There are other issues at stake in the November elections, many of them local, and Democratic defeats or victories may and may not mean public repudiation of the administration's policies.

Because this split in foreign policy has come at a time when the country is facing the threat of all-out war, the conduct of members on both party sides is subject to censure. There is nothing the Kremlin likes better than division among its enemies, and it looks like the boys in Washington are going all-out to make Stalin and Company happy.-Amarillo Daily News.
