There is hope in sight for those home gardners whose tomato plants, year after year, suddenly stop growing, remain stunted, or die-just as they promised to yield a record crop.

caused by root-knot diesase. Rootby a nematode, a miscroscopic ellworm that lives in the soil. It bores into the root, causes the knots, and chokes the plant to death by cutting off its food supply. Root-knot disease is usually worse in home gardens, where tomatoes and other plants the nematodes like are planted year after year.

Now the Agricultural Experiment Station at Texas A. and M. College has announced that three research workers, H. C. Mohr, V. A. Greulach and A. A. Dunlap, are well along toward developing a variety of tomato that not only resists root-knot but bears fruit of good size.

It all started when the USDA from a South American species were not affected by root-knot. They didn't bear any fruit to speak fruit. Now, after four generations, went ahead and set a good crop.
