



The Wheeler Mustangs took on the Sudan Hornets last Friday night at Dick Bivens Stadium in the Regional Championship game. Sudan came into the game with a record of 9 wins and 2 losses in District 5-1A.

Wheeler had the same record at 9-2 in District 1-1A.

nets to begin the game, but the

Wheeler defense held them to three

plays and a punt. Wheeler took the

ball on their own 43 yard line and

began to drive. The Mustangs were

able to get the ball to the Hornet's 17

yard line, but their drive stalled and

they turned the ball over on downs.

The Mustang defense was again able

to hold Sudan on downs. The punt

was short, and Wheeler got the foot-

ball in good field position on the Hor-

net 24 yard line. The offense was

able to score on this posession. Aaron

Dunnam capped off an 8 play 24 yard

drive with a 1 yard touchdown run.

The first half may have been dominated by the Wheeler Mustangs, but the second was mostly Sudan. Wheeler received the kick off at the start of the half, but could not put together a drive and were forced to punt. Sudan went 7 plays to even the score at 7-7 with 7:16 left in the third quarter. The Mustangs could not do anything on their next possesion, and turned the ball back over to the Hornets. Sudan gained more momentum as they scored again with 2:07 left in the third quarter.

For the rest of the third quarter and a majority of the fourth quarter, neither team could score. In the middle of the fourth quarter, Wheeler got a break. Bruce Copeland broke through the line and blocked the Sudan punt, and the Mustangs recovered. The Mustangs scored on a 7 play drive. Aaron Dunnam ran in from 6 yards out and Ben Dollar's kick was good to tie the score at 14-14 with 3:58 left in the game. The Mustangs had one last scoring opportunity as they attempted a 35 yard field goal, but it was blocked. The time expired with Wheeler tied with Sudan at 14-14.

In overtime, Wheeler won the coin toss, and elected to be on defense first. Sudan took the ball on the Mustang 25 yard line. After two incomplete passes, the Hornets Quarterback connected with the Tight End for a 25 yard touchdown pass. The extra point kick was good and Sudan led 21-14. Wheeler then started on the Sudan 25 yard line. Aaron Dunnam completed a 23 yard touchdown pass to Michael Montgomery, and the extra point was good. The first overtime ended with Wheeler and Sudan tied at 21-21

In the second overtime, Wheeler was on offense first. Casey Childress carried the ball 6 straight time, and scored on a three yard run. Ben Dollar's kick was good, and Wheeler led 28-21, but Sudan still had a chance. On the Hornet's first play, they completed a 23 yard pass, putting them on the 2 yard line. They would score on the next play bringing them within one point of the Mustangs, and a third overtime. On the extra point attempt however, Michael Montgomery broke through the Sudan line and blocked the kick. The Mustangs won 28-27 in double overtime
