### April Finsterwald


April Finsterwald of Mobeetie was among more than 300 students recently named to the Amarillo College Honor List for the Fall 1998 semester.





### Vandalism Of Traffic Signs On The Increase

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has noted an increase in traffic sign theft and vandalism in the Childress District. Signs are being stolen off of the posts. Although the signs are quicky replaced, when stop signs and warning signs are taken it becomes a safety concern. Clyde Harper, Childress District Traffic Section Supervisor, reports that, "missing signs can endanger travelers. Any warning sign warns of a potential hazard. The vandalizing of certain signs, especially stop, yield and warning signs can risk a persons safety and violators can be criminally prosecuted".

The costs associated with this crime are high. Damaged signs pose a danger to the traveling public, and the

funds spent to replace them could be spent elsewhere. Taypayers in the Childress District TxDOT spent more than \$28,000 last year to replace stolen and vandalized signs along state roadways. Statewide, taxpay ers spent more than \$8 million replacing signs damaged by natural disasters, accidents, and vandals. Wood and metal signs cost approximately \$10 per square foot to produce, and this doesn't include the labor required.



have their line upgraded to allow 56K access to the Internet. I believe that in the coming months many of our local businesses are going to want to access their suppliers, customers or other affiliates through the Internet. In a related note, Gardiner advised

that she has taken steps to discourage certain of her customers from the practice of holding telephone lines open even though they are not accessing the Internet. This practice, called Camping, has created busy signals for other customers during peak periods. Deana said that the industry standard for customers to telephone lines is approximately eight to ten customers for each line. YFT.net, her local Internet access, provides has a ratio of 6.5 customers

When Your Favorite Things took over the local Internet access from Lads Radio Shack the number of incoming lines was increased by one third, and the out going bandwidth was doubled. Deana shared that the system has grown steadily since she acquired the business, and she wants the business to be able to continue to grow as the area's need also grows.



# County Farmers Increase Efficiency

Many farmers in the area are starting to realize that in order to succeed in the post Freedom to Farm world, they must increase their efficiency; i.e. become the least cost producer. Wheeler county farmers wanting to become the least cost producer are turning to a South Dakota farmer for the key. The key to becoming more efficient according to Dwayne Beck, the manager for the farmer owned Dakota Lakes Research Station in Pierre, S.D., is to diversify and intensify farming operations. The name of the game is to store enough soil moisture to grow different crops, diversity, and grow them with more frequency, intensity.

The theory behind traditional summer fallow is to keep the soil cracks closed, thus keeping soil moisture from evaporating. That is also the reason farmers work the ground during the crop season, to protect their moisture. One problem though, traditional farming methods in normal years only save enough moisture to grow summer fallow - wheat. However, Beck has found that by leaving the crop residue in a low-disturbance no-till system keeps the cracks closed too. "It covers them up, lets the water go down and doesn't let it come back

Rotations have been a key compo-

nent to Beck's system; "the key word is diversity." Diversity enables them to use their equipment and labor "so much more efficiently," says Beck. "We harvest from the first of July to the last week of November; we seed from the last week of March to the second week of June. It's because we are growing so many different crops. With such a variety of crops, there have not been too many years that everything goes bad; sometimes everything hits, but that is rare, also." By spreading out the workload and risk, some crop is working all the time. The use of a variety of crops also keeps both diseases and weeds better under control, increasing both pro-

ductivity and profitability.
