Barbara had come in Wednesday evening and I went to Oklahoma Thursday evening.


We managed to work in several card games and my partner and I won each of the games. But Benny and I only had one win Monday evening. Dwight and Mike had the better score at the end of the second and third game.

The Mobeetie City Council met Monday April 27, 1998 at the City Hall with Mayor Jim Kephart in charge. Members present Jim Kephart Mayor, Aldermen present Ada Lou Lester, Lois Reeves, and Wanda Estes. Rick Roach, city attorney. Members absent Pam Thompson.

Guests Present: Frannie Hilburn, Robert Bull, Jess and Deanna Mixon, and Dale and Melba Corcoran. Jim Kephart called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M. Wanda Estes was taking the minutes. Jim Kephart read the minutes from March 9. Motion by Ada Lou Lester to accept. Sec. and carried 3-0. Jim Kephart gave the financial reports, which were just the balances of each account. Wanda Estes made a motion to accept the reports as given. Second by Ada Lou Lester. Carried 3-0. Rick Roach arrived at 7:11 P.M. Jim Kephart presented the following bills to be paid, GTE, BFI for 2 months, Water Deposit to William Hall, Texas Work Force Commission for Unemployment, Hefley Hardware, David Cummings for tree trimming, Rick Roach attorney fee, and the bill for the red rocks that have been put on the roads. The next item on the agenda was the painting of the tall water tower. They had 2 bids one was for \$13, 295.00 and the other was for \$4,705. The bid for \$4,705.00 was from a painter in Pampa. The other was from the Underwater Services. Wanda Estes made a motion to go with the lowest bid with the understanding that he present certificate of insurance, licenses and EPA rules be applied with. Second. Carried 3-0. 



The Amarillo television station, KMAR, once broadcast a three part program that was entitled," Shattered Innocence." This program emphasized that child abuse, especially sexual child abuse, was becoming a major social program.

There are some factual statistics to support this conclusion. For example, 200,000 children are physically abused each year. Between 60,000 to 100,000 of these children are sexually abused. The number one killer of children under five years of age is child abuse. And fifteen to twenty percent of American parents abuse their children.

I was horrified by these statistics! I firmly believe that any parent who abuse their children should be legally prosecuted. However, I also believe that these statistics do not reveal the complete problem. It is my conviction that parents can abuse their children by what they do, but they can also abuse their children by what

they fail to do. Perhaps the best illustration of this abuse is the failure of many parents is to teach their children to have some basic values. And this parental abuse is having some devastating effects upon this na-

For example, Biblical morality is being replaced by sexual permissiveness. While illicit sex is not a
