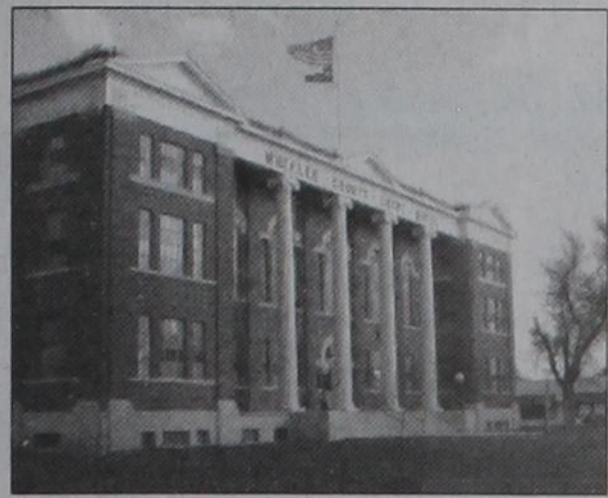

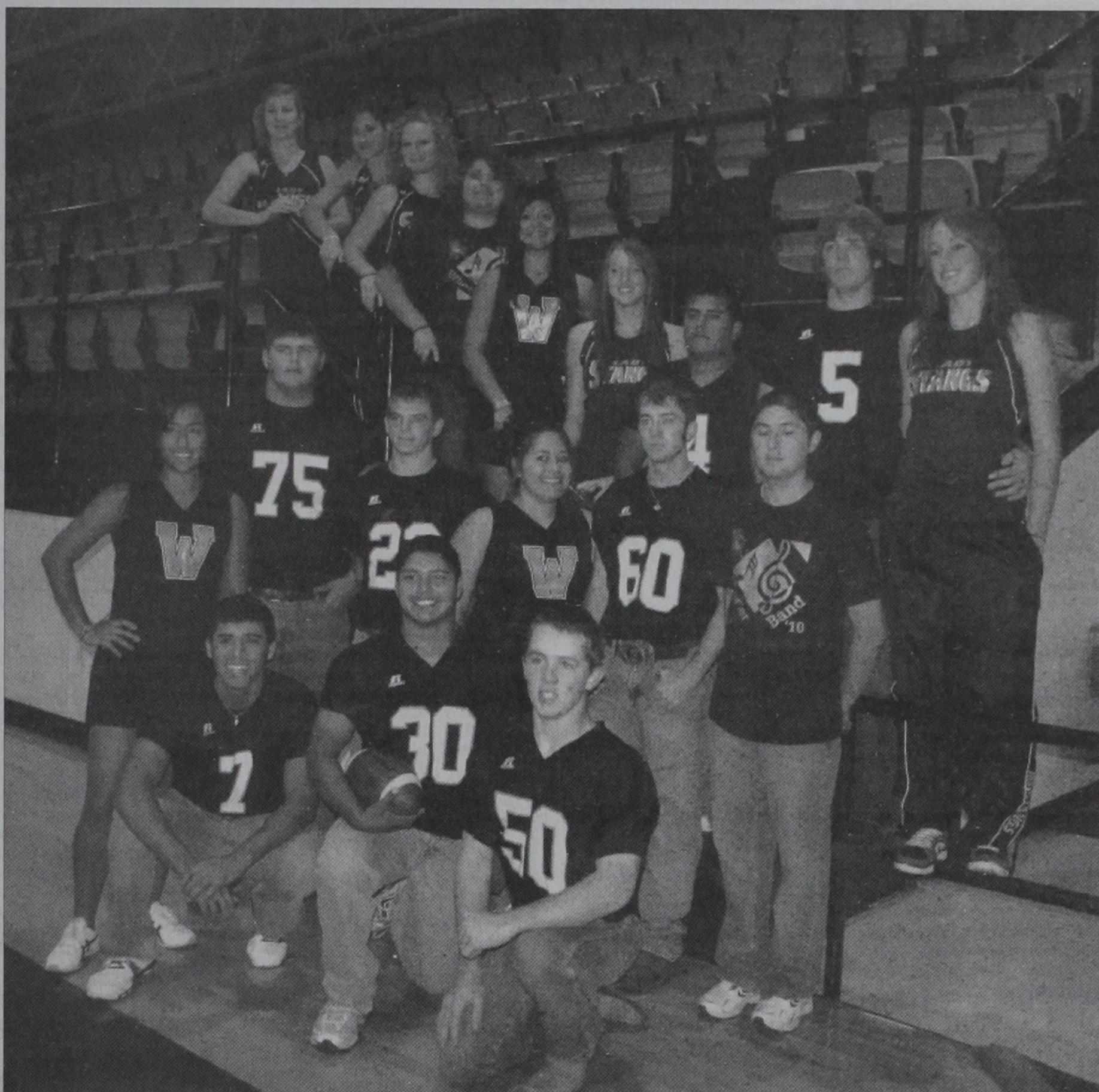

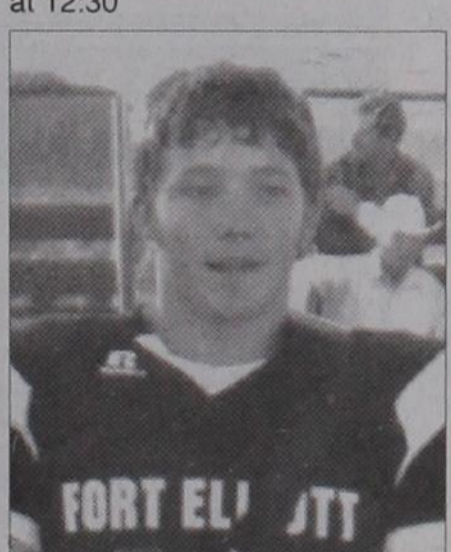
#### Taylor Sparks To Advance To State

### Strong Republican Vote In Nov. 2 General Election

Only 1,606 Wheeler County voters went to the polls for the November 2, 2010, general election—45.47% of the registered voters. Of those, 25% cast straight Republican tickets. Straight Republican tickets were cast by 426 voters. The total number of straight Democratic tickets cast

was 79. Two of the straight ballots cast were Libertarian and 2 were Green Party.

The election results put a Republican in as County Treasurer; a Democrat in as Commissioner, Pct. 2 and a Republican in as Justice of the Peace, Pct. 1.

Republican Mac Thornberry, U.S. Rep., ran unopposed and received 1,343 votes

Republican Rick Perry, carried the county with 1,172.

Republican Warren Chisum, State Rep. Dist. 88, was unopposed and received 1,345 votes.

Republican Steve Emmert, 31st Judicial Dist. Judge was unopposed and received 1,389 votes.

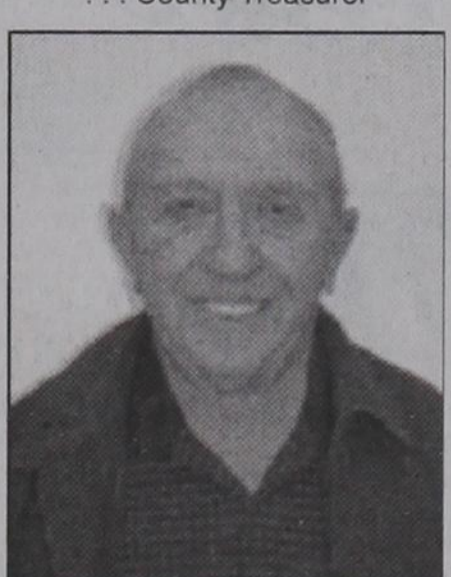
Democrat, Jerry Helley, County Judge, was unopposed and received 983 votes.

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### ROSE HAIR OIL, TRADING HAIRCUTS AND THE BARBERSHOP FLY

There was a time in my life, that if you were a teenage boy, you really needed to have your hair plastered down with some kind of hair oil. There were quite a number of different brands and types on the market. They ranged from the viscosity of sewing machine oil, to goo so thick it would tear the teeth out of your comb. My favorite was called, "Rose Hair Oil."

Rose Hair Oil, was one of the thinnest viscosity oils I could find. I didn't want any of that thick stuff that would make your hair stand up or stick out. No sir, I wanted that slick, suave look. I accomplished this by putting on a really liberal amount. I could tell when I had just about the right amount on, because it would run down my temples and tickle my ears as it trickled down behind them.

Of course, this was fine for school days or Saturday night. It wasn't good to have on, if you were plowing or grinding cow feed. The dust would stick to your head really bad. I forgot to mention, in addition to holding your hair down real well, it also smelled pretty good too, kind of a rosy

smell.

I didn't use that oil for very long, because I had to do a lot of plowing and grinding cow feed. Besides that, it didn't seem to impress the girls very much. I guess they were just too immature to appreciate the likes of me.

One weekend, Billy Caswell and I went over to Jimmy's house to spend the weekend. How we came about finding hair clippers remains unknown, but since we

did, we figured we might as well try out our luck giving each other a haircut. This was a venture that we all came to regret.

I don't remember who was first or second, but I was definitely last! Thinking back on that later, it occurred to me, being last was a bad idea. You couldn't retaliate. Anyway, the barber shop didn't open on Monday, so I waited till Tuesday, and tore to town, hoping to get Levi Reid to straighten up my hair. He asked me, "What in the world happened to you?" All he said when I told him that I'd traded haircuts with Jimmy and Billy, was "You should have known better." He fixed me up the best he could and turned me loose. It didn't take long for it to grow out, but we never felt the urge to do that

again.

Levi Reid and his son-in-law, W.L. Jolly, cut my hair all the time I was growing up. Sometimes, W.L. would do it, but most of the time Levi would be the one. I liked both of them really well.

I remember one time in particular, when I went in to get a haircut. It was in the fall, about September or October. I usually had a bad sinus or allergy problem this time of the year that resulted in my nose running, and I had to sniff every few seconds. Well, I hopped up in Levi's chair and he went to work on me. Every little bit, I'd sniffle, but Levi never complained. He'd been through that scenario many times before. All of a sudden, I went to kicking and floundering around in his chair. He said, "What's the matter with you?" I told him, "I sucked a fly up my nose!" Levi replied, "I've been doing this for thirty or forty years, but I've never had that happen before!"

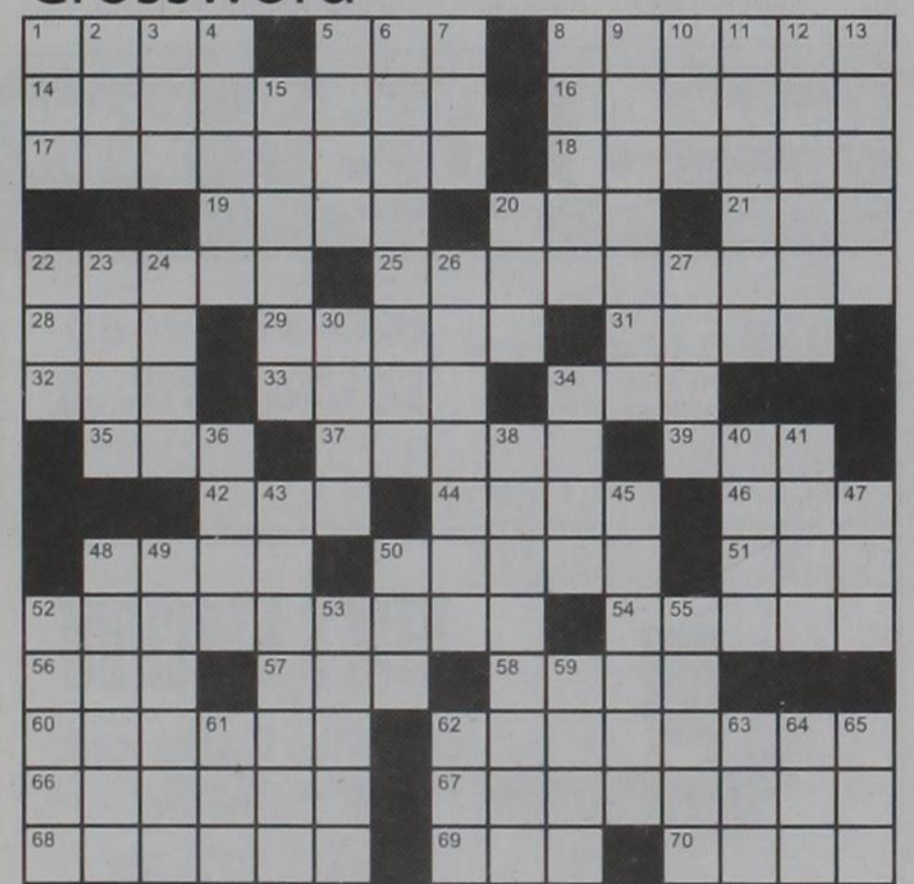

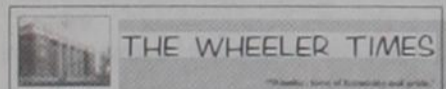

I began my career in Pediatric ICU in Lubbock, Texas, and then worked in Labor and Delivery in Santa Fe, and on to Alaska, and, finally, I came back here to Wheeler. I have been here now for 13 years and have worked side by side with Dr. Mendiola during times of calm and times of duress. I always felt secure when I looked up to see him coming in the door during a crisis. He made me a more confident and knowledgeable nurse.

One of Dr. Mendiola's greatest gifts was that of caring and listening to his patients. He knew their histories well and that of their parents before them. He told me

many times, "We will do the best we can and then it is up to God".

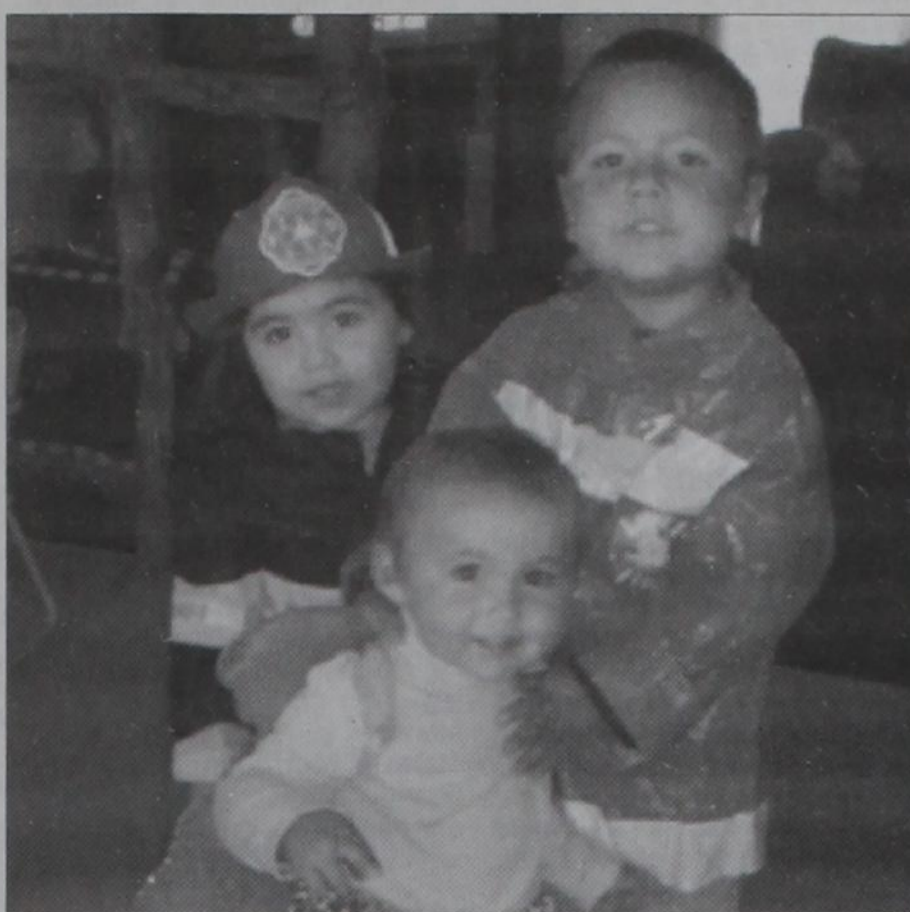
He is a religious man and was actually taught in school by the Jesuits. I asked him once if he ever had aspirations of becoming a priest and he said "Yes, but then I found I wanted a wife and family", and he was blessed with Gina, Vincent and Rocky. Everyone at the hospital teased him unmercifully about Gina taking care of every detail of his life. She is the anchor of his life and career and does her duties with absolute joy and respect.

My favorite times with Dr. Mendiola were Sunday mornings when he would make rounds before church. He was always relaxed and talkative, and we would have deep conversations about philosophy, religion and medicine -always medicine. It is his great passion. We would tell old war stories of what we had seen and try to out do each other with horrific details. Those of us who worked with him learned amazing things about his work in the villages in the Philippines before he came to the United States. Often, he would tell us of recent articles he had read and bring us copies of interesting reports. We would talk about our kids and grandkids, and he always had funny anecdotal stories about Rocky and Vincent. We loved his laugh. Once when he noticed one of us reading Shakespeare, he quoted Hamlet's soliloquy in Latin. We were awestruck! That memory is burned in my heart. He was always humming and singing obscure songs and melodies, and when I had to call him at home; I could hear beautiful classical piano and operatic arias, which sounded so otherworldly to a country girl like me.

His humor, graciousness, and medical acumen will be greatly missed. However, we all look forward to hearing of his adventures as he and Gina seek a new direction in their lives.

Our times with Dr. Mendiola will help us carry on and be the nurses and hospital that I know we can be. No doubt, I will hear his voice and his wisdom all along the edges of my heart. Dr. Mendiola taught each of us the ART as well as the science of medicine.
