Mobeetie Names New School Superintendent





The unit is a skilled bed facility, providing a level of care for patients who are too sick for home care, but sick enough to be hospitalized, according to Medicare regulations. Jan Genung, RN, director of the unit, will be on hand to answer questions about the unit.
