**Illustrated Booklet Used** Learn Septic Tank Care

A new, free, eight page illustrated booklet entitled "The Story of Willie Bacteria, or HOW TO TAKE CARE OF YOUR SEPTIC TANK OR CESS-POOL" is now available to owners of Septic Tanks and Cesspools.

In a light vein, illustrated by cartoons, the booklet explains the workings of the septic tank and cesspool in simplified fashion. It describes the bacterial action of the disposal system and what is necessary for its proper functioning.

Chief attraction in the booklet is a humanized "Willie Bacteria", who is responsible for maintaining the efficiency of the disposal system. When the septic tank or cesspool user ignores the fact that "Willie" is working to keep the disposal system functioning properly, and saturates him with an overdose of detergents, acids, lyes, caustics and other irritants, "Willie" is very unhappy, and more often than not, just stops working. 



Shugart, an air transportation journeyman, is the son of Robert and Juanita Shugart of Rural Route 1, Wheeler, Texas.


