FARMERS VOTE PEANUT QUOTAS **ON DECEMBER 9**

On Tuesday, December 9, peanut farmers will say "yes" or "no" to marketing quotas on their 1948, 1949, and 1950 crops.

In discussing the coming referendum, V. B. Hardcastle, Administrative Officer of the Wheeler County ACA, made it clear that all persons engaged in the production of more than one acre of peanuts in 1947 are eligible to vote. This includes tenants, sharecroppers, and owners who share in the proceeds of the 1947 crop", he said.

Mr. Hardcastle gave the following picture of what farmers may expect as a result of the referendum:

"If two-thirds of those voting approved quotas," he said, "all peanuts produced in 1948 on a farm that is not overplanted to peanuts will be eligible for a loan or other price support at 90 per cent of parity. Peanuts produced ing quota will be subject to a penalty

voting oppose quotas, the only support which could be available would be on peanuts sold for crushing for oil. This support level is about 45 per cent of the parity price for dible peanuts." The County ACP office will notify peanut farmers as to where polling places will be set up and will furnish other pertinent information about the referendum.

The past two years the Christmas Seal Sale has been handled by the Wheeler County Tuberculosis Association in the county rather than the state or national association as it had been in the past and in that way we are allowed to keep 80 per cent of the money collected right here at home to carry on the fight against tuberculosis right here among our own people.

We are now launching our third annual seals sale to finance this important work and we solicit your generous cooperation in helping to further this work. Tuberculosis is a much more serious disease than most people realize. While its death rate has been cut 75 per cent since the turn of the century, it still kills approximately 55,000 Americans a year, kills at the rate of one person every 10 minutes. Tuberculosis kills 2,000 children under 10 years of age every year.

Members of the Wheeler County Tuberculosis Association, who are your neighbors and friends, who are conducting this campaign are busy people just like all of you and we do not have the time to make a personal call on you. Won't you please make out a check now and mail it to the association? You'll feel better than if you put it off and forget it until the campaign is closed.

ed by the association to give every child in the Wheeler County Schools a skin test to tell whether or not they showed symptoms of tuberculosis and if they did show such symptoms, further tests were given and their parents were given suggestions on how to best handle their cases.

This year the Wheeler County Tuberculosis Association again plans to give all school children the skin test for T B and in addition to this the Association is planning to have a representative of the State Department of Health come to this county and X-Ray the chests of all children over 15 years of age without cost to their parents. We further ask that those of you who belong to churches, clubs and fraternal orders, make mention of Wheeler County's fight against Tuberculosis at your next meeting. Ministers and school teachers could sponsor collections in their churches and schools.

We need everybody's help. Please do not fail us.
