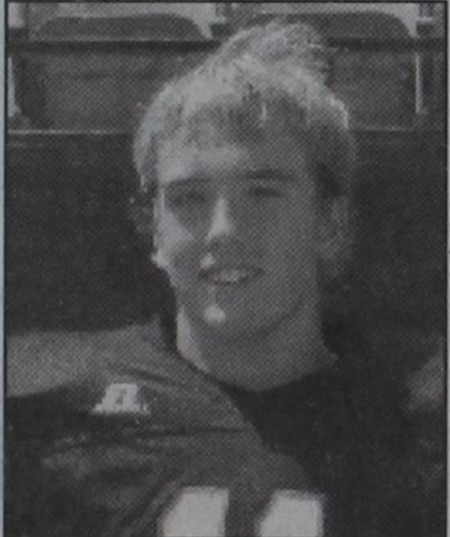

Dear Friends, I went to see Mr. Ben in the hospital! He doesn't look sick at all to me. I hope he is home very soon!

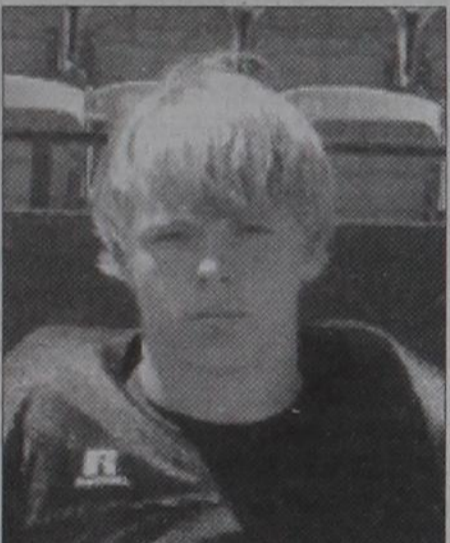

I have a plant at my home. My

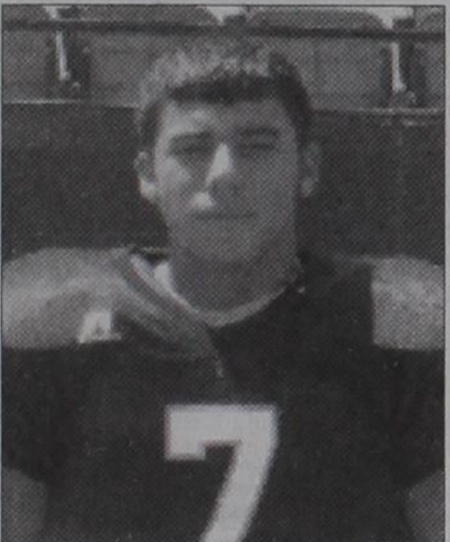

Armed Robbery In Wheeler Saturday Undisclosed Amount Of Money Taken In Speedi-Mart Robbery

On September 25, 2010, (Saturday Night) at approximately 10:00 P.M., the Speedi-Mart Convenience Store in Wheeler, Texas, was robbed at gun point.

The assailant was described as a black male, possibly in his late 20's to early 30's, however it's possible that he was older. He was described as being approximately 5'9" to 5'10" in height, and clean-shaven. It should be noted that the assailant wore a collared button up dress shirt that was white in color with a multi-color vertical pin stripping. The assailant wore a black cotton zip up hooded jacket. He also wore a plain, black in color, baseball style cap with large rimmed sunglasses, dark lenses with silver frames. The assailant was believed to have taken fairly good care of himself due to the description given as a “Fairly built man” but not oversized. It was also stated that the assailant wielded a black in color revolver pistol, possibly a .38 special.

Keith D. Miller Is Buried Here Mon.

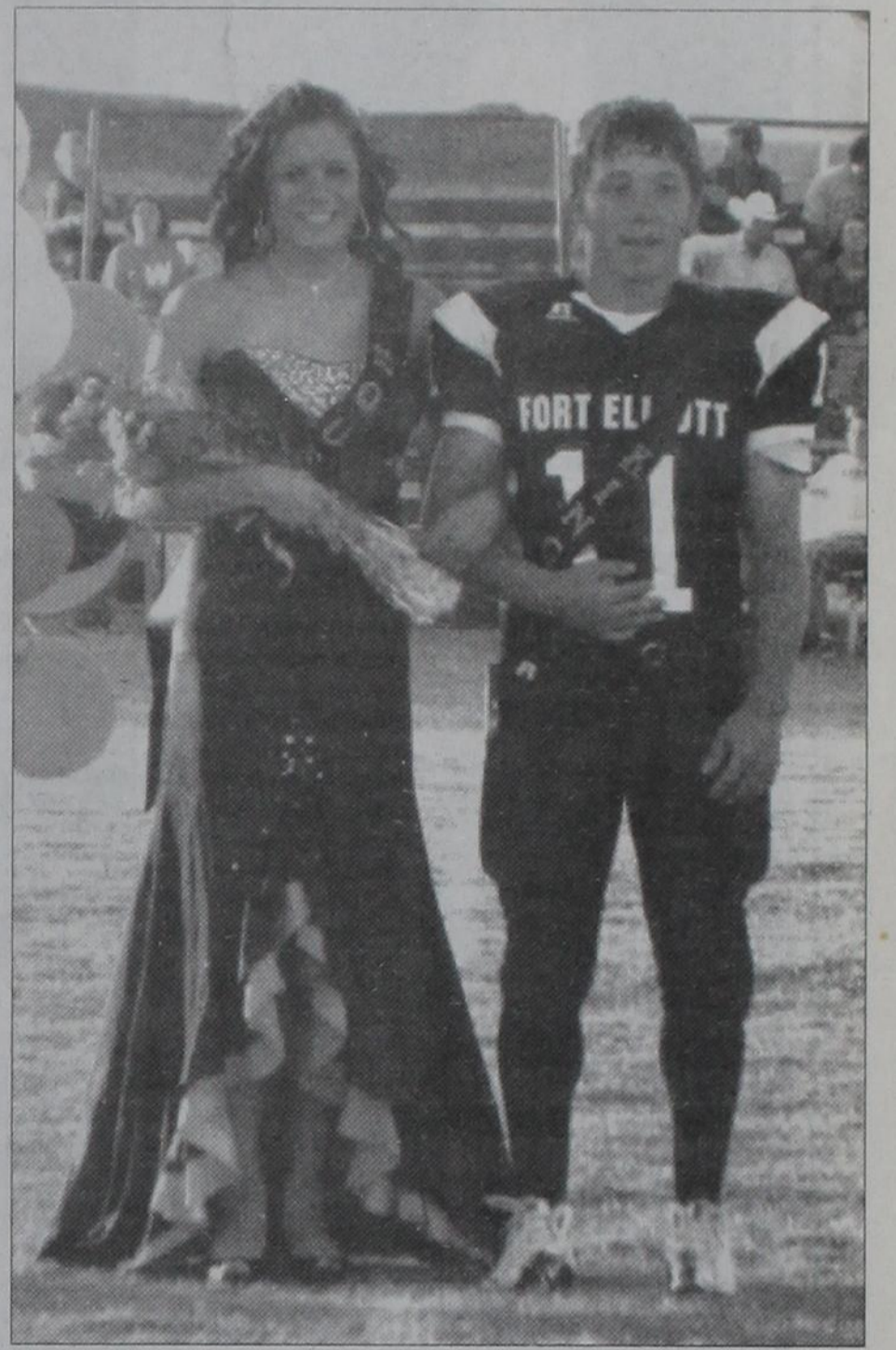
Keith D. Miller was born February 10, 1943 in Wheeler, Texas to Iona Esther (Ford) and Troy Zack Miller. He passed away September 23, 2010 at his home in Erick, Oklahoma at the age of 67 years, 7 months and 13 days.

As a child, Keith lived on the Britt Ranch in Wheeler, Texas until 1956 when they moved to Tulia, Texas. He was married at the age of 30 to Mary M. (Powers) Miller at Boise City, Oklahoma on November 23, 1973 and they made their home in Amarillo and soon moved to Wheeler. His first son, William, was born on September 5th, 1976; his second son was born October 7, 1977 and his third on July 12, 1984. Throughout his life, Keith held a wide range of jobs that took him many places across the country. “I have never been out of a job since age 7, being a farmer's son.” He was a farmhand, police officer, roughneck, general maintenance man, teacher and many other things throughout the years. He was even in the Army National Guard during the Vietnam War. Keith loved teaching and bringing out the potential in people, even when they didn't know it was there themselves. He was exceptionally good at making anything with his hands. Whether it was wood working, plumbing, automotive repair, gardening, cooking or even making you feel better with a pat on the back or a hug. Keith Miller was a giver and a provider first; he would make sure a total stranger was taken care of before tending to himself.

He was preceded in death by his parents and 2 brothers, Rondal Lee Miller and Deryl Ray Miller.

He is survived by his 3 sons, William Miller, Silverton, TX; Matthew Miller and wife, Missy, St. Mary's, GA; Travis Miller, Lubbock, TX; 3 grandchildren, Brendan, Aspen and Logan, and a host of other relatives and friends.

T.M. “Red” Caldwell, Jr., 89, died September 23, 2010, in Amarillo, Texas. A memorial service was held Monday, September 27, at Polk Street United Methodist

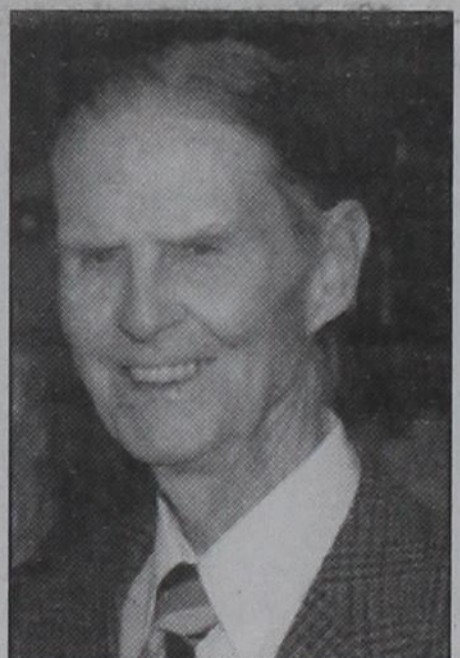
Church at 11:00 A.M. with Rev. Lane Boyd and Rev. Marty Hamrick officiating. A private family burial will be held at Llano Cemetery. The family received visitors at Schooler Funeral Home, 4100 Georgia, on Sunday, September 26, from 5:00 to 6:30 P.M. Arrangements were by Schooler Funeral Home.

Mr. Caldwell was born on May 1, 1921, in Amarillo, Texas, to parents, Turner M. and Mary Greathouse Caldwell. He was a graduate of Amarillo High School and attended Amarillo College.

T.M. Caldwell, Jr. joined the Navy in 1942. He graduated with his cadet wings from Corpus Christi Naval Air Station as Ensign in December 1942. After further training in the Grumman “Avenger” TBF torpedo bomber, he was deployed from San Diego to the Pacific Theatre in April of 1944. He flew numerous missions from Henderson Field on Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands. He then joined Torpedo Bomber Squadron VT-23 aboard the USS Princeton, an Independence class aircraft carrier. He flew multiple missions in the Gilbert and Marshall Islands campaigns, including the first strike on Truk. Red attained the rank of Lieutenant Senior Grade and was awarded the Air Medal with two gold stars and the Distinguished Flying Cross.

He returned stateside in April of 1944 and married the love of his life, Genevieve Britt, on May 4, 1944, on the Britt Ranch east of Wheeler, Texas. His final assignment was as instructor at Kingsville NAS where he was honorably discharged in 1945.

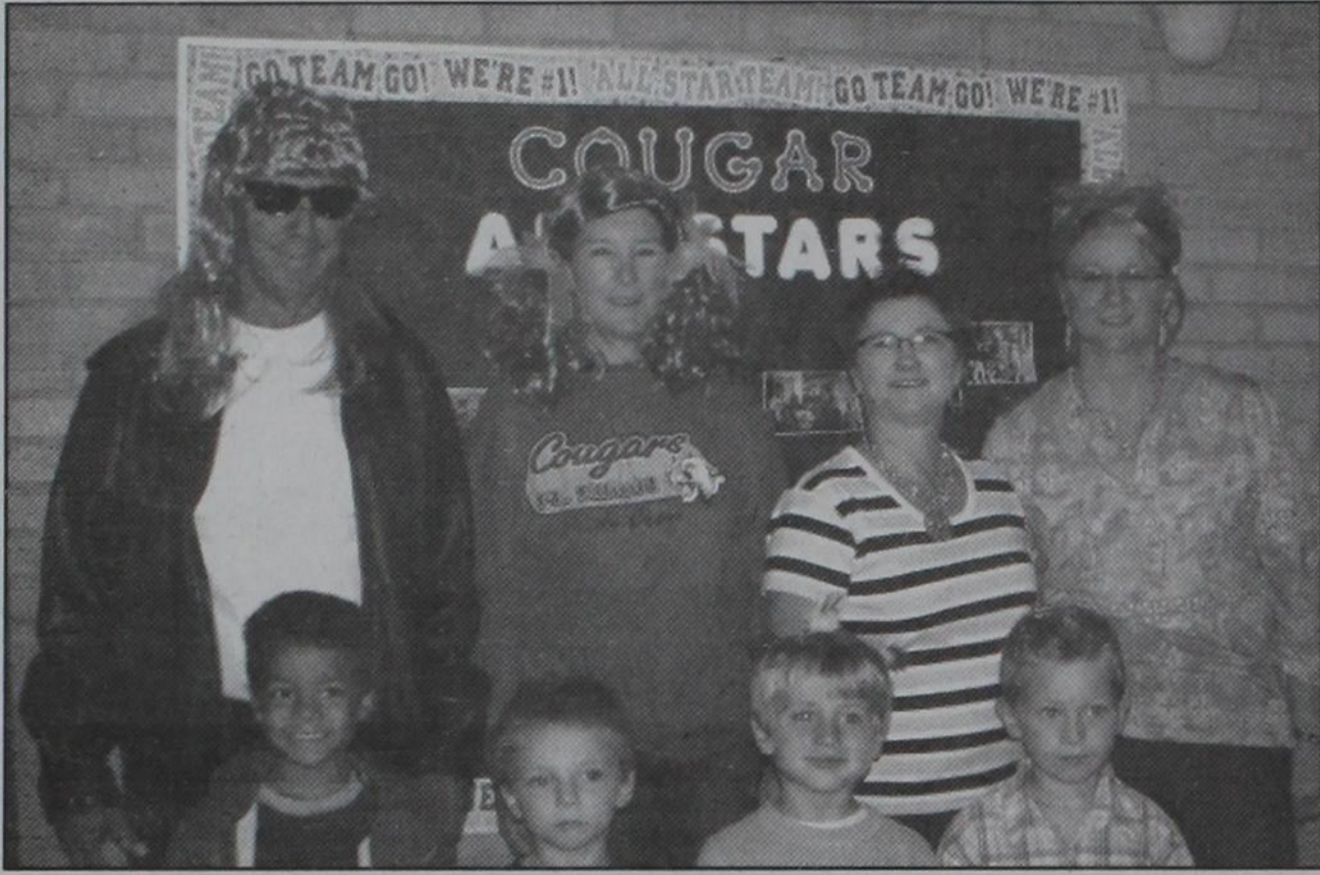

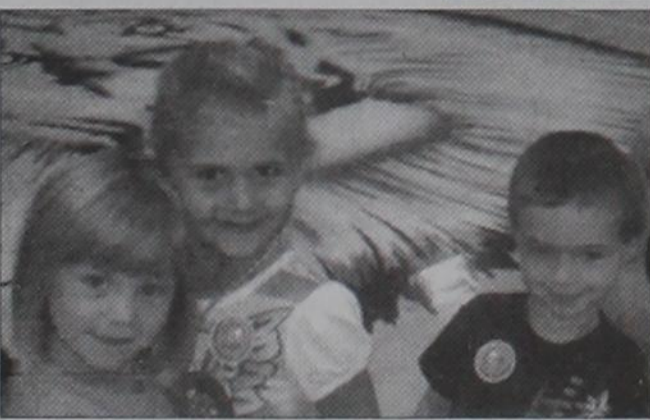

"ELLWOOD'S" "MONKEYS"

Some folks around Wheeler, probably remember Ellwood Shira. He had a mechanic shop in the building where the laundromat is now. I think he even had a Ford Tractor dealership, for a while. I know for sure, he was a really good mechanic, because I thrashed the engine in my car and he put all new bearings in it. All that work only cost me, one hundred and sixty five dollars. I'd hate to think what that same job would cost now.

Ellwood was married, but I never knew if they had children or not. It was always my opinion that he probably liked kids, because he bought two monkeys and built them a wire cage with a small shelter in one end. It could be, he simply liked monkeys, but I preferred to believe he liked kids, too.

The "monkey pen" was just north of his shop, so there were kids coming by pretty often and a

few adults as well. One time, my cousin Darrell and I got to go to town a little early on Saturday evening. We had stopped by the store and each one of us bought some chewing gum. After that, we sauntered on over to Ellwood's, to look at the monkeys. Darrell, had always liked animals and he decided... maybe the monkeys would like to have some gum, too. He took a stick out of the package and gave it to one of them. He started to take out another stick for the second monkey, but it got impatient and reached through the cage, grabbed Darrell's hair with both hands and started pulling and hollerin' like it was really mad!

We finally got the monkey's hands loose from Darrell's hair. Needless to say, it never got that stick of gum it wanted so badly. After that... we kind of lost inter-

est in the monkeys.

No Campaigns On State Highways

TxDOT Reminder: Campaign signs on state highway right of way illegal

During campaign season the landscape seems to bloom with a special kind of flower - the political sign. In some places campaign signs seem to be blooming like wildflowers even though wildflowers out of season. Campaign signs on public lands are illegal. Before you plant a sign, there are a few things you need to know:

- It is illegal to place any signs on or within the right of way. This includes posting signs on trees, telephone poles, traffic signs and other objects on the right of way.

- Campaign signs along Texas roads can be placed on private property with the owner's permission.

- Campaign signs may be posted as early as 90 days before an election (no earlier) and must be removed within 10 days after the election.

- Before placing a sign inside of incorporated city limits, check with the city for applicable ordinances.

Anyone running for office is reminded that it is illegal to put any sign on state highway right of way without authorization. TxDOT regulatory authority allows the immediate removal of a sign placed on state highway right of way without prior notice, if the sign

Unlike most kids, David (vocals, keys, guitar), Paul (vocals, guitars), Philip (vocals, bass), and Daniel (drums) say they're thankful they didn't waste countless hours in front of the tube. "We'd just come home from school and play music instead," Paul recalls. "Music was fun, and it definitely gave us a creative outlet. And now, it's given us a forum to ask life's biggest questions."

Before recently signing with Word Records, the Lincoln, Nebraska, natives' humble begin-

nings evolved into an enviable Midwest and West Coast following, and Remedy Drive was playing more than 200 shows a year. Driven by an innate desire to engage audiences with a dynamic rock show that combines the raw energy of scrappy indie rock with the colorful artistic panache of the Blue Man Group, the guys happily played wherever they were asked: summer festivals, colleges, camps, conferences and churches.

"We offer people a no-expense-spared rock show," Phillip elaborates. "Our goal is for our

audience to really enjoy themselves. Plus, they get the added benefit of hearing songs that rally against everything we're being fed in popular culture."

And now that Remedy Drive is signed, they're not about to become primadonnas any time soon. In fact, not much has changed for these down-to-earth

Midwesterners. While it could've been easy for them to assume they'd finally arrived, the brothers seem genuinely surprised to actually have a manager, let alone a publicist and booking agent. "For guys used to doing everything themselves, that's pretty incredible," Paul says. "And we still have our creative freedom, too."

Joining forces with the 2008 Dove Award winner for Producer of the Year, Ian Eskelin, Remedy Drive was stretched in ways it never expected artistically. With musical influences ranging from experimental rockers like Muse and The Bravery to the more straight-ahead rock sounds of U2 and Switchfoot, Remedy Drive's piano-driven rock shimmers with intense energy and eclecticism.

"Phil is always trying to push us in a more electro direction, which keeps us on our toes," David says. "When I think of what Paul brings to the table—imagine a guitar player that tries to imitate a symphony. And Phillip does things with bass lines that I've never heard anyone else do. Working together is so much fun because everyone contributes something unique."

Lyrical speaking, the guys find inspiration in the everyday and always have a pocket-sized notebook nearby to jot down new observations. "I want our listeners to be involved with everything we do in Remedy Drive, our music should reflect real life," Daniel says. David adds, "We're all getting sold this lie that the stuff we own can make you happy and validate who you are. We want to sing about something permanent, something real that'll never burn out or fade away. Ultimately, we want to give our listeners hope."

Remedy Drive's first radio single, "Daylight" likens the striking beauty of nature's most basic function to life's most challenging moments. "We wanted this jam track to be a home for a memorable lyric and melody," David says. "In Lord of the Rings, Gandalf said 'Look to the east at first light,' and that's the message we're offering here: even in the most desperate times—there's a glimmer of hope with each new day because there is something to put your hope in."

Later on in "Belong With You" the band distinguishes the difference between happiness and true joy. "We always let the music speak for itself," David shares. "We're not preachers or theologians; we play rock 'n' roll. But we felt like it was important to talk about issues we all deal with. And there's certainly got to be more to life than our own happiness."

One of the most refreshing qualities about Remedy Drive's work is its desire to provide food for thought without all the candy coating.

"If there's anything Remedy Drive can do, it's to shed light on the situation," Phillip says. "Remedy Drive is the highway we're all on as a band, and we want to steer people toward redemption. We've not arrived—we're all on a journey. And we don't have all the answers. But we're also not afraid to ask the questions, and we hope that our music will inspire every-

all kinds of canned goods and baked goods, as well as some fresh fruits and vegetables. TxDOT Tackling Game Day D. & D

Texas Leading the Way on Tackling Game Day Drinking and Driving
Campaign launching this football season to raise awareness about football game day drinking and driving

[Austin, Sept. 16 2010] — Football game days are among the heaviest days for alcohol consumption. (University of Texas Study, Alcohol Use and Collegiate Sports, November, 2007)

Starting this football season, TxDOT is taking the lead in tackling this issue by raising awareness of the dangers of game day drinking across the state amongst fans and their loved ones.

When alcohol's in the line-up, the odds are stacked against you. In 2008, nearly 12,000 people were killed in U.S. highway crashes involving alcohol, according to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) officials. In Texas, 30.9 percent of the total traffic fatalities were caused by drivers under the influence of alcohol in 2009, according to TxDOT. These figures increase over the weekend and on football game days. In fact, college home football games are associated with a 13 percent increase in arrests for drunk driving, according to a 2009 University of Colorado Study, College Football Games and Crime. In 2009, there were 27,237 DUI crashes in Texas and 1,547 (6 percent) occurred on football game days when a Texas team was playing.

Game day drinking and driving, whether at a professional or college game, is a very serious problem in Texas and across the nation. A recent New England Journal of Medicine study found that driving fatalities increased 41 percent after the Super Bowl telecast and in Texas, 45 percent of those who drink at a football watching party report driving home.

"The correlation between game days and increased crashes and fatalities on the road is too great to ignore," said Carol T. Rawson P.E., TxDOT Traffic Operations Director. "We hope that through this campaign we will not only raise awareness of the dangers associated with drinking and driving on game days but also encourage people to know when to pass their keys and get a safe ride home."

Texas is leading the charge among states by tackling this problem through a statewide awareness initiative aimed at reducing the incidences of game day drinking and driving. TxDOT wants to encourage fans to enjoy the big games, but to be responsible when it comes to game day drinking and know when to pass. Always designate a sober driver if you plan on drinking and if you are impaired, do not drive — call a taxi, use mass transit, contact the community safe ride program, or call a sober friend or family member to get you home safely or simply stay where you are.

TxDOT will house important information, including videos, on Facebook (www.facebook.com/KnowWhenToPass) and YouTube (www.youtube.com/TxDOTpio) and TxDOT officials will be Tweeting on the issue.

is not authorized by state law or approved by TxDOT. The penalty for violating this law is a fine of up to \$500 per sign.

The law does not just apply to campaign signs. It is illegal to put any sign, including garage sale and business signs on state highway right of way without authorization. "Sign" is defined as any outdoor sign, display, light device, figure, painting, drawing, message, plaque, or other thing that is designed and/or intended to advertise or inform.

TOPS Helps Figure Out Fiber

For years, any weight-loss aficionado could easily tell you the best sources of dietary fiber: whole grains, legumes, fruits, and vegetables. But in today's environment, things have changed. Grocery store shelves have become crowded with traditionally low-fiber foods that are now packed with fiber, like candy, ice cream, and artificial sweeteners. (According to TOPS Club, Inc. (Take Off Pounds Sensibly), the nonprofit weight-loss support organization, these "new fiber" foods may not yield the same health benefits as their traditional high-fiber food counterparts. ((Defining Fiber (Dietary fiber - also called roughage - is defined by the Institute of Medicine as the edible, nondigestible component of carbohydrate and lignin found naturally in plant food. Fiber is not digested or absorbed in

the small intestine, and it does not contribute calories; rather, bacteria in the stomach metabolize the fibrous parts of food. When you eat a food that contains a natural source of dietary fiber, you are

said to be eating **intact** fiber. (Added fiber consists of isolated, nondigestible carbohydrates that have beneficial physiological effects in humans. These fibers can be synthetically manufactured or derived from other plant or animal sources. An example of an added fiber is pectin extracted from cit-
