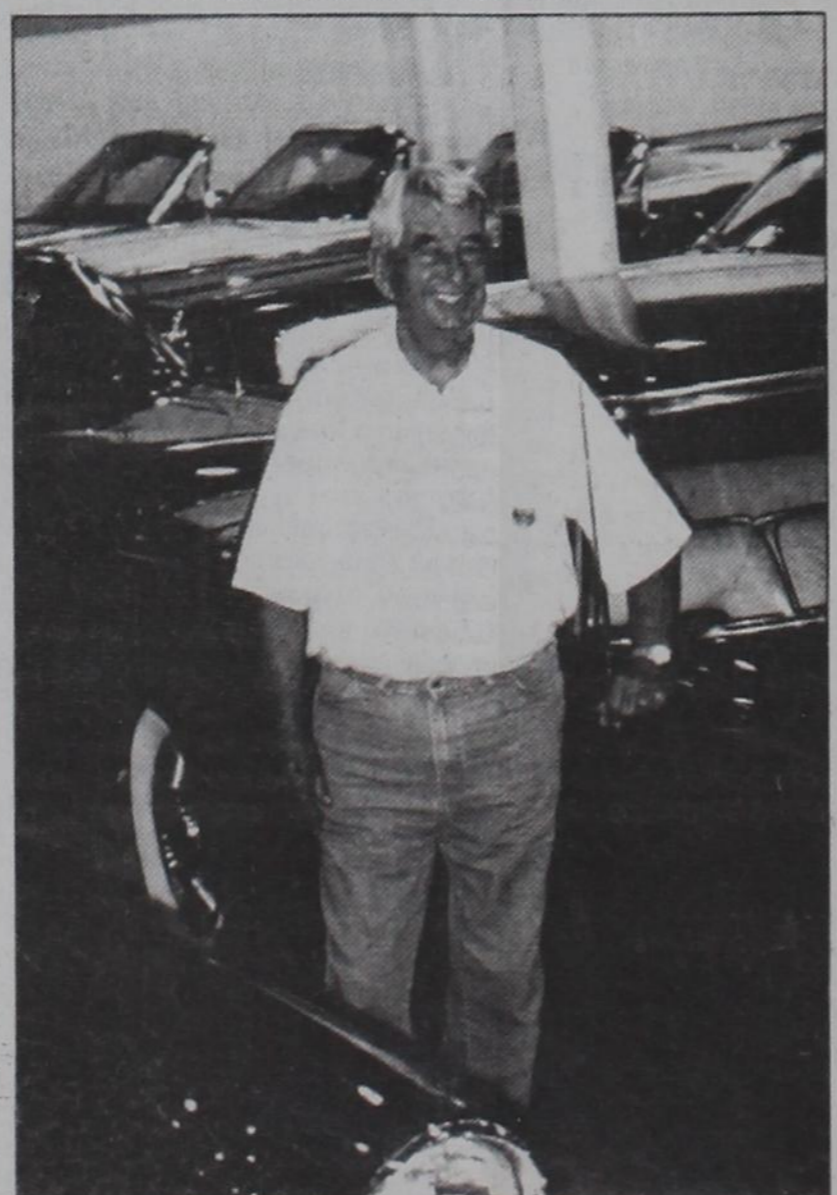

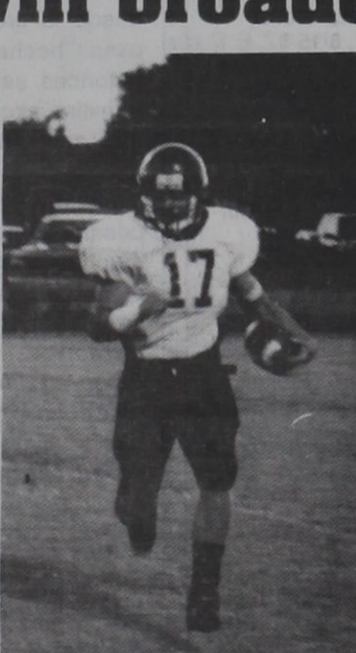

For something different and delicious try: Luscious Layered Casserole

1 lbs. ground pork sausage, 1 16 oz package of coleslaw mix, 1 table spoon vegetable oil, 1 table spoon flour, 1 8 oz. carton sour cream, 1 6 oz. package long grain and wild rice mix, cooked, 1, 10 oz can diced tomatoes and green chiles, undrained, 2 cups, 8 oz, shredded cheddar cheese.

Brown sausage in large skillet, stirring until it crumbles. Drain sausage and set aside, Saute coleslaw mix in hot oil in skillet until crisp and tender. Drain. Stir flour into sour cream. Layer rice, sausage, cole slaw, sour cream, tomatoes, and chiles and cheese on a lightly greased 9x13 pan. Bake at 375 for 30 minutes or well heated.

Note: Beef may be substituted for sausage. and seven cups of shredded cabbage for cole slaw mix. Can be microwaved after assembly.

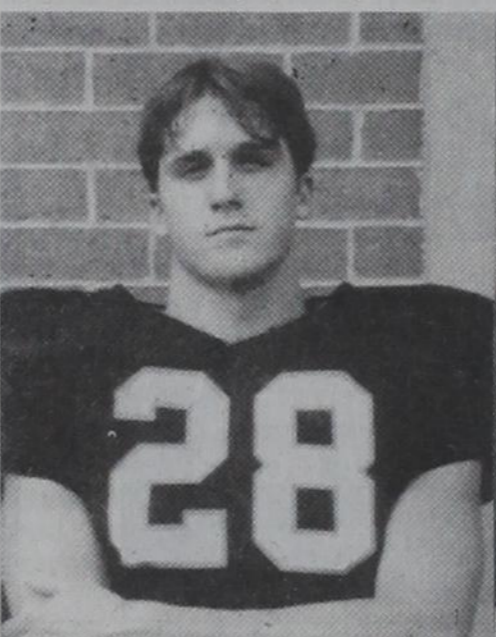

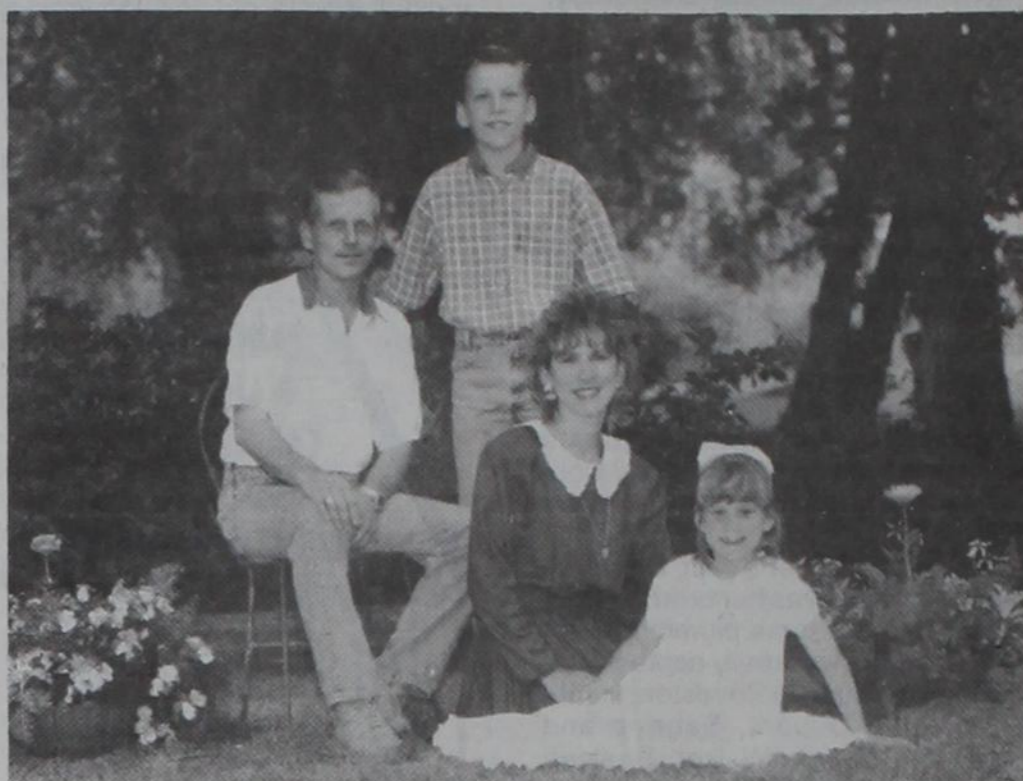

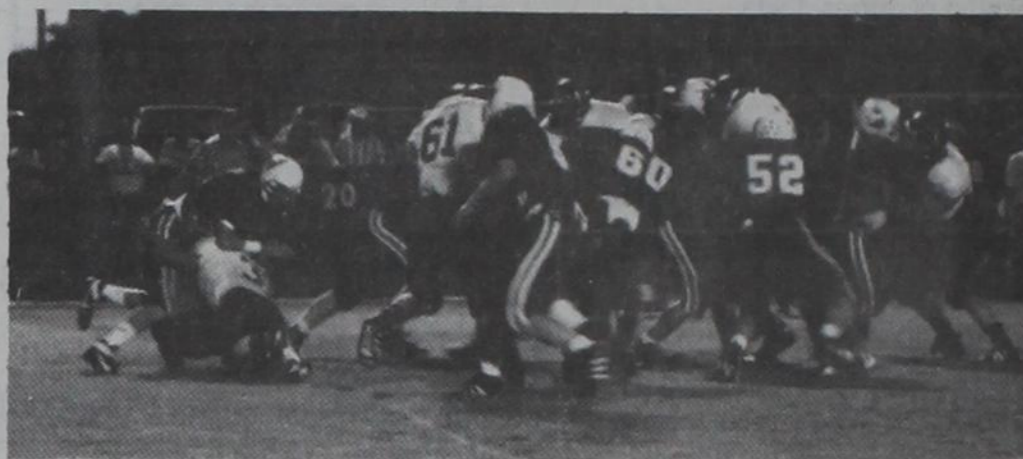

**GUIDELINES FOR-HELPERS**

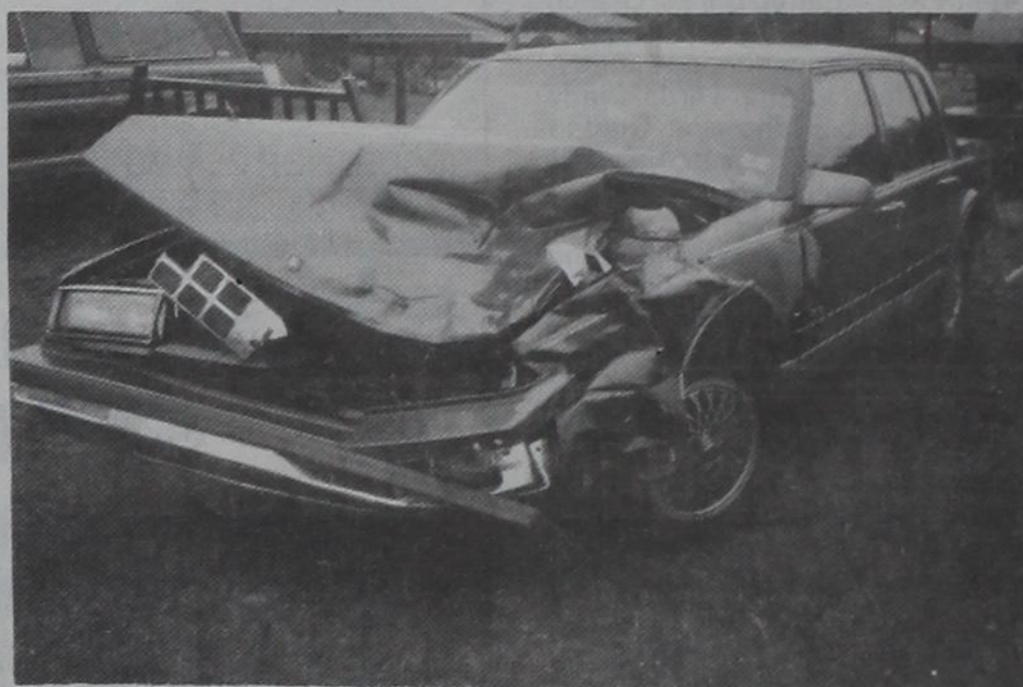
- A. For Yourself**
  - How aware are you of your need to help others in order to feel good about yourself?
  - To what degree do you use "helping others" as a way of avoiding confronting your own "problems"?
  - Is your need to help others a "symbolic language" by which you are asking for help for yourself?
  - How well do you accept realistic limits as to what you may accomplish?
  - Are you a person who must have everything under control and for whom things must work out according to your own preconceived conclusions?
  - How well do you do in handling people who have a different social, economic, and religious values and behavior from your own?
  - What are you doing to nurture yourself as a mature, responsive person?
  - What are you doing now to nurture the most important relationships in your life?
- B. For Working With Patient/Family**
  - Are you focused upon the patient or family member or is your mind preoccupied with something else?
  - Are you listening for the feelings behind the words and beyond the person's actions, or are you dealing only with the surface?
  - When you respond to a direct question, are you clear as to what the person is really asking for?
  - When you give information, is it factually accurate, honest and clear?
  - Are you able to accept an expression of anger without becoming hurt or angry yourself, or attempting to explain the anger away?
  - Are you giving adequate feedback to assure the patient or family member that he/she has really been heard and understood?
  - Does your own body language reveal your discomfort with the patient or family member and indicate something you need to take care of?
  - Have you assured the patient or family member of his/her importance and significance to you?
- C. Be Very Careful!**
  - "I know just how you feel."
  - "Everyone has to go through this."
  - "If I were you, I would..."
  - Just because you experienced something one way does not mean that is the way everyone else experiences it.
  - Don't play 20 questions with the patient or family, your visit is not an
