It takes time to develop great art. And it takes time to develop children into mature and independent adults. Children have the longest period of dependence of any of God's creations. They are dependent upon their family from seventeen to twenty years. During this period of dependen-

cy, parents should carefully train their children, developing them into mature and independent adults. But some parents are too lenient in the training of their children. Others are too strict. And the results of either extreme are usually disastrous.

Perhaps the happy medium can best be illustrated by the mechanic who tightens the nuts and bolts on cars so tight that he strips the threads. Then, of course, the nuts and bolts turn freely, holding nothing in place.






