Governor Bush took the time from his busy schedule to address an audience of between 250 and 350 people at the Wheeler gymnasium on Saturday morning, February 21, 1998. Following a short speech, Gov. Bush and his wife, Laura went out into the audience and shook hands and signed autographs.

Gov. Bush expressed his pleasure in having the opportunity to come to Wheeler, "the land where good schools and Texas values reign

supreme".

The governor told the crowd of a few of the accomplishments of his term office and addressed his plans for the future of Texas.

language. Every student, when they reach the third grade should be able to read on a third grade level. If the student can not pass the reading test, they will be given the help they need to attain this goal.

The teaching of reading has been changed. Phonics will be used; the students will learn to sound out the words. If additional education is needed by the teachers, they will be payed to learn these skills.

"The best juvenile justice system is to teach a child to read; the best welfare program is a literate tomorrow," he continued.

The students must learn they are responsible for what they do in life. Gov. Bush would like for the state government to move into the background of the lives of its citizens. He feels that an "act of kindness is more

important than a government check." He has seen 190,000 less people on welfare, one million less on food stamps and a drop in crime.

The governor listed three things he feels is responsible for poverty: Poor schools, Drugs and Children born out of wedlock.

Prior to going into the audience to shake hands and sign autographs, the governor presented Eagle Scout Badges to four Wheeler Scouts.


Scoutmaster Ben Ed Hillhouse had his son, Samual, present the governor with a Boy Scout of America T-



I recently read an article that contained some terrifying statistics about child abuse. These statistics were: ---

Two hundred thousand children are physical abused each year. Fifteen to twenty percent of American families abuse their children.

age--one-third of these children are

under six months. The number one killer of children under five years of age is child abuse.

Four thousand children die annually because of child abuse. It is estimated that, including the unreported abuses, the number could be as high as 50,000.

Child-abusers are found in every category of our society. They are not limited to one particular socioeconomic, or religious aspect of our society.

Most of us recognize the tragedy of these statistics and would agree that parents who commit such abuse should be criminally prosecuted. But we fail to recognize that physical abuse is not the only way that parents can abuse their children. Child abuse is also committed by parents when they fail to teach their children a standard of morality.

President Theodore Roosevelt once observed: "Educate a man in mind and not in morals and you make a menace to society." There is much evidence that such a mis-

> As these statistics clearly show, there are many children who are characterized by a permissive and immoral attitude. But who is responsible for this attitude? The parents of these children are responsible because they failed to teach their children a standard of morality.

While some parents are too rigid in the training of their children, it does not justify others who are too indulgent. Parents must teach their children a standard of right and wrong. And when parents fail to teach this standard, they are guilty of child abuse.


