One of DrMendiola's greatest gifts was that of caring and listening to his patients. He knew their he noticed one of us reading histories well and that of their parents before them. He told me







His humor, graciousness, and medical acumen will be greatly missed. However, we all look forward to hearing of his adventures as he and Gina seek a new direction in their lives.
