

Economy in meal planning means attention to small detailslike using leftovers, purchasing of seasonal foods, getting the most for your money whenever a food item is added to the market basket. Tomatoes and asparagus are foods that spring makes inexten-sive, yet they provide just the right color touch.

A saving in time is accomplished by using the oven for the entire menu. Yes, asparagus and tomatoes can be baked, and you'll find that color is retained when a moderately hot oven is used. Place the asparagus in a flat, shallow pan with just enough water to cover the bottom of the pan. Season to taste and bake uncovered until tender, turning the spears just once. The tomatoes are cut in half, brushed with melted butter or margarine and heated until they bubble.
