

school children from one district to another must be in the County Superintendent's Office not later than August 1st. If childrens' grades are not taught in their home district, regardless of their grade, it is necessary for them to be properly transferred to be eligible for transportation and tuition.

It is the duty of the parent or guardian of such children to make application for their transfer to the school of their choice before August 1st.

If childrens' grades are taught in their home district and parents make application for transfor to another district, the school board of the home district may protest any or all such applications for transfers.

#### PUBLIC CAN'T BE BLAMED THIS TIME

letters to newspapers: "We aren't ready for war; the people are asleep; they are still isolationist.'

It is a false assumption. This time, the dear old public can't be blamed-if we aren't

ready. Before World War I, and before Pearl Harbor, it was true. We were spending only half a billion dollars a year. But since 1945 we have spent 10 to 12 billions a year on defense.

We have spent 30 billions on foreign aid. Altogether we have spent nearly 100 billions to combat Communism since it became evident late in 1945 that the Russians were not'a freedom-loving, peaceable people, as F. D. Roosevelt "had a hunch" they were.

You can blame the public this time. The Truman administration has received nearly every dime it asked for-from highways in the Belgian Congo to submarine detectors in the Pacific.

The public, instead of being blamed, should ask: "If we aren't ready, where on God's earth has the money gone?"

We weren't ready before Pearl Harbor because more money was spent on raking leaves than on battleships. It was a case of mistaken judgment, being asleep, playing politics and a country still in a depression and not able to stand too heavy a load of taxation.

Since 1945 the country has shelled out, denied preparedness planners very little and gone along. Even the Republicans.

It is no time to cry over spilt milk. It is time for unity. But it is unfair to shift the blame for unpreparedness, if we are unprepared, upon a democratic people who have shed their isolationism-and shed their cash -for what we were told we needed. The blame is somewhere else. It is not unpatriotic to charge that the blame is somewhere else. -From Fort Worth Star-Telegram

# TO THE VOTERS OF WHEELER COUNTY

I am asking my friends, if they see fit, to again support me in my race for sheriff of this county. My opponent is a good man and I have no criticism to offer against him in any way. I am making this race strictly on my own merits. I have never been one to seek the limelight and have gone about my duties as your sheriff in a calm way and in the best way I have known to do. During my term as sheriff there have of course been many misdemeanor cases. I desire to call your attention to liquor cases during my term as sheriff. As to this there have been 153 cases filed. Of these cases 18 cases have been dismissed by the court for various reason, five have been acquitted by a jury and one juvenile case was paroled. There have been 129 convictions. Forty of these cases were given jail terms and remainder of cases fines were assessed. The total fines assessed in these cases were \$9,398.85, and costs in these cases paid by the defendants amounted to \$2,760.22. These facts speak for themselves and may be verified from the court records; also have four liquor cases pending. It has always been my desire and effort to prevent crime if at all possible but the above figures will show that I have not been neglecting my duties in any respect. The total of other misdemeanor will far exceed the above. this statement being to liquor cases only. If re-elected it will be my effort to continue the prosecution of all laws.

Crime in the county is now at a very low ebb. There is seldom a felony and misdemeanors are fast becoming less frequent.



o water ornamental plants, especially during the hot, dry sumand health of the plants at summer's end, says Sadie Hatfield, extension specialist in homestead improvement of Texas A. & M. College.

A thorough soaking at intervals of a week or ten days is far better than a daily shallow watering, she says. Many plants are actually killed when only the top of the ground is wet. Water may run off yet penetrate only an inch or so deep in the tight soils. Miss Hatfield says it is a good idea to use a shovel or spading fork and see for yourself whether or not the water is going into the soil or just wetting the top.

To do a thorough job. Miss Hatfield says the water should be allowed to run very slowly over a long period of time. In areas of porous soils, the water should be applied at a faster rate because it penetrates rapidly and less will be required to do the job. This is not the case on tight soils. She recommends the spade tests as the best method for determining the speed at which water should be applied to any type soil, and adds that when water is applied too fast, the run-off can carry away plant food.

A mulch made from the leaves that were saved last fall will help conserve the moisture after it is applied. The leaves will gradually work into the soil and in turn will increase its water-holding capacity. She says that mulching GEORGE V.
