## Co. Commissioners Monthly Meeting

Wheeler County Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, January 10, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m. sixteen items on the agenda were considered and action taken.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The monthly reports for Justices of the Peace, Pcts. 1 & 2, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted as presented.

The court voted to pay the hourly payroll time sheets as presented.

The bills were paid as presented.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

There was no purchases of vehicles or equipment at a cost of over \$5,000 to be considered.

Kelly Springer with National Farm Live met with the commissioners to introduce himself and his company and asked to be considered the next time the court considers county employees life insurance.

Co. Sheriff Joel Finsterwald met with the court to have Michael Costly removed from the payroll as of January 4, 2011.

Finsterwald also asked the county to consider adding three more employees to his staff. He is in need of a jailer, dispatcher and deputy.

The commissioners agreed to renew the Law Enforcement Contract with the City of Wheeler. The annual cost to the city is \$52,852 per year or \$4,171.00 per month.

An Engagement Letter with Doshier, Pickens and Francis, LLC was signed to audit and closeout the offices of Justice of the Peace, Pct. 1, and the County Treasurer through December 31, 2010. Newly elected officials stepped into these offices, as of January 1. The cost is estimated at \$1,210.

The contract between Texas Health and Human Services and 31<sup>st</sup> District Attorney's Office was renewed.

The court voted to purchase a pickup for Precinct 2.

Hubert Moore, Commissioner Pct. 3, asked the court to approve the use of 10 days sick leave from the sick pool. He recently underwent back surgery and has used his allotted sick leave. The sick pool committee will complete the process.

Bobbie Hill and Ada Lou Lester met with the court to request the appointment of a Wheeler County Historical Committee and WCHC chairman; they presented a list of names of individuals willing to serve on that committee. Margaret Dorman and Ada Lou Lester were appointed as Committee Co-Chairmen. The court is to be brought up to date on the committee action at the February meeting of the commissioners.

Eagle Rock Field Services, L.P. was given permission to bore or

## Saturday At The "Hunter's"

As I was growing up, I don't remember ever having any job you would classify as prestigious. I suppose there's a good reason for that though. I didn't know how to do anything outside of farm stuff. Dad made sure that I was pretty well broke-in for working. About all I'd done up till around age sixteen, was run a tractor, hoe cotton, pull cotton, grind cow feed, stack hay, shock bundles, and fix fence. For the record, I sure did hate fixing fence! Finally, opportunity came knocking, for me to do something different. One of our neighbors, Mr. Hunter, asked me to come over and work for him the next Saturday. Not only that, he was going to pay me about seventy five cents an hour, plus, I also, got to eat dinner with them. Seemed like a mighty good deal to me. His oldest son, Larry, was going to be my working buddy. He was also, one of my class-mates and football team member.

The Hunter family, ran a dairy and milked about forty or fifty

cows. The cow pen had accumulated so much manure, that some of it needed to be gotten rid of. That's where Larry and I came in. Mr. Hunter gave each one of us a pitchfork, to load up the manure into a spreader he pulled behind the tractor. When we got it good and full, he would take it to his alfalfa meadow, slide it out and be back in no time flat. As best as I can remember, Larry and I loaded about twenty loads that day. I sure was glad when Mr. Hunter decided to call it "quits."

The work, however, wasn't done.... Larry had to help milk that evening. At least, his younger brothers were big enough to help with this chore. I stayed over until they got that finished. It was actually pretty interesting to see what all had to be done. They did it twice a day, every day. When we were all done, we each got a big drink or two of milk from that morning, which had been in the cooler all day. Boy, howdy! That was the best milk I ever drank in my life!




