Review by the Appraisal Review Board If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have
your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB). your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).
The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns
listed above It has the power to order the CAD to make listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make
the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a the necessary changes to solve problerns. If you file a
written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening, Saturday or Sunday Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the
evidence the CAD will use to uphold their determina-

satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of
the date you receive the ARB's order.

Tax Payment
If you appeal and your case is pending, you must pay the lesser of the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes

Unit) capabilities. According to the
Texas Department of Health, the Texas Department of Health, the
agency that regulates operations and agency that regulates operations and
procedures for ambulances, a BLS unit is designed to transport sick and
injured patients to the hospital. Where, injured pationts it ine hospital Where,
a MICU unit is required to carry fur her equipment to provide differen
proceduras if the patients condition (placing a tube in the "windpipe" to provide oxygen to the lungs), cardiac
monitoring, defibrillation ("shocking" the heart with paddles), and drug therapy. The drugs on the ambu-
lance are some of the drugs that are at Parkview's emergency room. In some instances having the ambulance at the MICU level is like having part of the E. R. in your home. There-
fore it takes the crew a little longe than previously to provide treatment before leaving for the hospital. With
some patients the extra minutes some patients the extra minutes spen providing treatment on the scene can
make abig difference in the quality of
life the eatient lif the patient may have in the future.
The BLS unit is required to have The BLS unit is required to have a
least one EMT and any of the following combination of personnel ECA EMT, intermediate, or paramedic. BLS units are required to provide
treatment at the basic life support level which includes CPR, control of
hemorrhaging, and oxygen therapy. When the unit has equipment and
drugs at the MICU level the ambulance must have a paramedic aboard
to utilize the procedures and drugs. to utilize the procedures and drugs.
All EMS certified EMS personnel in
this region, no matter the level, are this region, no matter the level, are
able to provide medical treatmen M. D. Patezold is the medical directo of the Panhandle Emergency Medi-
