

# Seven Acres and Water Is Equal To 560 Acres

COLLEGE STATION - Fred Kveton has come up with a pasture-producing formula that turned seven acres of grazing land into 560 acres.

Here it is: seven acres, plus. mixed grasses, plus irrigation

equals 560 acres. Kvelton, who farms near Abernathy, Lubbock County, believes that following his formula is a good way to stay in the cattle business, in spite of dry years, reports D. W. Sherrill, Lubbock County agricultural agent.

Keveton began working on the plan last September when he planted seven acres of pasture grasses, in cooperation with the Soil Conservation Service, PMA, and the Texas A. and M. College Extension Service. The mixture he planted was made up of 10 pounds of brome grass, five pounds of crested wheat, five pounds of orchard grass and two pounds of alfalfa. He irrigated the seven acres every 15 days.

Since last April, reports County Agent Sherrill, 28 head of cattle have grazed the seven acres, with no feed on the side. Recently Kveton took the cows off and cut 3 tons of hay off the small field.

How does Kveton get the 560. acres? It's just that he believes it would take 560 acres of native dryland grass in his section of the country to support those 28 head of cattle.
