### POLITICIANS SEE ONLY THE VOTES

Much less than two decades ago, industrial management had the reins in its announcement management had the reins in its hands. It could, and unquestionably sometimes did, underpay its hard-sweating workers. But if the workers struck, there was always more labor available. You could strike and starve and in many cases, with the strike broken, you could not always get your job back. That was wrong, of course, brutally wrong. That was not management but mismanagement. There was too much of it.

Today, the industrially organized workers has the whip hand, not only in steel and coal but in every other industry where industrial unionization has taken hold. He can and does paralyze an industry. He can force it to operate uneconomically. He can put it out of business. If he strikes, he can and does prevent other workers from taking his job, assuming that there are enough of them to take it anyway. That is wrong, brutally wrong. It is no more in the workers' interest than in that of management or public.

What happened to shift from one bad situation to another? The intervention of federal laws under the Wagner act. Grant that its intentions were good. Yet the fact remains that it produced as bad a situation Methodist Men. 2nd & 4th Thurs. in finality as the one with which it sought to deal. Its solution was to terminate too much power in the hands of management by putting too much power in the hands of labor. Of the two there can be little question that the cure proved worse than the ill, because the whole country suffers when a major strike occurs and the whole country must lose when a major strike wins an uneconomic settlement.

From the start the government should have been an impartial umpire, not a partisan player. But government runs afoul of the human frailty of preferring its job to justice. Men who can be thrown out of offce can seldom be depended upon to face down a majority, whether it is right or



The Veterans Administration's first calculations on amounts proposed to be paid nearly 16,000,-000 veterans in the \$2.8 billion Issued this 9 day of September, special National Service Life Insurance dividend have been received by the Veterans Administration Regional Office at Lubbock this week, Robert W. Sisson,

manager, announced today. Maximum possible amount that any veteran can receive will be \$528. Other payments, based on age groups will run to lesser sums. The dividend will be paid on both term and converted insurance She: "It's wonderful-marvelous! policies, and will be paid only for the period that the policy was in force prior to the policy annivermade for periods of lapse, VA em-

> According to Carl R. Gray, Jr., Administrator of Veterans Affairs, the estimated rate of the dividend was arrived at after long actuarial studies, and that the rate of payment will be the same for both term and converted policies, as the dividend is based on mortality savings since there are no excess interest earnings.

In arriving at the dividend scale. standard insurance practices were followed, whereby dividends on a life insurance policy represent a return to the insured of the excess of premiums paid over the amounts required to pay claims and set up necessary reserves. This is not necessarily propor-

tional to the premium paid. While portions of the premium originally estimated as necessary to pay claims may turn out to have been too high and can return a dividend, the part of the premium that goes into building up reserves cannot return a profit unless the fund earns a rate of interest higher than that assumed in the premium calculations. This has not been done in the case of National Service Life Insurance.

In computing the maximum payment of \$528, the dividend was based on a \$10,000 policy in force for 96 months, (the longest possible period), on a veteran age 40 or less at the time the policy was taken out. This represents a payment of 55 cents a month per \$1,000 of insurance. As the mortality rate for the age group of 40 and under did not vary greatly, a single dividend rate will apply

to this whole group. The rates of payment will be Those under 40 years of age at the rate of 55 cents per month per \$1,000 of insurance; those 41 to 45 years of age, scaling down from 52 cents to 40 cents; those 46 to 50, 37 cents down to 25 cents; those 51 to 54, 24 cents down to 21 cents; those 55 and over, 20 cents per thousand.

The proposed scale does not apply to insurance on a permanent plan which has been surrendered for a reduced paid-up amount. These cases will be handled separately.

No further information has been received as to the exact date payment of this dividend will be made, Mr. Sisson pointed out. Application blanks are available at Veterans Administration offices, and after being properly filled out, there is no need for further correspondence concerning the divi-dend as this will only cause delay in payment.
